RESPONSE OF CITY OF BARTOW TO TAMPA ELECTRIC COMPANY'S MOTION TO COMPEL RESPONSES TO INTERROGTORIES AND REQUEST FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS OR, IN THE ALTERNATIVE, REQUEST FOR IMPOSITION OF SANCTIONS

Petitioner, **City of Bartow** ("Bartow"), by and through its undersigned attorneys, responds to the Motion to Compel filed by Tampa Electric Company ("TECO") as follows:

TECO objects to what it perceives as the failure of Bartow to provide complete answers to its interrogatories. Bartow disagrees and responds.

In paragraph 11 of its motion, TECO objects to Bartow's response to interrogatory no. 8. Bartow has responded to interrogatory no. 8. Bartow indicated that there are no current records that identified several informal meetings or discussions where electric utility service to Old Florida Plantation ("OFP") was discussed. Therefore, Bartow is unable to identify any specific dates or times or locations of any such individual meetings. If Bartow is unable to identify any specific date, time or location of any specified meeting, it obviously cannot supply that information to TECO. While TECO may not like the response, it is a complete response to the interrogatory.

TECO objects to Bartow's response to interrogatory 10(d). Bartow does not own or operate transmission lines as is stated in its answer to interrogatory no. 11. It is therefore unable

This is not a failure to answer the interrogatory but is just an acknowledgment that information is no currently known to Bartow. When Bartow obtains that information, if will be provided to TECO.

TECO objects to Bartow's response to interrogatory no. 17. TECO's assertion that when Bartow referred it to the answers to the other interrogatories that it was not a complete answer is simply not correct. In interrogatory no. 6, TECO requested the identity of each person representing the owners and developers of the OFP property and whether Bartow had any contract relating in part or directly or indirectly to providing electric service to the OFP property. Three names were provided. This same information is requested in interrogatory no. 17.

TECO objects to Bartow's response to interrogatory no. 18, which requests Bartow to specify all rates, terms, and conditions pursuant to which it proposes to provide electrical services to the residents of the OFP property. Bartow's response is that it is currently compiling this information and it will be provided shortly. That is not a failure to respond to the interrogatory but merely an acknowledgment that those issues have not been decided and the information is not currently available. Obviously, if information is in the process of being developed, it does not exist in a form that can be provided to TECO.

In response to the interrogatories, TECO provided comprehensive information regarding its distribution lines, substations, and all other requested, pertinent information. It did not fail to respond to any of the interrogatories that were propounded. Also, attached is a copy of Bartow's response to TECO's First Request for Production of Documents, which indicates that Bartow is willing to produce documents to TECO at a time convenient to both parties.
