I am writing today to express my displeasure against the recent electric rate increases here in the State of Florida that your department approved on behalf of the regulated electric companies. I know they have been approved by your process, but the negative impact on the public is extensive and this rate should be adjusted downward.

I have been a resident of Mariana, Florida for fourteen years. In that time, I have been a faithful customer of the Florida Public Utilities Company (FPU), 2825 Pennsylvania Avenue, Mariana, FL. Recently; my electric bill has more than doubled. I am over 77 years old, retired and trying to survive on a fixed social security income of \$931.00 per month. My electric bill for January 08 and February 08 totaled \$864.00 under the new rate plan(s). This is simply unbearable. I am a decorated Army veteran that has worked and contributed to America for over sixty years. Now that I am in the autumn of my life, to have to face these economic hardships simply is not right.

Unfortunately, my situation is not unique. There are thousands of seniors who are facing the similar grim realities. When I inquired at FPU about rate assistance programs, they replied that there was none and they were not required to offer any. They referred me to the Salvation Army for a food basket!

Electricity is the lifeblood of the U.S. economy. It powers our homes, offices, and industries; provides communications, entertainment, and medical services; powers computers, technology, and the Internet; and runs various forms of transportation. Not only is electricity the cleanest, most flexible, and most controllable form of energy, its versatility is unparalleled. Clearly electricity is a crucial commodity we all take for granted. We scarcely think about it, unless we don't have it. The pricing policies of the Florida Utility Company are forcing me and countless thousands of Floridians to be without it.

The Florida Public Utility Co., is a for profit private corporation that is a shareholderowned and traded on the American Stock Exchange. As such, they enjoy the protection and support of the United States government both on the state and federal governmental level. In fact they are a monopoly that completely controls the market. There is no constitutionally guaranteed free market system in play here. Here in Jackson County, Florida, they are the sole provider of this vital commodity and as such, their behavior has to be held to the highest possible standard of integrity and fairness possible because they are so protected by society.

The framers of the constitution struggled with the issue of states rights verses a strong federal control and many will say that our most troubling conflict, the civil war, was fought over this issue. The Florida Public Utility enjoys the full support of the federal and state governments in its business dealings and does not want to give back to the society that allows it to flourish. They have state mandated boundaries that prevent any electric company to enter its area thus, prevent free trade.



Thank you for your recent correspondence to the Commission. I would like to take this opportunity to provide a comprehensive response to your questions. With respect to your concern regarding justification for FPUC's increase, please be assured that the Commission staff evaluates each rate relief request independently of other cases or rates. By law, a utility is only entitled to earn on its prudent plant investments. Rates are developed based on the assets of the company and the expenses necessary to provide quality service. The rates of other utilities are not used in the development of rates. FPUC is an investor-owned utility with a particular service territory. Another company is not entitled to serve in the area as that would result in a duplication of infrastructure which would not be cost effective. Further, the Commission does not have the authority to require FPUC to sell its system to another entity. The choice to sell is the decision of FPUC's shareholders.

You also inquired about alternative and renewable energy and storm hardening of FPUC's infrastructure. Our staff engineer, Lee Colson has provided me the answers to your questions. His response is as follows:

The Commission has conducted an extensive review of the storm preparedness activities of the investor owned electric utilities (IOU) in Florida. The review resulted in the adoption of ten (10) initiatives. Each IOU are required to file a plan and estimated cost to implement the plan based on the ten initiatives. FPUC projects that the incremental cost of implementing the ten storm preparedness initiatives (storm hardening) will contribute

approximately \$954,000 to the its permanent requested rate increase of \$5,249,895. All of these costs including storm hardening, will be reviewed in the upcoming rate case, and the Commission will decide what costs are appropriate. Storm hardening represents about 18% of the requested rate base increase. The total rate base increase requested by FPUC's will increase customers bills by 5%. Added to this increase is the fuel adjustment charge, which will add approximately 40% to the total increase. On December 18, 2007, the Commission approved the amendment of Rule 25-6.065, F.A.C., Interconnection and Net Metering of Customer-Owned Renewable Generation. This Rule makes it easier for residential and commercial customers to own, install, operate, and interconnect to electric utility. Thank you for your recent correspondence to the Commission. I would like to take this opportunity to provide a comprehensive response to your questions. With respect to your concern regarding justification for FPUC's increase, please be assured that the Commission staff evaluates each rate relief request independently of other cases or rates. By law, a utility is only entitled to earn on its prudent plant investments. Rates are developed based on the assets of the company and the expenses necessary to provide quality service. The rates of other utilities are not used in the development of rates. FPUC is an investor-owned utility with a particular service territory. Another company is not entitled to serve in the area as that would result in a duplication of infrastructure which would not be cost effective. Further, the Commission does not have the authority to require FPUC to sell its system to another entity. The choice to sell is the decision of FPUC's shareholders.

You also inquired about alternative and renewable energy and storm hardening of FPUC's infrastructure. Our staff engineer, Lee Colson has provided me the answers to your questions. His response is as follows:

The Commission has conducted an extensive review of the storm preparedness activities of the investor owned electric utilities (IOU) in Florida. The review resulted in the adoption of ten (10) initiatives. Each IOU are required to file a plan and estimated cost to implement the plan based on the ten initiatives. FPUC projects that the incremental cost of implementing the ten storm preparedness initiatives (storm hardening) will contribute approximately \$954,000 to the its permanent requested rate increase of \$5,249,895. All of these costs including storm hardening, will be reviewed in the upcoming rate case, and the Commission will decide what costs are appropriate. Storm hardening represents about 18% of the requested rate base increase. The total rate base increase requested by FPUC's will increase customers bills by 5%. Added to this increase is the fuel adjustment charge, which will add approximately 40% to the total increase. On December 18, 2007, the Commission approved the amendment of Rule 25-6.065, F.A.C., Interconnection and Net Metering of Customer-Owned Renewable Generation. This Rule makes it easier for residential and commercial customers to own, install, operate, and interconnect to

The specific impact of the proposed revisions will vary between customers depending on usage. A residential customer in the Northwest Division in Marianna using 1,000 kilowatt-hours (kWh) currently pays \$79.81 (including currently approved fuel and conservation factors) and a residential customer in the Northeast Division in Fernandina Beach using 1,000 kWh currently pays \$90.13. If the proposed charges in this docket are approved, 1,000 kWh residential bills will increase by \$10.20. However, with the projected increases in fuel costs in 2008, the 1,000 kWh residential bill for the Northwest Division is projected to be \$113.27 and \$103.20 for the Northeast Division.

We the people served by this utility have experienced enormous electric rate hikes already in 2007, and have seen no improvements either in better more reliable service, nor a commitment to underground wiring! I believe these rate hikes are a travesty and their justification as being due to "pass through" costs is very suspect. I would expect our Public Service Commission to employ an outside audit firm to thoroughly examine Florida Public Utilities' financial records to ascertain the validity of their claims.

Please, as our watchdog agency to govern these monopolies, DO NOT ALLOW this rate increase to occur without at least a full audit of their books and a mandate to immediately spend some of this extra revenue to bury all electric power lines in our community!

I am in receipt of a notice for Florida Public Utilities' request to increase commercial and residential rates for electricity. This request is <u>very</u> <u>disturbing</u> in that we (residential customers) have recently (earlier in 2007) had a 40% increase in electric rates!

My concern is not only for the price increase to consumers, (including many who try to live on fixed incomes) but the fact that we see NO NOTICABLE improvements to our service or any observable improvement to our community with this additional income.

Specifically I would like to see a commitment by the Utility (really ALL Utilities) in Florida to install underground service lines and remove the unsightly (and hazardous) utility poles. Living on Florida's only "barrier island" we are acutely aware of the potential damages from hurricanes. The fear of being without electrical power during a hurricane is at the forefront of these concerns. Yet, ALL major electric power lines in this community are above ground and susceptible to storm related damage. A short drive down Fletcher Avenue (A1A) which is only a few yards from the Atlantic Ocean, shows the susceptibility of these power line installations to major wind storms, to say nothing of the unsightliness of these lines.

I am sure the utility companies would argue that the cost to install underground lines is "prohibitive"; however, I would offer that underground lines offer far superior life spans and much lower maintenance and upkeep costs than above ground lines. In many Northern States (and all major cities) underground utility lines are mandatory. In these States the Public Utility Regulatory Commissions have insisted the frequent rate increases by Utility companies are approved ONLY if a certain amount of underground cabling is installed by the Utility. This applies not only to electric utilities, but also to telephone utilities.

I know for a fact that installing underground lines in Florida is far less expensive than in Northern States, because there is neither underground rock nor very many hills to transverse when installing the lines. Also, the electrical and telephone service is far more reliable, because of a lack of susceptibility to above ground hazards---automobile accidents; falling tree limbs; water intrusions; sun and weather attacks on the lines; etc.

PLEASE do not approve this rate increase without a guaranteed commitment that all Amelia Island electric power lines are moved underground.

The specific impact of the proposed revisions will vary between customers depending on usage. A residential customer in the Northwest Division in Marianna using 1,000 kilowatt-hours (kWh) currently pays \$79.81 (including currently approved fuel and conservation factors) and a residential customer in the Northeast Division in Fernandina Beach using 1,000 kWh currently pays \$90.13. If the proposed charges in this docket are approved, 1,000 kWh residential bills will increase by \$10.20. However, with the projected increases in fuel costs in 2008, the 1,000 kWh residential bill for the Northwest Division is projected to be \$113.27 and \$103.20 for the Northeast Division.

The first of the year (2007) FPU went up on our rates (35%) this was done without holding a hearing and now I find that our rates went up once again (Oct.1st) and this also was done without a hearing. Once again I see that FPU plans for more rate increases. We will have a hearing (for once) this Dec. to see about another upcoming increase. Our newspaper (News Leader) stated that if FPU has its way the Amelia Island Customers will be paying 65% more for electricity by April 2008 than we were in Jan. 2007. My bill went up this past June from \$65 more or less to \$103 this August and since in the \$90's. I live on fixed income and many of the old timers that live on the island are also on a fixed income and can barely afford the increase in taxes let alone the higher and higher electrical increases.
