



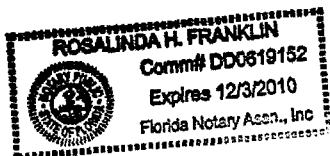

FPL's proposal consists of two solid fuel coal-fired generating units, each having summer net capacities of approximately 980 MW for a combined net capacity of 1,960 MW. The plants are proposed to be located on a 4,900-acre site properly located west of Lake Okeechobee, approximately four miles north-east of the town of Moore Haven in an unincorporated area of Glades County, as well as associated electric transmission facilities located in Hendry County, Palm Beach County, and Broward County. The proposed in-service dates for the proposed units are June 1, 2013 and June 1, 2014.
