ISSUE 2: Should this docket be closed?

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: No. This docket should remain open to allow FPUC time to revise its tariff to reflect a revised territory description of its service area or to file a transfer application pursuant to Rule 25-30.037(4), Florida Administrative Code. If FPUC files the revised tariff sheets, upon verification that the tariff sheets comply with Rule 25-30.035(9), Florida Administrative Code, an administrative order should be issued reflecting the revised territory description and closing the docket. If FPUC instead consummates the sale of its water division to the City, this docket should be closed administratively once the transfer application is filed and a new docket should be opened to process the transfer application.
