

Bluestar Communications, Inc., and Bluestar Networks, Inc., (collectively "Bluestar") hereby respectively submit this petition pursuant to section 214(a) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and section 63.71 of the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC or Commission) rules. Specifically, Bluestar seeks authority to discontinue providing domestic interstate telecommunications services to its customers as of August 1, 2001, in the following states: Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee. Bluestar is regulated by the FCC as a non-dominant carrier with respect to each domestic interstate telecommunications service for which it seeks authority to discontinue. Bluestar provides broadband data services using digital subscriber line (DSL) technology.

Effective June 25, 2001, Bluestar entered into an Assignment for the Benefit of Creditors. Covad Communications Company (Covad) has purchased the rights to Bluestar's customer base for the purpose of providing telecommunications services to those customers where feasible. It will not, however, be feasible for Covad to provide services to Bluestar's entire customer base. Bluestar is uncertain as to the future disposition of the remainder of its assets, including those customers that will not be served by Covad. Bluestar therefore seeks authority to discontinue service as to its customers.

For those customers whose existing lines will be terminated (including customers to whom Covad will be offering services on new lines), Bluestar has sent, on or about June 25, 2001, letters notifying them of Bluestar's change in status. Specifically, Bluestar has informed those customers that Bluestar has sought authority from the Commission to discontinue service pursuant to section 63.71 of the Commission's rules, and that the customers should immediately seek a new service provider. The letters also include the specific notice provisions of section 63.71(a)(5)(i) concerning this application. Notice has also been provided to all Bluestar customers whose service will be provided by Covad informing them of the process involved with migration of service to Covad. Concurrent with the filing of this Application, Bluestar is submitting a copy of the Application to the public utility commissions and governors of the states listed above and to the Secretary of Defense as required by Section 63.71(a) of the Commission's Rules.
