# PROGRESS ENERGY FLORIDA'S SECOND MOTION FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER

Progress Energy Florida, Inc. ("Progress Energy" or the "Company"), pursuant to Section 366.093, F.S., and Commission Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), F.A.C., hereby moves the Florida Public Service Commission (the "Commission" or "FPSC"), acting through its designated Prehearing Officer, for a temporary protective order to safeguard and protect from public disclosure certain confidential documents that have been requested by the Office of Public Counsel ("OPC"). In support, Progress Energy states:

1. OPC has requested that it be allowed the opportunity to informally review unredacted copies of the confidential FPSC Form 423 Fuel Reports submitted by Company in this docket to date. Progress Energy has requested and the Commission has granted confidential classification of portions of such documents pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code. <u>See</u> Order No. PSC-05-0883-CFO-EI, Order No. 05-0880-CFO-EI, Order No. PSC-05-0876-CFO-EI, Order No. PSC-05-0632-CFO-EI, Order No. PSC-05-0446-CFO-EI, and Order No. PSC-05-0418-CFO-EI. Progress Energy is willing to provide the requested documents to OPC, so long as the confidential information is protected from the harm that would result from public disclosure.

2. Subsection (6)(c) of the Commission's confidentiality rule, 25-22.006, states:

08635 SEP 12 8 FPSC-COMMISSION CLERK When a utility or other person agrees to allow Public Counsel to inspect or take possession of utility information for the purpose of determining what information is to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, the utility may request a temporary protective order exempting the information from section 119.07(1), F.S. If the information is to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, then the utility must file a specific request for a protective order under paragraph (a) above. If the information is not to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, then Public Counsel shall return the information to the utility in accordance with the record retention requirements of the Department of State.

The temporary protective order provided for by subsection (6)(c) is ideally suited to the circumstances presented by this motion and will afford the protection needed by the Company in order to honor the request of OPC to review the documents in question.

3. The undersigned has been authorized by counsel for OPC to represent that OPC does not object to the granting of a temporary protective order, but reserves the right to challenge the confidentiality of the documents upon review.

WHEREFORE, Progress Energy respectfully requests entry of a temporary protective order protecting against public disclosure the confidential information contained the FPSC Form,423 Fuel Reports to be provided pursuant to OPC.
