**RE:** **AT&T Florida's Request For Specified Confidential Classification in Docket No. 060822-TL** - Petition for relief from carrier-of-last-resort (COLR) obligations pursuant to Florida Statutes 364.025(6)(d) for two private subdivisions in Nocatee development, by BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc.  
**FPSC Document Nos. 05964-07 and 06271-07**

On July 16, 2007, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Florida (AT&T Florida) filed its Notice of Intent to Request Specified Confidential Classification pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(3)(a), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), for certain information contained in **FPSC Document No. 05964-07**: AT&T Florida's Responses to Nocatee's First Set of Interrogatories (No. 3) and Second Request for Production of Documents (Nos. 3 & 4).

On July 23, 2007, AT&T Florida filed its Request For Specified Confidential Classification pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, F.A.C. and Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, for certain information contained in FPSC Document No. 05964-07. Attached to its request, AT&T Florida submitted another copy of the documents previously identified as FPSC Document No. 05964-07: the second copy was identified as **FPSC Document No. 06271-07**.

AT&T Florida claims the information in Document Nos. 05964-07 and 06271-07 for which confidential classification is requested contains confidential business information and trade secrets related to competitive interests utilized by AT&T Florida to conduct its business and has not been disclosed to the public. AT&T Florida claims that public disclosure of this information would impair its competitive business interests and cause harm to AT&T Florida. The information subject to the request for confidential classification includes (1) internal network methods and procedures, network design standards and guidelines, and job aids involved in deploying its networks, (2) estimated costs for network deployment in the subject project and AT&T Florida's Network Cost Design jobs that relate to how AT&T Florida determines the cost, (3) the specific addresses of its customers in a development to which AT&T Florida provides service and the types of services provided, and (4) detailed budget, accounting, financial, and strategic information for AT&T Florida related to its provision of service and deployment of its network.

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Upon review of the information contained in the document, technical staff concurs with AT&T Florida that the identified information meets the requirements for confidential classification pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006(5), F.A.C., and as such, the information should be treated as confidential.
