NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER CANCELING ALTERNATIVE LOCAL EXCHANGE CERTIFICATES INVOLUNTARILY

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

DOCUMENT NUMBER-DATE

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The Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services advised our staff that the entities listed below had not paid the Regulatory Assessment Fees (RAFs) required by Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-4.0161, Florida Administrative Code, for the years specified below. Also, accrued statutory penalties and interest charges for late RAFs payments for the years specified below had not been paid. The entities listed below were scheduled to remit their respective RAFs by January 30, 2002.

Pursuant to Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, certificate holders must pay a minimum annual RAFs of \$50 if the certificate was active during any portion of the calendar year. Pursuant to Rule 25-4.0161(2), Florida Administrative Code, the form and applicable fees are due to the Florida Public Service Commission by January 30 of the subsequent year. Pursuant to Section 350.113(4), Florida Statutes, the RAFs forms, for the period of January 1 through December 31, are mailed to entities at least 45 days prior to the date that payment of the fee is due. All entities that apply for certification receive a copy of our rules governing Alternative Local Exchange (ALEC) service.

We received letters from each of the companies requesting cancellation of their respective certificates. On December 24, 2001, the Commission received a letter from Kexa Corp d/b/a Capital Exploration requesting cancellation of their certificate. The company was informed that a voluntary cancellation cannot be granted with an outstanding balance for the 2001 RAF.

On March 29, 2002, we received a letter from Exario Telecom, Inc. requesting cancellation of their certificate. The company was informed that it must either pay the 2002 RAFs or provide a date certain it would be paid. The company advised us that they do not have funds to pay the 2002 RAF and requested that we cancel the certificate on our own motion.

These entities have not complied with Rule 25-24.820(2), Florida Administrative Code, which states:

(2) If a certificated company desires to cancel its certificate, it shall request cancellation from the Commission in writing and shall provide the following

with its request. Cancellation of a certificate shall be ordered subject to the holder providing the required information.

- (a) A statement of intent and date certain to pay regulatory assessment fee.
- (b) A statement of why the certificate is proposed to be cancelled.
- (c) A statement as to how customer deposits and final bills will be handled.
- (d) Proof of individual customer notice regarding discontinuance of service.

Accordingly, since each of the entities' respective certificates remains active until each entity requests a voluntary cancellation pursuant to Rule 25-24.820(2), Florida Administrative Code, or we involuntarily cancel the certificate, the entities are responsible for the RAFs. As of the date of the vote, the entities continue to be in violation of our rules for nonpayment of RAFs for the year 2001.

For the reasons described above, pursuant to Rule 25-24.820(1)(b) and (c), Florida Administrative Code, we deny each of the entities' request for voluntary cancellation of ALEC certificates for failure to comply with the provisions of Rule 25-24.820(2), Florida Administrative Code. However, we find it appropriate to involuntarily cancel the certificates listed below, effective on the dates shown, for failure to pay RAFs pursuant to Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-4.0161, Florida Administrative Code.

Since these entities are no longer in business, there would be no purpose in requiring them to pay a fine. By involuntarily canceling each of the entities' certificate, however, we would be able to track these entities should any apply for another certificate with us in the future. The cancellation of the certificates and the closing of the dockets in no way diminishes any of the entities' obligation to pay applicable delinquent RAFs, statutory penalties, and interest charges. The collection of the past due fees shall be referred to the Office of the Comptroller for further collection efforts. We are vested with jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Sections 364.336 and 364.285, Florida Statutes.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the requests for voluntary cancellation of Alternative Local Exchange certificates listed herein are hereby denied. It is further

ORDERED that pursuant to Rule 25-24.820(1)(b) and (c), Florida Administrative Code, the Alternative Local Exchange certificates listed herein are hereby canceled, effective on the dates shown above, for failure to comply with Rule 25-24.820(2), Florida Administrative Code; Section 364.336, Florida Statutes; and Rule 25-4.0161, Florida Administrative Code. It is further

ORDERED that the cancellation of the certificate in no way diminishes any of the entities' obligation to pay applicable delinquent Regulatory Assessment Fees, and accrued statutory penalties and interest charges. The collection of the past due fees shall be referred to the Office of the Comptroller for further collection efforts. It is further

ORDERED that any protest to the action proposed herein shall specify the entity or entities to which it applies. It is further

ORDERED that, if a protest is filed as to the involuntary cancellation of the certificate of any particular entity or entities, that protest shall not prevent the action proposed herein from becoming final with regard to the remaining entities listed in this Order. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, these dockets shall be closed.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.

Any objection or protest filed in this/these docket(s) before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.
