On March 30, 2007, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Florida (AT&T Florida) filed its Notice of Intent to Request Specified Confidential Classification pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(3)(a), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), for portions of its response to staff's First Data Request. In its response to staff's First Data Request, AT&T Florida provided attachments that contain confidential cost information it considers proprietary. The document was assigned FPSC Document No. 02771-07.

On April 20, 2007, AT&T Florida filed its Request For Specified Confidential Classification pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, F.A.C. and Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, for certain information contained in FPSC Document No. 02771-07. Attached to its request, AT&T Florida submitted another copy of the documents previously identified as FPSC Document No. 02771-07. The second copy was identified as FPSC Document No. 03388-07.

AT&T Florida claims the information in FPSC Document Nos. 02771-07 and 03388-07 contains confidential cost information related to competitive interests of AT&T Florida that is considered proprietary by AT&T Florida. AT&T Florida claims that public disclosure of this information would cause competitive harm to AT&T Florida. The information subject to the request for confidential classification relates to costs for providing operator service provider telephone calls and is valuable to competitors.

Upon review of the information contained in the documents, technical staff concurs with AT&T Florida that the identified information in the documents meets the requirements for confidential classification pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006(5), F.A.C., and as such, the information should be treated as confidential.
