JOINT MOTION TO REQUEST EXTENSION OF PAGE LIMIT FOR POSTHEARING BRIEF

Sprint Spectrum Limited Partnership, Nextel South Corporation, Sprint Communications Company Limited Partnership (Collectively, "Sprint Nextel"), T-Mobile USA, Inc. ("T-Mobile"), and MetroPCS Florida, LLC ("MetroPCS") (hereinafter, "Joint CMRS Carriers"), pursuant to Rule 28-106.204(1), Florida Administrative Code, request the Commission to extend the page limit to 55 pages for the Joint CMRS Carriers' Posthearing Brief, due Friday, June 9, 2006, and as grounds therefore, state:

- 1. On December 6, 2005, the Commission issued Order No. Order No. PSC-05-1206-PCO-TP establishing the page limit for the posthearing brief at 40 pages.
- 2. The Joint CMRS Carriers are preparing for filing a Joint Posthearing Brief reflecting a single consolidated brief on all of the issues for these three parties. While each of the Joint CMRS Carriers could file a separate brief, totaling 120 pages in the aggregate, the Joint CMRS Carriers believe that a single brief on their behalf with a joint but single position on each issue will better

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serve their interests and afford the Commission with a better understanding of their position, while serving fewer total pages.

- 3. This page extension Motion, if granted, would only apply to the Joint CMRS Carriers.
- 4. Undersigned counsel has advised the other parties of this request. While we have not received a response from every party, as of the time of filing of those who did respond, no party objected to the granting of this request.

WHEREFORE, Sprint Nextel, T-Mobile, and MetroPCS respectfully request that the Commission extend the page limit of the Posthearing Briefs from 40 pages to 55 pages.
