On behalf of the above-listed entities (hereinafter referred to collectively as "Aqua Utilities"), and pursuant to Rule 25-30.430(3), Florida Administrative Code, Aqua Utilities hereby requests approval of an extension of time through Friday, December 1, 2006, to file its petition, Minimum Filing Requirements ("MFRs"), prefiled direct testimony, and filing fee associated with its anticipated application for increase in water and wastewater rates.

Aqua Utilities previously requested and was granted approval of an extension of time to file its petition, MFRs, testimony and filing fees by Monday, November 13, 2006.
