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PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: We will begin with Item 3.

MR. MOSES: Rick Moses with Commission staff.

Item 3 is FTRI's request for the budget for the Relay system for the upcoming fiscal year. Also in there is the issue that is addressing a speech generating device which is similar to an electrolarynx device. And the Commission staff is here to answer any questions you may have.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you, Mr. Moses.

MR. HORTON: Madam Chairman, Doc Horton on behalf of Florida Telecommunications Relay. And also with me is Mr. James Forstall, who is the Executive Director. We concur with the staff recommendation.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you.

Commissioners, are there questions for staff or for Mr. Horton? Commissioner Deason.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: I have a question for staff. I understand the recommendation is to maintain the current surcharge at 15 cents, and part of that motivation is in anticipation of the potential for some additional requirements that may be imposed by the FCC. Could you expand upon that, please?

MR. MOSES: Certainly.

Tom Chandler of the FCC was present at a meeting that I attended that is part of the Sprint Relay System last year.

At that meeting, he indicated that it really wasn't a question of if they were going to mandate Video Relay and also the Internet Relay to the states, it was just a matter of when it would be and how they would allocate the percentage factor. That he wasn't sure at that time.

So far they have not done so. The Commission here has filed comments in regard to those services urging them to continue to fund it from the interstate fund, but it appears that they are going to mandate at some point in time that the states pick up part of that service.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Madam Chairman, may I continue?
CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Commissioner Deason, please.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: When you say part of that service, I know that we don't know for sure, but you anticipate that the intrastate share would be something in the order of 80 to 90 percent, is that true?

MR. MOSES: Yes, sir, and that's using the figures that we use on a regular Relay service, how it has been allocated. We are assuming they will use the same type of allocation, but it is purely a guess on our part at this time.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: And the cost associated with the Video Relay and the IP Relay are such that the budget could conceivably exceed \$30 million after those services are deployed and Florida's share would be somewhere in the neighborhood of 80 to 90 percent of those costs?

MR. MOSES: That's correct.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: And you have indicated that if the budget has to go to that level, that the current 25-cent surcharge cap may be in jeopardy, is that true?

MR. MOSES: Yes, sir, because it currently only applies to wireline access lines, which are declining.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: It would necessitate a statutory change if we were to adequately fund the Video Relay and the IP Relay?

MR. MOSES: Yes, sir. In order to apply that surcharge to anything other than wirelines, it would take a modification to Chapter 427 of the Florida Statutes.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: So currently the surcharge is limited to wireline and it would take a statutory change to impose it on other than wireline services?

MR. MOSES: That's correct.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: And it would take a statutory change to increase the cap above 25 cents?

MR. MOSES: Right. And also in that cap is it is limited to 25 lines per account. So if you have a business that has, say, 50 lines, you are only going to pay on the first 25, so that limits it also.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: Okay. I guess the -- I know that we've filed comments with the FCC, but this appears to be a situation where the federal government imposing costs on the

states, but there is not -- and those costs would have to be funded somewhere in the neighborhood of 80 to 90 percent by state funding. Have our attorneys looked at it? Is this something that they have the legal requirement, the ability to do is to impose costs without funding those?

MR. MOSES: Well, the Relay system is kind of unique in that it is certified by the FCC. In other words, we're operating a system under their guidance. There are certain standards, such as service standards and everything that they set the minimums. We can be more strict, but we have to go and set the minimums and we have to provide the services mandated by the FCC.

All of this is under the ADA Act. And they have -throughout the entire history of the Relay system, they have
mandated the services that would be provided. So I'll leave it
up to the attorneys to address the authority, but I believe
they can do it.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: It has never been questioned before?

MR. MOSES: No, sir.

COMMISSIONER DEASON: I have a question for Mr. Horton.

Mr. Horton, I'm looking at Attachment A to staff's recommendation, and this is a side-by-side comparison of the budget information.

MR. HORTON: Yes, sir. 1 COMMISSIONER DEASON: I'm looking at Line 44. 2 seems to be a fairly substantial increase over last year's 3 4 budget and the proposed budget. Is there some additional initiative that's being taken on that requires this, or what is 5 the situation surrounding this? 6 MR. HORTON: Could I ask Mr. Forstall to address 7 that? 8 MR. FORSTALL: The reason for the increase with the 9 budget for overtime, to allow us to work on some projects in 10 the office to rectify some errors with our database. 11 COMMISSIONER DEASON: So this is -- overtime is being 12 required to undertake this initiative? Is it a one-year thing, 13 or is this going to be a recurring additional overtime? 14 MR. FORSTALL: At this time it is just for one year. 15 COMMISSIONER DEASON: Thank you, Madam Chair. 16 all the questions that I have. 17 CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you. 18 Commissioners, further questions, comments? 19 Commissioner Arriaga, any questions? 20 COMMISSIONER ARRIAGA: Thank you, Madam Chair. No 21 questions at this time. 22 23 CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you. COMMISSIONER DEASON: Madam Chairman, I'm prepared to 24

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make a motion.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Commissioner Deason, you're recognized.

recommendation that the surcharge needs to be maintained at the current level in anticipation of additional requirements that appear are going to have to be funded by the state, and so I think it is a prudent move at this point to continue that surcharge level in anticipation of that. It also seems to me that we may, and I'm sure probably Doctor Bane has probably already initiated this, but at some point we need to start thinking about how we're going to communicate this to the legislature and work with them in terms of trying to anticipate additional funding requirements. I know that goes beyond this recommendation, but obviously it's something that we need to consider at this point, or at least be planning for the contingency in the future. So with that, I can move staff's recommendation.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: Second.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: And, Commissioner Deason, for clarification, your motion includes all three issues that are part of this?

COMMISSIONER DEASON: All three issues, that's correct.
