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On June 7, 2004, Commissioner Davidson received a letter via e-mail from Mr. Wayne Forehand, an Aloha Utilities customer, pertaining to the above noted docket. Mr. Forehand's e-mail, along with Commissioner Davidson's response, is attached to this memorandum. On Commissioner Davidson's behalf, I ask that the attachment be placed in the docket file and disseminated to all parties in the docket.

Because the note from Mr. Forehand was from "an individual residential ratepayer," not appearing to represent anyone but himself,¹ the Commissioner's viewing of the e-mail is permissible under the provisions of section 350.042, Florida Statutes. While Mr. Forehand is the Chairman of the Citizens' Advisory Committee, his note to Commissioner Davidson gave no indication that it was on the committee's behalf. Furthermore, Mr. Forehand, despite his capacity as Chairman of the aforementioned committee, has the same opportunity to express his views to the Commission as any other residential customer of Aloha.

In replying to Mr. Forehand's note, Commissioner Davidson hit "Reply to All," not realizing that his fellow Commissioners on the docket were copied on the original note and would thus be copied on Commissioner Davidson's response. As the Commissioner had routinely added my name to the "cc" list on his response to Mr. Forehand, I discovered that his response had been inadvertently shared with other Commissioners. Therefore, I ask that the original message from Mr. Forehand and Commissioner Davidson's response (attached) be placed in the docket file for Docket — No. 020896-WS and disseminated to all parties in the docket. In accordance with Section 350.042, Florida Statutes, this will allow any party who desires to respond the opportunity to do so.

Re: PSC Docket 020896-WS

Two weeks ago we discussed that there is a national trend in which small utilities are being absorbed or taken over by larger utilities because of the "economies of scale."

You explained that Aloha Utilities services 10,000 homes and is not considered a "small utility." I have questioned why Aloha Utilities could not then install a system to <u>remove</u> hydrogen sulfide similar to that used both by Pasco County and Pinellas County Utilities at a reasonable cost to its customers.

After some deliberation, I understand and want to share the following facts; Aloha is a utility company internally made up of a series of smaller operations and is not a centralized water utility servicing 10,000 homes. To explain: at well #8 Aloha operates a small stand-alone water processing plant independent of the other water processing systems; at well #9, Aloha has still another small stand-alone processing plant. At numerous other wells throughout the Aloha area, they operate more small water processing plants. In other words, Aloha Utilities does not have a centralized processing plant providing water to 10,000 homes, but has many small water processing plants scattered around its area. It becomes obvious that this is not efficient and there is not an "economy of scale" in the Aloha Utilities operation. With the absence of a central water processing plant, Aloha Utilities does not have the capability to provide the same high quality of water as the large utilities in the area at a reasonable price to the customers.

Aloha is now planning a large investment in the construction of many small hydrogen peroxide oxidation plants at the various sites around their area. Aloha will then operate these decentralized small plants with a new unproved process, which we understand has recently been rejected, after 15 months of study by a large Hillsborough County utility. This new process is not used by any other drinking water utility in this country. Even Dr. Levine reports that with the new hydrogen peroxide process, "Elemental sulfur or sulfate can revert to hydrogen sulfide in the distribution system." Neither Dr. Levine nor David Porter will guarantee that the black water and "rotten egg" smell will be reduced in our domestic plumbing. Dr. Levine has further told us if this process does not work to improve the problem, more fixes can be added. This should clearly indicate that even she is unsure of success. Do we the petitioners have to live with this black water for another 10 years while Aloha spends large sums of money on their experiment for which they will probably be allowed to pass the cost on to the customers without fixing the problems?

As a petitioner for deletion of territory from Aloha Utilities, in the public interest, I again urge that the PSC provide for deletion of territory from Aloha Utilities because we know that Pasco County Utilities is ready, willing and able to provide good water to the petitioners.
