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## PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Okay. That brings us to Item 10, and we'll allow our staff to switch out.

Are you ready?

MS. CURRY: Yes.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Okay. We're ready.

MS. CURRY: Kiwannis Curry on behalf of Commission staff. Item Number 10 is staff's recommendation that the Commission not accept Baldwin County Internet's settlement offer of \$1,000 for the company's apparent violation of Section 364.183, Florida Statutes.

Mr. Kristopher Twomey, counsel for the company, is available by phone and would like to address the Commission, and staff is available for questions.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you.

Mr. Twomey, are you with us?

MR. TWOMEY: Yes, ma'am.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Okay. Mr. Twomey, go right ahead.

MR. TWOMEY: Okay. I assume the Commission has seen my letter petitioning the Commission regarding the proposed \$10,000 fine against my client Baldwin County Internet, and there are basically just two points in that letter. It was definitely a mistake on the company's behalf. The form waited on somebody's desk and that person no longer worked there and never was seen or heard from again. My client did make payment

with a late fee, and they understand (phonetic) their responsibility is to follow the rules regarding providing information and corporate records.

But the fine of \$10,000, given those circumstances, seems a bit severe, and the company only provides service to two locations, two Internet service providers in Florida, and in effect those services are PRI services or private line tech services. The company only had revenues of \$40,000 last year, or 2005 in Florida, a very small part of their operation, which of itself is a small operation. And I don't -- I understand the recordkeeping is for purposes of providing information to the Florida state government as to the development of competition throughout the state, and in effect I don't believe those -- that that information was in any way compromised due to the small amount of operations that my client has in Florida. So for that reason I proposed a settlement offer of \$1,000 because that seemed more in line with the actual damage done by Baldwin County's failure to provide the form on time.

I'm available for any questions the Commissioners may have.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you, Mr. Twomey.

Commissioners, any questions of Mr. Twomey or of our staff? Commissioner Carter.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: I don't have a question, Madam

Chairman, but I was looking over his recommendation and I see

where staff had contacted the firm and they failed to respond, and I think they're saying that it was based upon an employee. But in other situations like this we have gone significantly more than \$1,000 on a fine like this, and it's obvious based upon the record that it's a legitimate fine. And I think staff has done a good job in researching this issue and working with the party. And I just think that basically we need to let folks know that, you know, if you're going to be getting in business, you've got to be responsible. You have a responsibility in business. Business is business. And that's all I've got to say about that for now.

CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you.

Commissioner McMurrian.

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COMMISSIONER McMURRIAN: I guess I have a question for Mr. Twomey. Mr. Twomey, I apologize for my voice. I think probably after reading the rec you understand at least where staff is coming from about not accepting the \$1,000 settlement offer, but I think you understand that in the past we have accepted settlement offers up to, I believe, \$3,500 in these kind of circumstances. And it's my belief that it's best to be consistent among similar cases such as this one. Are you prepared to modify your settlement offer at this time?

MR. TWOMEY: Yes. I'd be willing to modify it to \$3,500 if the Commissioners thought that would be sufficient to close this docket.

1	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Okay. Thank you, Mr. Twomey. And
2	as you have noted and Commissioner McMurrian has noted and as
3	the staff discussion has noted in instances that I'm going to
4	say have some similar factual situation, we have accepted
5	settlement agreements of \$3,500. It's my understanding from
6	Mr. Twomey that he is speaking on behalf of his client and is
7	in a position to suggest a settlement agreement for \$3,500.
8	Is there further discussion or a motion?
9	COMMISSIONER CARTER: Madam Chairman, as it relates
10	to Issue 1, I would like to just move that we accept an offer
11	of settlement of \$3,500 in this matter.
12	COMMISSIONER McMURRIAN: I can second that.
13	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you. And I concur. So with
14	that, I believe that do we need to take a vote?
15	MR. COOKE: I would take a vote on that,
16	Commissioner.
17	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Okay. We'll take a vote.
18	MR. COOKE: And we would need to talk about, just
19	make sure it's clear as to how we close the docket. We would
20	issue an order at this point if the settlement is accepted and
21	that would close out the docket.
22	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Okay.
23	COMMISSIONER CARTER: I would so move.
24	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Okay.
25	COMMISSIONER CARTER: I should turn my mike on.

1	I would move that the Commission accept the offer of
2	settlement of \$3,500 from Baldwin in this matter.
3	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Commissioner McMurrian, for the
4	record.
5	COMMISSIONER McMURRIAN: I can second that.
6	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Okay. Then all in favor, say aye.
7	(Unanimous affirmative vote.)
8	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Opposed? Show the motion adopted.
9	COMMISSIONER CARTER: And as it relates to Issue 2,
10	do we need to vote on Issue 2 also?
ll	MR. COOKE: Just to make it clear, I would go ahead
L2	and vote on Issue 2, that we're closing the docket, and this
L3	will administratively close the docket once the money is
L4	collected essentially.
L5	COMMISSIONER CARTER: Okay. I would move staff on
L6	Issue 2.
L7	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you.
L8	Commissioner McMurrian.
L9	COMMISSIONER McMURRIAN: And I can second that. And
20	I also want to thank Mr. Twomey for his cooperation today.
21	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Thank you. Thank you for everyone's
22	operation.
23	All in favor of the motion, say aye.
24	(Unanimous affirmative vote.)
25	CHAIRMAN EDGAR: Show the motion adopted. Thank you
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1	all.
