I will be out of my home area at the time of the public hearing in Apalachicola and, consequently, I am submitting my comments herein concerning the caption matter. My comments are limited to the proposed rate increase and not to quality of service.

I find it unusual that a public utility is seeking funding from its existing customers to cover the cost of a new water transmission line. I have always held to the belief that public utilities made capital improvements with their own capital or from borrowed funds. Thereafter the public utility were granted rates for services that would provide a reasonable rate of return on invested capital or sufficient revenue to retire debt over a extended time period.

Current customers are not stockholders or partners in the water company and should not be burdened with the cost of capital improvements to obtain service in two to three years hence. Many of us will not be here when the new water transmission main goes into service and would be paying for goods or services not received. I will point out that all current customers have paid substantial amounts as high as \$2,300 for availability of service plus a monthly fee for service whether services are used or not.

CAF CMP COM I regret circumstance require the water company to install a new water transmission line CTR to the island. Perhaps they should have over the years paid into a reserve fund for such ECR purpose or eventuality. Under no circumstances should current customers be required to LEG OPC finance a new water transmission line. If the water company does not have the funds PAI required to maintain its business, I would suggest it seek additional investors or sell the **RGO** company to someone that does. SEC SER

The project also includes a new line from the existing well field and to the water plant on the island. It also includes the upgrade of the existing water plant consisting of a new aerator for hydrogen sulfide removal and a new high service pump to deliver the water to the customers.

Causing their Own Need: Plaintiff(s) claim for a statutory way of necessity must fail because, Plaintiffs are causing their own need for access by refusing to replace the water line on the new bridge and refusing to undertake any other improvements that may be necessary to provide water service to St. George Island over the new bridge.

COUNTERCLAIM

Count I: Specific Performance of Utility Permit

- 1. Water Management Services, Inc., (WMSI), maintains an eight-inch diameter water line (water line) on the Bryant Patton Bridge, in Franklin County, Florida.
- 2. The Bryant Patton Bridge is owned by the State of Florida and is maintained by the FDOT.
- 3. The water line is located on the Bryant Patton Bridge pursuant to a Utility Permit issued by the FDOT in the year 1974.
- 4. The Utility Permit is identified as Permit No. 4828 and is dated May 28, 1974. A copy of the Utility Permit is attached to the First Amended Complaint as Exhibit "B."
 - 5. Paragraph 5 of the Utility Permit states:
 - Whenever necessary for the construction, repair, improvement, maintenance, safe and efficient operation, alteration or relocation of all, or any portion of said highway as determined by the State Highway Engineer, any or all of said poles, wires, pipes, cables or other facilities and appurtenances authorized hereunder, shall be immediately removed from said highway, for reset or relocated thereon as required by the State Highway Engineer, and at the expense of the permittee unless reimbursement is authorized.
 - 6. In addition, Paragraph 4 of the Utility Permit states:

It is expressly stipulated that this permit is a license for permissive use only and that the placing of facilities upon public property pursuant to this permit shall not operate to create or vest any property right in said holder.

- 7. WMSI has breached the Utility Permit by: (a) asserting and seeking a judicial determination that it has a property interest in its location on the Bryant Patton Bridge contrary to the specific terms set forth in Paragraph 4 of the Utility Permit and without asserting an independent basis or theory which would support WMSI having such a property interest; (b) seeking compensation from FDOT for the cost of relocating its water line from the Bryant Patton Bridge to the new bridge contrary to the specific terms of Paragraph 5 of the Utility Permit; (c) attempting to expand the authorization granted WMSI under the Utility Permit into a statutory way of necessity contrary to the terms of Paragraph 4 of the Utility Permit; and (d) wrongfully interfering with FDOT's right to replace the Bryant Patton Bridge and demolish portions of said bridge.
- 8. FDOT has been damaged by: (a) having to retain experts and/or consultants to defeat the claims of WMSI as asserted in WMSI's First Amended Complaint; (b) administrative, equipment and overhead expenses required to defeat the claims of WMSI as asserted in WMSI's First Amended Complaint; and (c) the expenditure of legal costs and attorneys' fees required to defeat the claims of WMSI as asserted in WMSI's First Amended Complaint.

WHEREFORE, FDOT demands: (a) that the Court require WMSI to submit a detailed schedule (Schedule) showing how WMSI will insure the replacement of its existing water line on the Bryant Patton Bridge with a new water line without delaying either the design or construction of the new bridge and without delaying the demolition of the Bryant Patton Bridge; (b) that WMSI perform the relocation at its cost and at no cost to FDOT; (c) that the Court enjoin WMSI and all other plaintiffs from delaying the design and construction of the new bridge to St. George Island and the demolition of the existing bridge; and (d) that the Court retain jurisdiction to enforce WMSI's Schedule including requiring WMSI to pay all costs, expenses and attorney fees incurred by FDOT related to any failure of WMSI to comply with its Schedule and duty to

replace the water line at WMSI's sole expense.

Count II: Mandatory Injunction

- 9. Mandatory injunction is a proper remedy to assert against a utility company to secure the utility's performance of its duties to the public. *City of Gainesville v. Gainesville Gas* & *Electric Power Co.*, 62 So.2d 919, 921 (Fla. 1913).
- 10. A mandatory injunction can command acts to be done or undone, and may require the performance of some affirmative acts. *Zetrouer v. Zetrouer*, 103 So. 625, 626 (Fla. 1925). In addition, a mandatory injunction may compel performance of contractual obligations. *Kellerman v. Chase & Co.*, 135 So. 127 (Fla. 1931).

The Florida Department of Transportation, (FDOT), will be improving the section of the Highway System described above. Utilities owned and/or maintained by Water Management Services, Inc., (WMSI), will require relocation because most of the existing bridge to St. George Island will be demolished. The FDOT is providing this information to WMSI in an effort to: better coordinate the proposed work; minimize

expenses related to the proposed work and utility relocation; and avoid construction delays and construction claims.

The work encompassed by this project consists of: Replacement of the existing bridge connecting St. George Island and the mainland with a new bridge and demolition of most of the existing bridge.

The construction contract for this project has been awarded to the Contractor, Boh Brothers Construction Company, and contract time for the project has commenced. Under the construction contract, the Contractor is responsible for designing the new bridge, constructing the new bridge and demolishing that part of the existing bridge which is to be removed. Demolition of the existing bridge is scheduled to commence immediately after traffic has been shifted onto the new bridge. Because the contractor is responsible for the design of the new bridge and because the contract time has commenced, the Contractor must timely receive the design and specifications of WMSI for the new water line that will replace the existing water line assuming WMSI intends to attach the new water line to the new bridge. It is the understanding of the FDOT that WMSI intends to attach the new water line to the new bridge. If this in not correct, please let me know, in writing, immediately.

It is the understanding of FDOT that WMSI was provided with a preliminary set of plans for the new bridge by Sverdrup Civil, Inc., by cover letter dated August 24, 1999. Sverdrup Civil, Inc., has been hired by Boh Brothers Construction Company to design the new bridge. The preliminary set of plans shows the proposed location of the new water line on the new bridge. Please refer to Bridge Drainage System - Pipe Hanger Layout (Sheets 1, 2 and 3) and Pipe Saddle Details. If WMSI has not received a copy of the preliminary plans, please contact me immediately and I will send you a copy.

If WMSI believes that its existing facilities are located on right-of-way owned by WMSI, if an easement has been acquired for the use of WMSI or if WMSI has other compensable interests within the right-of-way of the existing bridge, WMSI may be eligible to have its relocation costs reimbursed by the Department. If WMSI has any of the above interests, please send me the information immediately, together with documentation of WMSI's compensable interest. Please include in your transmittal, on agency / company letterhead, a statement as to whether or not WMSI will claim reimbursement and on what basis the claim is supported. It is important that WMSI include this information in its transmittal, as failure to do so may void WMSI's claim for reimbursement. If WMSI's claim does qualify for reimbursement, you will receive authorization from this office to proceed with your preliminary engineering. Until this authorization is received, any expense incurred by WMSI will not be eligible for reimbursement.

It is the understanding and current position of the FDOT, however, that WMSI has no

compensable easements or interests within the right-of-way of this project, and that pursuant to Florida law and the Utility Permit issued to WMSI by FDOT in the year 1974, WMSI is responsible for all costs related to the construction of the new water line. In addition, if WMSI wishes to reuse the materials that comprise the existing water line or obtain the salvage value of those materials, WMSI is responsible for removing, at the cost of WMSI, the existing water line from the existing bridge prior to the scheduled demolition of the existing bridge by the Contractor. If WMSI has not removed the existing water line from the existing bridge by the date of commencement of demolition of the existing bridge, the existing water line will be deemed abandoned and the water line will be destroyed by the Contractor, along with the portion of the existing bridge scheduled for demolition, or the materials comprising the existing water line will become the property of the Contractor.

With regard to the construction of the new water line and the removal of the existing water line from the existing bridge, as described above, WMSI may, at its sole choice and discretion, either hire the Contractor that will be constructing the new bridge or any other qualified contractor to construct the new water line and/or remove the existing water line. WMSI will need to enter into its own contract with the contractor of its choice to perform the work desired by WMSI. It is very important that construction of the new water line and any removal of the existing water line be coordinated with the Contractor constructing the new bridge. Any delay by WMSI in installing the new water line and any related improvements to the water system could delay the work of the Contractor and result in significant delay claims for which WMSI would be responsible. In addition, because the Contractor will start the demolition of the existing bridge immediately after traffic has been shifted onto the new bridge, any delay by WMSI in having its new water line in place and in operation will delay the Contractor's demolition of the existing bridge which would result in significant delay claims for which WMSI would be responsible.

On September 15, 1999, WMSI, through its engineer Les Thomas Consulting Engineers, requested approval to locate the new water line either on the outside of the bridge or on the bridge deck or in a trough on the outside of the bridge deck. These locations are not acceptable to FDOT and are herewith denied. However, the location proposed by the Contractor as shown on Bridge Drainage System - Pipe Hanger Layout (Sheets 1, 2 and 3) of the preliminary plans is acceptable to FDOT. Please note that prior to installing the new water line on the new bridge, WMSI will need to obtain a new Utility Permit from FDOT.

Because the Contractor is responsible for designing the new bridge, WMSI will be receiving correspondence from the Contractor's design consultant, Sverdrup Civil, Inc., with regard to information needed from WMSI to complete the design of the new bridge. WMSI is responsible for timely responding to such requests for information and failure to do so may result in construction delays and delay claims.



The intent of this letter is to be supportive of my verbal comments given to the Public Service Commission Staff at the Franklin County Courthouse, 4:00pm, as part of the scheduled "customer meeting" regarding the proposed rate increase by Water Management Services, Inc.

My comments are authorized by and representative of the St. George Plantation Owners' Association, Inc. Board of Directors. I, as General Manager of St. George Plantation am responsible for the overall management and operations of the 1200-acre private gated community located at the West End of St. George Island. Our owners total just under 900, with 353 homes existing and 38 new homes currently under construction. Our growth is rapid, with an expected additional 40 new homes to be built in 2001.

The seven(7) elected Board of Directors wishes to voice their opposition to this proposed excessive water rate hike. The rationale for this opposition is based on the following:

- The rates of St. George Island are far greater than that of our neighboring community of Eastpoint, just across the bridge from the Island.
- Water Management Services, Inc. was fully aware, just as the other utilities, that demolition would occur of the Bryant Patton Bridge and construction of a new replacement bridge would be completed by 2003. However, it appears, based upon the extent of the proposed rate increase, that financial

planning for adequate reserve funding for the replacement of the transmission line was not performed. In addition, Water Management, Inc. filed suit against the Florida DOT in an effort to be reimbursed for the construction cost of the new line, which underscores their inability to be prepared for this long known new bridge project. It has been reported that as part of a "settlement" with Florida DOT, that Water Management, Inc. will receive "salvage" funds from Florida DOT for the existing transmission line. If this report is true, where is that financial windfall indicated being applied towards a reduction of the proposed rate increase, or will those funds be turned into profits.

- It is reported that the existing transmission line will be replaced by a larger diameter pipeline, so needed to provide additional water supply and pressure to the increased demand of new homes and tourism on the Island. Was this growth of construction and tourism only known by all other utilities and real estate companies except Water Management Inc.? Obviously, the growth on St. George Island has been no secret and is being planned for within all budgets.
- Water Management Inc., being the exclusive water supplier for St. George Island, should have adequately financially planned in advance for the need to construct a new transmission service as part of the replacement bridge project. The bridge, built in 1965, had been rated for a life expectancy of 50 years, which would be 2015, fourteen years from today. However, well known and documented reports from Florida DOT indicated severe erosion resulting from wave action and the salt environment hastened the design's expectancy. Even if the bridge would have lasted until 2015, where is evidence that Water Management Inc. had and was preparing for the cost of the replacement transmission.
- Fire hydrants installed throughout the Plantation were installed as an element of the infrastructure of the Water Management Inc. transmission system. However, at a recent Franklin County Commissioners meeting, an official of Water Management Inc. indicated that the hydrants were not part of their responsibility. How can a utility selectively choose which part of their transmission system is their responsibility? If not the responsibility of Water Management Inc., then who is responsible? I do not care to wait for a fire to learn if fire-fighting water is at the ready.
- The existing transmission system needs to be reviewed and determined for its ability to service the customers of St. George Island. It is reported of the transmission pipeline exposed above ground in some locations of the island, differing diameter size transmission pipe within the Plantation(i.e. 9-inch then to a 6 inch, then back to a 9 inch). This issue, along with fire hydrant responsibility is being brought forth not as an argument for a need of a rate increase, but rather as evidence of inadequate financial reserve planning

and continual upkeep of the existing system over the years of operation. The rate payers of the Plantation should not be looked upon to come to the rescue of such poor utility financial planning and certainly not to maintain the profit margin during this need for catch up infrastructure construction.

In summary, the Plantation Board of Directors, representing our many owners and homeowners, protest this excessive last minute rate increase proposal. We understand the need for occasional increases as part of maintaining a reliable flow of product, however, this proposed increase far exceeds what is considered reasonable.

We would propose considering other alternatives or at least the explanation of why such alternatives do not exist.

Thank you for the opportunity to voice our comments and concerns.

Have received notice of Sept. 12th meeting regarding Water Management Services and the Florida Public Service Commission. Unfortunately, we are unable to be there in person, but ask that you submit the following to the panel for us.

We have been property owners on St. George Island since 1995 and currently live at 300 Ocean Mile, F-2. We have read articles in the Apalachicola Times regarding Mr. Brown's situation, however, several matters seem quite vague and it is hoped that more positive answers will follow.

- 1) We understand Mr. Brown states that the cost to redo the water line to the new bridge will cost 6 million dollars. We find this figure staggeringly high and would like to know what the other estimates are?
- 2) With the island population growing every year, where is the net income Mr.Brown should have in his account? He has made minimal improvements, therefore, he should have a pretty hefty amount saved for just this sort of improvement.
- 3) We understand that by law, he is allowed an 11% profit. Since he has never produced a balance sheet or financial statement, how do we know what he has profited?
- 4) If Mr. Brown is securing financing, who has he secured, and what are the conditions. Most loans of this size would be prorated over a period of 40 years. What are the terms of his loan?

None of us objects to paying a fair rate for water and I would trust that the Commission would look at the evidence submitted and compare our rates with other comparable towns in the area. The Commission has always taken consumers interests at heart and we request that you fully review all reports before granting an increase that could double what we are now paying.

We appreciate your time in conducting this meeting and regret we are unable to attend.



Customer service meetings will be held on September 12, 2000, at the Franklin County Courthouse in Apalachicola. In your letter, you ask whether the cost of the new construction is being amortized. The utility's request is for a rate increase sufficient to service the debt incurred to finance the construction during the construction period. Subsequently, the newly constructed assets would become part of the utility's rate base, on which it would earn a rate of return approved by the Commission. The allowable depreciation period for the bulk of the assets (transmission mains) is 40 to 45 years.

As a resident on St. George Island I want to register my concerns over the proposed rate increase for water service being requested by Water Management Services of Tallahassee. My reasons and arguments follow:

- 1. The rates that we currently pay for basic water service are far greater than rates for comparable service in our neighboring community of Eastpoint, FL.
- 2. The need for replacement of the current transmission line was recognized many years ago when approval for the new bridge was granted. In addition, due to rapid development on St. George, the existing transmission line was in need of replacement anyway simply because of its' limited diameter.
- 3. We are currently compelled to using only Water Management Services as a source of water, a true captive audience if you will, and a decision to grant a rate increase will only serve to strengthen the existing financial barrier for an alternative source of water.
- 4. Operating any business requires some risk and more important, to ensure success, skillful planning. If Water Management Services did not properly plan financially for the eventual replacement or upgrade of the existing transmission line, I do not feel that current customers should be subject to bearing the full expense of required capital improvements, especially since they will be fully owned by the company and listed as an asset on their balance sheet.
- 5. Finally, and equally important, is the issue surrounding fire protection. Recently, a Water Management Service official publicly stated they do not take responsibility for fire protection. (See enclosed article from the Apalachicola Times, Thursday, July 20,2000.) How can a public utility company be granted permission to supply part of a necessary commodity but not all that is

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WMS ordinance request denied

What happens when a private utility requests a local government to force its customers to restrict water usage?

Times Staff Report Palmer Hasty

The request for the Franklin County Commission to enforce Water Management Services' (WMS) proposed ordinance to restrict water usage on SGI was denied.

County Attorney Alfred Shuler told the county commission last week that the proposed ordinance, requested by WMS of St. George Island, was to restrict water usage because WMS felt the water system could exceed its capacity if the ordinance was not enacted.

The proposed ordinance would have restricted water use as follows:

Water provided by WMS can't be used for watering lawns or landscaping on SGI during the following times: 5 pm Friday until 5 am Monday during May,Junc,July, August, and September. Memorial Day, 4th of July, and Labor Day.

Water management services can shut off the water supply to any users who violate the ordinance during the times stated. A third violation of the ordinance will be punished as a misdemeanor with a fine not to exceed \$100 or a jail term not to exceed 10 days.

St. George Island resident Frank Latham spoke to the commission, andasked the board what steps WMS had taken to inform the general public?

Latham said, "I have a problem with the county getting involved in a private enterprise. And why are you (the county board) getting involved in their business? It does not make any sense. They should do something first. If you're going to create an ordinance, create it for the whole county, not just for SGI."

SGI resident Tommy Day asked Hank Garrett, the maintenance supervisor for WMS, what WMS's stand is regarding fire protection.

Garrett said that WMS does not take responsibility for fire protection although fire protection is made reference to in the ordinance.

Day addressed the board, "They have no responsibility whatsoever for

fire protection. This is a ploy, I guess. Eight years ago we had 25 pounds of water pressure, before Hank was here, and no matter where the fire was the water pressure wouldn't reach the second story building. We had zero fire protection. I don't know why all of a sudden we do this."

Day continued, asking Garrett for an explanation of how he concluded

that there would be a water shortage during the near future and throughout a period of years.

Day said, "I think we need to look into this. Would you explain that to us Hank?"

Garrett said, "It's been dry for a period of years." And Day came back with, "What's been dry? And Garrett said,

"The whole climate in the Southeastern United States."

Garrett then tried to clarify his statement, "I'm not going to say it's drying up, but it's down from what it originally was," and then noted that the size of the pipe across the bridge, "I promise you," he said, was not the problem

Day pointed out that if WMS had the means to cut off the water on either the east or west end of the island during a fire, then there was no need for an ordinance since WMS could control how much water was being used.

Reference Document No. 000694-WU, relative to the request for Water Management Services to more than double its rates for water to St. George Island because they will have to relocate their water line when the new bridge is built to St. George Island.

I have been a customer of Water Management Services for thirteen years. They have provided marginally adequate service during that period. I have had to install a whole house filtering system because the water usually tastes bad, and it has minerals which are very hard on dishwashers and washing machines. In times of high demand, water pressure drops. If I had a good alternative to using their service, I would have gone to it a long time ago. Their rates are high already, more than double the rates per thousand gallons that I pay here in Nashville. I realize that they have to bring water over from the mainland, but their proposal appears to be a way to take advantage of a captive audience (the water users on the island). Have they justified the huge cost estimates for running a new line? Over how many years are they amortizing the cost? Are there less costly ways of running a new line, utilizing as much of the present line as possible?

The Public Service Commission is our only defense against a monopoly that is trying to make a big profit off the users, who will have to pay whatever you allow them to charge. Water Management Services has always put their interests and profits ahead of service to the customers. You are our only protection, so make them justify any increase they ask for

Unfortunately I will not be able to attend the public meeting scheduled on September 12th 2000; but will be grossly affected by the outcome of the proposed utility increases to cover the costs of replacing the water pipeline to St. George Island.

As a homeowner who keeps a second home on the Island and as a retiree, the cost increases that are proposed will greatly impact our costs of maintaining that home. Rental property may be able to "pass on" the increases but that option is not open to me. In addition the amount of water that is used is very low; but the monthly charges are high because of the minimum fees proposed by the schedule on the letter of August 25th 2000.

THE DESTRUCTION AND REPLACEMENT OF THE BRIDGE BY THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION IS THE FORCE BEHIND THE RATE INCREASES. I understand that a lawsuit has been entered to get the F.D.O.T. to compensate the private owner utility for the costs incurred in moving the pipeline to the new location. However; it would seem to me when one public agency impacts another public agency (i.e. FDOT vs FPSC) there should be other recourse than private lawsuits! Both Public organizations represent the people of Florida and yet a private court action is required in order to benefit the people impacted by the proposed rate increases.

If the rate increases were denied by your commission and the private utility "closed shop" thereby denying the people on the Island the ONLY source of drinking water and fire protection water, would the destruction of the present bridge be stopped in the interest of the people on the Island? Is water more important than a bridge suited for the heavy weighted traffic for home construction? A point to consider!

The rate increases proposed should be denied, as that will permanently increase our operating costs. A separate assessment in the form of a tax or bond issue would be preferred. As a private homeowner the solution proposed is unacceptable.

I am writing to you in regard to the rate increases proposed by Water Management Services Inc.

There are four issues I would like to address:

- Water Management Services is a private company that seems to be trying to off-set the cost of installing a new water line to the Island at the expense of the consumers. Manufacturing companies must retool on a regular basis and yet they are able to do so without raising their prices 42%.
- The quality of the present water product minimally meets state health standards; yet water is a basic need for health and sanitation.
- There are actually three types of properties using water on Saint George Island. The largest of these are the income producing properties, either businesses or rental properties. Next come the emergency services such as the Volunteer Fire Department, First Responders and the County Sheriff. Finally, there are the residents of the Island. Income properties can absorb the rate increases. The increases will impact negatively, however, on Emergency Services as well as on the residents. Many residents are retired, living on a fixed income. I am one of those. The proposed rate increases, if granted, would represent 6% of my Social Security check.
- Residents and Emergency Services should be granted either an exemption from the increases or a cap on the increase. There is a precedent for this in the County Homestead Exemption for the Real Estate Taxes. Perhaps a reasonable accommodation would be (if the increases are granted) that non-income generating property on St. George Island be capped at the first proposed rate increase.

What you decide concerning this matter becomes public policy. Good public policy is based on the premise that no one group of people are penalized for the benefit of a single private party. I trust that you will see the distinction between residences and income generating property and act accordingly.

Sirs/ Madam

Water Management Services, Inc. (WMSI) is being required to install a new water main from the mainland to the island because of the new bridge to the island and the removal of the old bridge which now carries water to the island. They have proposed an increase in rates to be charged to their customers more than doubling the current rates. I would like to make a few points regarding this request for a rate increase.

Point one: Excess capacity

We understand that the new main will be a 12 inch main, providing an increase in carrying capacity to the island of 125%.

I concur that that is probably a prudent business decision considering the cost of hanging a new line on the bridge and the continued growth on the island. I suspect, however, that the total capacity will not be needed for 15 to 20 years. The concern that I have, and I believe others share, is that the present customers should not be required to pay for this excess capacity. The cost of the excess capacity should be deferred and recovered in the water rates as that excess capacity is utilized.

Assuming that the present supply is adequate, (if only barely), this suggests that depreciation of only 44.4% of the cost of installing the new line should be included in the recoverable costs borne by present customers. The same logic also suggests that only that same percentage of the cost should be considered in the base on which his return is computed.

At the meeting held by you in Apalachicola I got the impression that WMSI might be permitted a return sufficient to cover all of his interest costs of, say 11%, on \$6,000,000 or \$660,000. This amount is almost equal to WMSI current total revenue and constitutes the most substantial part of the total rate increase requested. This is the reason for the proposed increase of over 100% This is plainly exorbitant and must be denied by you..

To summarize Point one. If his cost is as estimated, \$6,000,000, then only 44.4% or \$2,664,000 should be depreciated and recoverable on the present volume of water delivered.

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Similarly, if his permitted rate of return is 4% to 8% that return should be computed only on the \$2,664,000 or an amount of from \$106,560 to \$213,120, not \$660000. My opinion, with the minimal risk assumed by WMSI, 4% should be a rich reward.

Such action by you will make the price increase to the residents and businesses of the island tolerable, not obscenely excessive as has been requested by Water Management Services, Inc.

Point two: Interim rate increase

WMSI has requested an interim rate increase to recover his cost of the engineering study of the installation of the new pipeline. The engineering study is a necessary part of the cost of the new installation. As such, it should be capitalized and amortized over the utilization of the supplied product, water. Any business must undertake such costs if they are to grow, WMSI being no different. Such businesses must do so with their own capital, why not WMSI. Why should the customers of WMSI be required to provide the money? If the company is under capitalized, let them do as any other business, seek new capital or get out of the business.

I implore the Commission to deny the interim rate increase.

Point Three: Water for fire protection

At the meetings in Apalachicola, after living here for over three years, I learned for the first time that this utility, franchised to be the monopoly supplier of water to St. George Island, was not required to provide sufficient water to fight fires on the island. If I were even slightly prone to hyperbole, I would headline this point THE FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION ABETS THE KILLING OF FLORIDA RESIDENTS. This utility has been franchised by the Commission and had its franchise renewed and still is not required to provide sufficient water to fight residential fires, exposing the citizens of St. George Island to substantial risk of loss of life and unnecessary property damage. This franchisee should be penalized for his failure to provide such means of protection and should be required immediately to provide sufficient water for fighting fires at both ends of the island simultaneously.

In conclusion, ladies and gentlemen of the Public Service Commission, I respectfully request that you scrutinize the request by WMSI carefully. Consider (1) the needs of the community of St. George Island and the cost impact on residents and businesses of a more than doubling of the already high cost of water, (2) the under capitalization of WMSI and his inability to properly provide for growth, and (3) the continued jeopardy to the lives of residents of and visitors to St. George Island and either substantially reduce the requested rate increase of WMSI or revoke the franchise held by WMSI.

Thank you for reading my concerns. I will be happy to meet with the Commission or its staff if that would be helpful.

We are aware that with the construction of a new bridge to St. George Island, that the water main has to be relocated and that this will be an expensive procedure. However, it appears to us that the proposed rate increase is significantly higher than it should be.

Considering that our monthly charge at the present time is higher than many other coastal communities, we do not feel that an inappropriate elevated rate should be perpetuated when the new pipeline is in place. This company's service record is tarnished as concerns St. George Island and we feel that anything they do needs careful oversight.

We trust that you will thoroughly investigate this proposed rate increase and allow only what is a reasonable increase to assist in the company's recovery of the cost for the new line.

In Phase I, the base rate for a homeowner is scheduled to increase to \$25.26, and increase of \$4.36. The increase for water consumption for an average of 6400 gallons per month would increase just \$2.24. It would seem that the residents actually consuming the water should pay a larger part of the increase by increasing the charge for water rather that the base rate.

The requested residential rate increase for Phase II is absolutely unconscionable. A base rate of \$49.70 borders on ridiculous. Someone not using their house at all would still have to pay almost \$600 per year for water they are not using. Even if they used it less than two months, this rate could not be justified. Again, the actual consumers of the water should be paying a larger part of any increase.

I do not believe that the Phase II increase is justified at all. If these increases are allowed to stand, it will force residents to go back and again dig wells and the utility will make even less money.





Dear Chairman Baez:

I would like to express the District's interest in the docket item listed above and I regret having to do so by letter instead of appearing before you personally. A determination of a use as "reasonable and beneficial" and in the public interest are two of the fundamental prerequisites for issuance of a water use permit by the District. Water use efficiency and conservation are important components of this determination and are basic tenets of the Consumptive Use Permitting program.

The District has encouraged Water Management Services, Inc. (WMSI) for many years to adopt an effective conservation oriented rate structure. WMSI's current Consumptive Use Permit requires that they take action to adopt such a rate structure. The importance of maximizing efficiency and conservation by WMSI is heightened by the fact (1) the utility is located in a coastal area of limited resource availability and (2) that any requirement for additional water by this system will require the utility to locate wells further inland with all the accompanying infrastructure requirements that this would entail. It is much more reasonable, as stated in Chapter 62-40, FAC, Water Resource Implementation Rule, to "encourage nonstructural solutions to water resource problems" and let conservation provide some or all of the immediate need.

In light of the District's statutory requirements, the District has reviewed the PSC staff's recommendation regarding rate structure for WMSI contained in the memorandum dated October 20, The District concurs with and supports the recommendation of your staff as a more conservative and appropriate, option than that being put forward by WMSI.
