Dear Mr. Bergman:

Thank you for your recent correspondence regarding Utilities, Inc. of Florida (UIF or Utility) approved rate increase. I have placed your e-mail and this response on the correspondence side of the docket file for Docket No. 060253-WS.

In your e-mail, you had inquired about a large increase granted to UIF in 2007. First, let me begin by letting you know that we understand that it is never pleasant to experience an increase in rates. During these difficult economic times, any increase in your utility bill creates more of a hardship. If it had been possible to prevent an increase in rates, I am certain that our Commissioners would have voted to do so. However, the Commission had to follow the laws that have been passed by the Legislature that dictate how rate cases like the 2006 rate case for UIF have to be handled. Basically, these laws require the Commission to calculate rates that will let a utility cover its prudently incurred operating costs and allow an opportunity to earn fair rate of return on its rate base (or investment level) that has been devoted to public use and deemed prudent by the Commission.

As set forth in Section 367.081(2)(a)1., the Commission has the responsibility to establish rates that are just, reasonable, compensatory and, not unfairly discriminatory. The rates are to include a fair return on the investment of the utility in property used and useful in the public service. The specific language of Section 367.081(2)(a)1. is as follows:

(2)(a)1. The commission shall, either upon request or upon its own motion, fix rates which are just, reasonable, compensatory, and not unfairly discriminatory. In every such proceeding, the commission shall consider the value and quality of the service and the cost of providing the service, which shall include, but not be limited to, debt interest; the requirements of the utility for working capital; maintenance, depreciation, tax, and operating expenses incurred in the operation of all property used and useful in the public service; and a fair return on the investment of the utility in property used and useful in the public service. However, the commission shall not allow the inclusion of contributions-in-aid-of-construction in the rate base of any utility during a rate proceeding, nor shall the commission impute prospective future contributions-in-aid-of-construction against the utility's investment in property used and useful in the public service; and accumulated depreciation on such contributions-in-aid-of-construction shall not be used to reduce the rate base, nor shall depreciation on such contributed assets be considered a cost of providing utility service.

The Commission staff scrutinized the Utility's request in great detail, including an examination of UIF's books and records since the Commission last established its rate base, responses to numerous data requests asking for additional support documentation, and field inspections of the Utility's water and wastewater facilities by staff engineers. This resulted in the Commission reducing the Utility's total requested rate base of approximately \$10.6 million by over \$2.9 million. The table below reflects the Utility's requested and the Commission-approved rate bases.

WHERE DOES IT END? This may be an unusual way of starting, but it happens to be the first and the last question I will ask you in this e-mail.

In order to bring you up to date I have a brief recap; Two year ago on February 19, 2007 may wife and I attended a meeting presented by the FPSC for the customers of Utilities Inc in reference to their Rate Increase Requested under Docket No. 060253-WS. There were only staff members in attendance, which in itself sent a negative message to all who were there. When we left the meeting we were more disheartened about the way the system works than when we arrived.

I was given a booklet at the meeting titled, Inside the FLORIDA PSC 2007. On page 8 in the section titled "Maintaining the Balance", this line was in the paragraph; "The commissioners must balance the needs of the utility and its shareholders with the needs of consumers". I find that particularly disturbing, because the Oath Of Offices that was taken by all the Commissioners puts the Consumer First, not the needs of the utility and its shareholders. Another line referred to Section 364.01(4), F.S deals with the advantage or disadvantage of Telephone Companies. Unlike consumers looking for a phone company, we have no selection of which Water Company to pick from, to put it bluntly, "were screwed".

I am not aware if you personally or one of your staff members have ever looked into Utilities, Inc and their Parent company, AIG Global Investment Group. (This company was worth over \$538 billion dollars in 2007.) In CFO Magazine February 2007 there is an article titled Water for Profit. This article explains plans to raise the value of water. One line from the article, "With a seemingly endless stream of available "tuck-in" acquisitions and investor-friendly regulators, water companies like Aqua America and American Water are riding the crest of a wave that shows no sign of crashing". Now the FPSC is letting Utilities Inc ride the same wave. Now our government is giving AIG millions as part of the bailout, FOR WHAT?

As a point of interest and information for you, On January the 8<sup>th</sup> 07 on the Utilities Inc announced the appointment of a new Executives John Williams, as the Director of Governmental Affairs. (HIS BIO) "He brings with him more than thirty years of experience in the regulation of water and wastewater utilities at the Florida Commission. He was a Senior Analyst in the Florida Public Service

Commission's Office of Strategic Analysis and Governmental Affairs. He has testified and made recommendations in hundreds of utility cases and was responsible for the Public Service Commission's water legislative program. Williams has frequently made presentations on behalf of the Commission at the Florida Legislature. ALL OF THESE YEARS THERE HAS BEEN A FOX IN THE HEN HOUSE, Shame on the State of Florida Lawmakers that have been completely unaware of this fact.

### This has clearly been a Conflict of Interest for years! It needs to be fixed!

In 07 the FPSC has granted them a 50%+ increase as an interim, Utilities Inc wants 90% increase. In Seminole County alone they want 40% for water and 50% for wastewater. The total package for all the counties comes to over \$3 million dollars. When I asked the Engineer who was at the meeting about the Calcium that is in the water, he said, "that the facility on Weathersfield Avenue has No Purification System and that they just filter the big particulates out". Nothing has changed in the quality of the water in over 36 years that I have been living here. The only improvement I have seen is the new office building that went up a few years ago, which certainly has nothing to do with the quality of the water.

Now they want more money, for what? In the letter I just received a few days ago they are asking for a total of almost 11% this time, for water and wastewater in Seminole County alone, I am almost positive that all the other counties have received letters as well.

Florida has 18,251,243 million senior citizens age 65 and over (of which I am one). That's 17 percent of the state's population. There are over 45.865 thousand seniors just living in Seminole County Florida. How do you think another increase in their water bill will affect those seniors that have Utilities Inc? As it stands now there are many seniors that have resorted to eating cat food just to be able the keep their power on. Is the Florida Public Service Commission looking for the same thing to happen to everyone that is on a fixed or low income in Seminole County? Where is the money supposed to come from? Social Security may give a few % increases, we don't have a commission that we can go to and ask for more money.

Governor Bush appointed and trusted you by the Oath of Office to look FIRST after the welfare of the people. If you allow these increases to go through you will have betrayed a trust he placed in you.

This Board of the Florida Public Service Commission needs to be replaced with people that have the interest of the people in the state of Florida first not the stockholders of a billion dollar company. Years ago Paula Hawkins was one of the key politicians that was responsible for putting this, what I call, "Auto Increase Upon Request Statue" into place, hopefully it will take another politician to fix it.

And so my last question, WHERE DOES IT END? - - I HOPE WITH YOU





Except where indicated otherwise, this report is based on the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2006. As authorized and approved by EPA, the State has reduced monitoring requirements for certain contaminants to less often than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants are not expected to vary significantly from year to year. Some of our data [e.g., for organic contaminants], though representative, is more than one year old. Data obtained before January 1, 2006, and presented in this report are from the most recent testing done in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations.

In the table below you will find terms and abbreviations you might not be familiar with. To help you better understand these terms we've provided the following definitions:

Maximum Contaminant Level or MCL: The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal or MCLG: The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

Maximum residual disinfectant level or MRDL: The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

Maximum residual disinfectant level goal or MRDLG: The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.



The Environmental Protection Agency requires monitoring of over 80 drinking water contaminants. Those contaminants listed in the tables above are the only contaminants detected in your drinking water.

We constantly monitor for various contaminants in the water supply to meet all regulatory requirements. Our water system was in violation of federal and state water quality standards for arsenic in March 2006. The levels of arsenic are shown in the Test Results Table. All subsequent sampling results for arsenic have been well below the maximum level allowed. Some people who drink water containing arsenic in excess of the MCL over many years could experience skin damage or problems with their circulatory system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

In 2006, our water system was in violation of federal and state water quality standards for Haloacetic acids (five) (HAA5). Some people who drink water containing haloacetic acids in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of getting cancer. As a result, the State has required our system to begin monitoring for this contaminant quarterly.

In 2006, our water system was in violation of federal and state water quality standards for TTHMs (Total Trihalomethanes). Some people who drink water containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous systems, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer. As a result, the State has required our system to begin monitoring for this contaminant quarterly.

A Professional Engineer was retained by Utilities, Inc. of Florida to analyze the specific issues causing elevated TTHM and HAA5 levels. Utilities, Inc. of Florida is in the process of changing the disinfection process from free chlorine to chloramination. This change in the disinfection process is designed to prevent the formation of TTHMs and reduce the HAA5 levels in the water distribution system.

In 2006, our water system was in violation for color and total dissolved solids, which occur naturally from soil leaching. Presence of these secondary contaminants poses no risk to public health. Subsequent sampling results for color have been well below the MCL.

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or human activity.

Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- (A) Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.
- (B) Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.
- (C) Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses.
- (D) Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems.
- (E) Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

HUDSON - About five months ago, a crew came to Marilyn Hutchinson's 10-acre homestead. They wanted to test the water.

For what? She did not fully learn until a public meeting Thursday night.

That's when Pasco officials revealed the latest breakdown of the county's troubled sewage system - one that will cost utility customers an unexpected sure, according to various health

# in search of plentiful water for future

OLDSMAR — If you've spotted a 100-foot-tall rig at the city's water reclamation facility, know they aren't drilling for oil or water, but for something else very precious nonetheless.
Empty space.

Youngquist Brothers, a Fort Myers-based drilling company, is boring deep into the earth possibly as far as 3,500 feet to find cavernous areas where a salty brine can be safely disposed of, preventing it from seeping into fresh groundwater or environmentally sensitive areas such as Tampa Bay.

It's all part of the city's alternative water supply project - a proposed reverse-osmosis treatment plant that would turn brackish groundwater into clean drinking water.

The system removes salts and other minerals from the brackish water. To do that, however, the city must have a place to dispose of the brine, or concentrate.

Thus, the exploratory well.

Tuesday, a team of geologists and engineers met with the city staff to detail its progress since drilling began about six weeks ago. To demonstrate its findings, the team showed a pre-recorded video taken with a lighted camera that scoped deep down into the well, currently about 750 feet deep.

"The preliminary results are consistent with what we expected to see," said Tim Curran, principal engineer for Boyle Engineering Corp., which is overseeing the project. "The ability to dispose of a byproduct tends to make or break a reverse-osmosis water supply program. All expectations are that this is going to work."



The team reported it was particularly pleased with the Avon Park rock formation found at about 650 feet, which tests showed had dense limestone, dolomite and clay formations,

plus some Swiss-cheese-like caverns — perfect for containment.

The brackish source water runs between 70 to 200 feet deep. The team said that for every 100 gallons of source water, 75 gal-

lons will be turned into potable water and 25 gallons will be byproduct. Of the state of the

"If this tests out well, like we think it will, we'll come back later and convert it (the exploratory well) to an injection well," Curran said.

The next step?

Drilling the production wells, likely to take place in early 2008. Bidding and construction of the plant should begin in 2009, with completion by 2010.

Currently, the city purchases about 1.53-million gallons of potable water per day from Pinellas County. Having a plant of its own will accommodate future growth of the city and add quality drinking water capacity to declining regional supplies, staffers said.

The future plant, with an estimated capital cost of \$16.6-million, is permitted to produce an annual average of 2-million gallons a day.

But with finances for cities statewide getting tighter, could it be one big pipe dream?

Jeb Bush and Charlie Crist both used the gubernatorial lineitem veto to eliminate state funding for the project. Still the city's staff remains optimistic.

"The city is working on a plan to fund it themselves through Penny for Pinellas and operating revenue," said John Mulvihill, Oldsmar's public works director. "Of course, each step is up for approval by the council, but they all seem in agreement that this should be done, assuming all regulatory issues are addressed.

"And we're always looking for more funding."

The water is considered contaminated if it contains more than 250 milligrams of chloride or more than 160 milligrams of sodium per liter, according to an order by Florida Department of Environmental Protection.



Of 24 wells and soil borings tested from April 2006 to January 2007, eight exceeded the state's chloride limits, including one by 90 percent. Ten tests exceeded sodium standards, them "no choice but to do it." including one by 92.5 percent.

The tests were done within a 1-mile radius of the Hudson treatment plant. The highest levels were found closest to the treatment plant and the ponds, although one residential well , exceeded standards for both elements.

A test near Hutchinson's home revealed high contamination levels. She sees no alternative but to connect to county water and start paying a monthly bill for something a tributary of a major drinking she used to draw from her own well.

"I don't have a choice," Hutchinson said. "What am I to pay."

By linking to county water, customers will pay an average bill of \$20 to \$25 each month. The connection is not manda-these 55 Hudson households tory, although the county's offer to pay the connection fee is for a limited time. If residents wait, they could pay \$1,800 or more as bad and we wouldn't have to to tie into county water months from now.

However, Kennedy told residents the county could have challenged the demand to provide central water by arguing Pasco did not cause the pollution.

That's because the sodium and chloride originated in coastal sewer lines, such as at Leisure Beach, Kennedy said. The salt? may have also come from businesses and private utilities. According to a June 15 letter, the state has asked Lindrick Service Corp. and Hudson Utilities to explain any role they might have had.

Pasco no longer sends the coastal sewage to the Hudson plant. In five or six years, he added, the county intends to shut it down and send the sewage to an expanded plant in Shady Hills.

"Even if we don't do anything," Kennedy said of the sodium and chloride, "it will dissipate naturally."

Thank you for your recent correspondence in which you expressed concerns regarding a rate increase requested by Utilities Inc. of Florida (Utilities Inc.) To ensure that the Commission staff and the Commissioners have knowledge of your concerns, your letter has been placed on the correspondence side of the docket file for all to review.

I am glad that you took the opportunity to speak at the customer meeting held in New Port Richey on March 6, 2007. Customer input is important when evaluating the merits of a rate case.

There are many factors that affect the cost of providing service and hence, the rates charged to customers. Some factors affecting the cost of providing service include: the size and age of the utility system; the quality of the water at its source; the number of customers; and, the geographic spread of the service area. During a rate case, the Commission's accountants, engineers and economists examine the financial and engineering information filed by the company as part of its rate increase application. The Commission's auditors also examine this information and publish the results of their findings in an audit report. All costs found to be imprudent or unreasonable are disallowed for recovery from the ratepayers.

Utilities Inc.'s rate case is being processed in accordance with the Commission's Proposed Agency Action (PAA) procedure. Under this procedure, staff performs a thorough analysis and solicits customer comments for consideration. After all relevant information has been analyzed, staff prepares a recommendation that is presented to the Commission for action at a formal public forum known as the Commission's Agenda Conference. This process is less formal and less expensive than the traditional rate making process that requires the Commission to hold an evidentiary hearing on the utility's request for rate relief.

With respect to Utilities Inc.'s case, the staff recommendation was submitted on April 12, 2007 and is scheduled to be heard by the Commissioners at the April 24, 2007 Agenda Conference. Once the Commissioners vote on the staff recommendation, a PAA Order will be

issued within 20 days. After the PAA Order is issued, any substantially affected person may protest the order within 21 days. If there is no protest of the PAA Order, the Order becomes final.

I have included a copy of staff's recommendation. If you look on pages 122 and 123, you will see the water and wastewater rates that staff has proposed for customers served by Utilities Inc. of Florida in Pasco County. I hope the above information has been helpful. #### Dear Mr. Moscato,

Thank you for your correspondence dated March 4, 2007, in which you expressed concerns regarding a rate increase requested by Utilities Inc. of Florida (Utilities Inc.) To ensure that the Commission staff and the Commissioners have knowledge of your concerns, your letter has been placed on the correspondence side of the docket file for all to review.

As you are aware, a customer meeting was held in New Port Richey on March 6, 2007. During the meeting, customers were given an opportunity to express their opinions and concerns regarding the rates and service of Utilities Inc. Customers provided verbal comments while others, like yourself, have submitted written comments. This input will be taken under advisement when staff formulates its recommendation on the proposed final rates.

With respect to the development of rates, the Commission is required to set rates that are just, reasonable, compensatory, and not unfairly discriminatory. To determine the appropriate rates for service, the Commission uses a rate of return methodology as set forth in Chapter 367, Florida Statutes. Under the rate of return methodology, a utility is allowed to earn a reasonable return on its prudently invested property that is used and useful in serving the public, less accrued depreciation plus an allowance for operating capital. This ratemaking process is used for all water and wastewater companies and is also used in the electric and gas industry. It is the same approach used throughout the country by various state and federal utility regulatory bodies.

There are many factors that affect the cost of providing service and hence, the rates charged to customers. Some factors affecting the cost of providing service include: the size and age of the utility system; the quality of the water at its source; the number of customers; and, the geographic spread of the service area. During a rate case, the Commission's accountants, engineers and economists examine the financial and engineering information filled by the company as part of its rate increase application. The Commission's auditors also examine this information and publish the results of their findings in an audit report. All costs found to be imprudent or unreasonable are disallowed for recovery from the ratepayers.

Utilities Inc.'s rate case is being processed in accordance with the Commission's Proposed Agency Action (PAA) procedure. Under this procedure, staff performs a thorough analysis and solicits customer comments for consideration. After all relevant information has been analyzed, staff prepares a recommendation that is presented to the Commission for action at a formal public forum known as the Commission's Agenda Conference. This process is less formal and less expensive than the traditional rate making process that requires the Commission to hold an evidentiary hearing on the utility's request for rate relief.

With respect to Utilities Inc.'s case, the staff recommendation is scheduled to be submitted on April 12, 2007 and is scheduled to be heard by the Commissioners at the April 24, 2007 Agenda Conference. Once the Commissioners vote on the staff recommendation, a PAA Order will be issued within 20 days. After the PAA Order is issued, any substantially affected person may protest the order within 21 days. If there is no protest of the PAA Order, the Order becomes final.





I attended the water commission hearing, February 19<sup>th</sup>, in Altamonte Springs. Though I did not speak, my neighbor used one of my calls to the utility as an example.

I was asked to submit this.

My first call several years ago to question the rate increases ended with my frustration with their rep. After asking to understand an almost fifty percent increase, the answer of increases in operating costs, along with their rep assuring me she also was paying increased costs for everything, while on a fixed income, was not the issue in my mind. I told her so. Though I'm sure I was less than congenial, I did not use profanity, and made no threats. I assumed there were ways to answer "customers" with questions, but that was never their intent.

My only other calls were to question bills that were estimated, and reluctantly dealt with. My opposition to their claim of fixing it next bill was not sensible, as I was paying an inflated rate on their "third tier" billing. Their adjustments would have been for the lower tier rates. They reluctantly adjusted my bill.

After receiving the latest rate increase proposal, I called to ask where I could get a copy of their rate increase justification. The letter I received stated," if you have questions call. I never got all my question asked, before I was cut off and told to write to the commission, referencing the docket number. I reminded their rep that it stated, if I had questions. I asked several questions, which were not really answered, and finally explained that they really did not have customer service and that I was a hostage. The rep told me she would record my complaint, as they recorded the others, and had it listed that "I liked to complain" Obviously, it's predetermined how I'm dealt with, when they bring up my account, whether I'm congenial or not. This is customer service?

I only write this, because I was asked by the commission staff, to submit it. I assume the reason I'm asked to, is to record the comment that, "I liked to complain", was part of my phone call. I believe that my frustration lead to things being said that were less than congenial, or reasonable, but the "I like to complain" comment is not what a company that must retain customers would use. I have no choice, and am treated that way.

Utilities, Inc. of Florida has been granted an interim increase of 36.4% for water and 13.8% for wastewater in Pasco County pending a hearing on their request.

In the area of SummerTree, a subdivision that consists of 6 separate condominium and homeowner's associations, Utilities, Inc. has failed to pass the health standard tests for the past six quarters. The household water pressure is unstable, at best, and the water taste and smell is so bad that we still must buy drinking water. Neighboring communities that receive their water from Pasco Utilities have water that is of a much better quality and significantly less expensive than the Utilities, Inc. water. On a comparable basis, a household of two persons receiving Pasco Utilities water is paying 40 – 60% less than the same household using Utilities, Inc. water. In this comparison, neither household has lawn sprinklers or does car washing with the tap water. It is only water for general household use – bathing, clothes washing, dishwashing, cooking and of course, drinking.

As a citizen of Pasco County, I cannot surmise any reason for Utilities, Inc. to be granted an increase in rates when they have not been able to provide a quality product to the citizens who must rely upon them to do so. If the rate increase is represented as being necessary to buy facilities and equipment to improve the water quality, I have to wonder what dividends have been paid to the company's stockholders instead of being used for the needed capitalization. Once the increase is granted, rates are not likely to decrease to a more competitive level at any time in the future.

Test Results Show Total Trihalomethane Level
Above Drinking Water Standards

The purpose of this notice is to inform you that the water system serving the Summertree community exceeded a drinking water standard resulting in a violation of the Disinfection Byproducts Rule. Although this condition is not an emergency, as our customer you have a right to know what occurred and what we are doing to correct this situation.

Utilities, Inc. of Florida routinely monitors for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Where disinfection is used in the treatment of drinking water, disinfectants combine with organic and inorganic matter naturally present in our aquifer to form chemicals called disinfection byproducts (DBP). The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) set standards for controlling the levels of disinfectants and DBPs in drinking water, including Total Trihalomethanes (TTHM) and the sum of five Haloacetic Acids (HAA5). The standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for TTHMs is 80 parts per billion (ppb) and for HAA5 is 60 parts ppb, expressed as a running annual average. Based on quarterly monitoring results to date, the running annual average for TTHM is 97 ppb and for HAA5 it is 78 ppb.

#### What should I do?

You do not need to use an alternative water supply (e.g., bottled water) or water filter. However, if you have specific health concerns, please consult your doctor.

#### What does this mean?

This is not an immediate or acute risk. If it was an immediate risk, you would have been notified immediately. A short-term exposure to TTHMs will not result in any adverse health effects according to EPA-funded research studies completed to date. However, some people who drink water containing TTHMs in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system and may have an increased risk of getting cancer. Some people who drink water containing HAA5 in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

### What is being done?

A Professional Engineer was retained by Utilities, Inc. of Florida to analyze the specific issues causing elevated TTHM and HAA5 levels. That analysis has been completed. Utilities, Inc. of Florida has submitted plans and specifications to FDEP to change the disinfection

process from free chlorine to chloramination. This change in the disinfection process is designed to prevent the formation of TTHMs in the water distribution system.

### When will the conversion to chloramine occur and how soon will the conversion reduce TTHM and HAA5 levels?

A construction permit was issued by the FDEP on December 5, 2006. It is estimated that the construction process will be completed by the end of January 2007. Once the facilities are cleared by FDEP for service, you will be sent written advance notice of the date of the change in operation.

Utilities, Inc. of Florida will continue to monitor and report TTHM and HAA5 running annual averages to you on a quarterly basis as long as the average values exceed their respective MCL and as required by FDEP. In the meantime, the Utility has continued its aggressive flushing program in an effort to shorten the residence time of the water in the mains. This acts to reduce the formation of disinfection byproducts while maintaining an adequate amount of chlorine in the water as required by FDEP regulations.

In summary, Utilities, Inc. of Florida will continue its flushing program, monitor the distribution system on a daily basis, and make adjustments to the disinfection system to reduce TTHM and HAA5 while maintaining compliance with the Total Coliform Rule. The Utility will promptly report its activities to FDEP.

Utilities, Inc. of Florida has been granted an interim increase of 36.4% for water and 13.8% for wastewater in Pasco County pending a hearing on their request.

In the area of SummerTree, a subdivision that consists of 6 separate condominium and homeowner's associations, Utilities, Inc. has failed to pass the health standard tests for the past six quarters. The household water pressure is unstable, at best, and the water taste and smell is so bad that we still must buy drinking water. Neighboring communities that receive their water from Pasco Utilities have water that is of a much better quality and significantly less expensive than the Utilities, Inc. water. On a comparable basis, a household of two persons receiving Pasco Utilities water is paying 40 – 60% less than the same household using Utilities, Inc. water. In this comparison, neither household has lawn sprinklers or does car washing with the tap water. It is only water for general household use – bathing, clothes washing, dishwashing, cooking and of course, drinking.

As a citizen of Pasco County, I cannot surmise any reason for Utilities, Inc. to be granted an increase in rates when they have not been able to provide a quality product to the citizens who must rely upon them to do so. If the rate increase is represented as being necessary to buy facilities and equipment to improve the water quality, I have to wonder what dividends have been paid to the company's stockholders instead of being used for the needed capitalization. Once the increase is granted, rates are not likely to decrease to a more competitive level at any time in the future.







Dear Directors.

Utilities, Inc. of Florida has been granted an interim increase of 36.4% for water and 13.8% for wastewater in Pasco County pending a hearing on their request.

In the area of SummerTree, a subdivision that consists of 6 separate condominium and homeowner's associations, Utilities, Inc. has failed to pass the health standard tests for the past six quarters. The household water pressure is unstable, at best, and the water taste and smell is so bad that we still must buy drinking water. Neighboring communities that receive their water from Pasco Utilities have water that is of a much better quality and significantly less expensive than the Utilities, Inc. water. On a comparable basis, a household of two persons receiving Pasco Utilities water is paying 40 - 60% less than the same household using Utilities, Inc. water. In this comparison, neither household has lawn sprinklers or does car washing with the tap water. It is only water for general household use - bathing, clothes washing, dishwashing, cooking and of course, drinking.

As a citizen of Pasco County, I cannot surmise any reason for Utilities, Inc. to be granted an increase in rates when they have not been able to provide a quality product to the citizens who must rely upon them to do so. If the rate increase is represented as being necessary to buy facilities and equipment to improve the water quality, I have to wonder what dividends have been paid to the company's stockholders instead of being used for the needed capitalization. Once the increase is granted, rates are not likely to decrease to a more competitive level at any time in the future.

My neighbors and I urge you to deny any increase in either water or wastewater services and to demand that the water quality be brought up to the required health standards on a permanent basis.

Test Results Show Total Trihalomethane Level
Above Drinking Water Standards

The purpose of this notice is to inform you that the water system serving the Summertree community exceeded a drinking water standard resulting in a violation of the Disinfection Byproducts Rule. Although this condition is not an emergency, as our customer you have a right to know what occurred and what we are doing to correct this situation.

Utilities, Inc. of Florida routinely monitors for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Where disinfection is used in the treatment of drinking water, disinfectants combine with organic and inorganic matter naturally present in our aquifer to form chemicals called disinfection byproducts (DBP). The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) set standards for controlling the levels of disinfectants and DBPs in drinking water, including Total Trihalomethanes (TTHM) and the sum of five Haloacetic Acids (HAA5). The standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for TTHMs is 80 parts per billion (ppb) and for HAA5 is 60 parts ppb, expressed as a running annual average. Based on quarterly monitoring results to date, the running annual average for TTHM is 97 ppb and for HAA5 it is 78 ppb.

#### What should I do?

You do not need to use an alternative water supply (e.g., bottled water) or water filter. However, if you have specific health concerns, please consult your doctor.

#### What does this mean?

This is not an immediate or acute risk. If it was an immediate risk, you would have been notified immediately. A short-term exposure to TTHMs will not result in any adverse health effects according to EPA-funded research studies completed to date. However, some people who drink water containing TTHMs in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system and may have an increased risk of getting cancer. Some people who drink water containing HAA5 in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

#### What is being done?

A Professional Engineer was retained by Utilities, Inc. of Florida to analyze the specific issues causing elevated TTHM and HAA5 levels. That analysis has been completed. Utilities, Inc. of Florida has submitted plans and specifications to FDEP to change the disinfection

process from free chlorine to chloramination. This change in the disinfection procedusigned to prevent the formation of TTHMs in the water distribution system.

# When will the conversion to chloramine occur and how soon will the conversion reduce TTHM and HAA5 levels?

A construction permit was issued by the FDEP on December 5, 2006. It is estimated that the construction process will be completed by the end of January 2007. Once the facilities are cleared by FDEP for service, you will be sent written advance notice of the date of the change in operation.

Utilities, Inc. of Florida will continue to monitor and report TTHM and HAA5 running annual averages to you on a quarterly basis as long as the average values exceed their respective MCL and as required by FDEP. In the meantime, the Utility has continued its aggressive flushing program in an effort to shorten the residence time of the water in the mains. This acts to reduce the formation of disinfection byproducts while maintaining an adequate amount of chlorine in the water as required by FDEP regulations.

In summary, Utilities, Inc. of Florida will continue its flushing program, monitor the distribution system on a daily basis, and make adjustments to the disinfection system to reduce TTHM and HAA5 while maintaining compliance with the Total Coliform Rule. The Utility will promptly report its activities to FDEP.

The purpose of this notice is to inform you that the water system serving the Summertree community exceeded a drinking water standard resulting in a violation of the Disinfection. Byproducts Rule. Although this condition is not an emergency, as our customer you have a right to know what occurred and what we are doing to correct this situation.

Utilities, Inc. of Florida routinely monitors for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Where disinfection is used in the treatment of drinking water, disinfectants combine with organic and inorganic matter naturally present in our aquifer to form chemicals called disinfection byproducts (DBP). The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) set standards for controlling the levels of disinfectants and DBPs in drinking water, including Total Trihalomethanes (TTHM) and the sum of five Haloacetic Acids (HAA5). The standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for TTHMs is 80 parts per billion (ppb) and for HAA5 is 60 parts ppb, expressed as running annual average. Based on quarterly monitoring results to date, the running annual average for TTHM is 97 ppb and for HAA5 it is 78 ppb.

## What should I do?

A construction permit was issued by the FDEP on December 5, 2006. It is estimated that the construction process will be completed by the end of January 2007. Once the facilities are cleared by FDEP for service, you will be sent written advance notice of the date of the change in operation.

Utilities, Inc. of Florida will continue to monitor and report TTHM and HAA5 running annual averages to you on a quarterly basis as long as the average values exceed their respective MCL and as required by FDEP. In the meantime, the Utility has continued its aggressive flushing program in an effort to shorten the residence time of the water in the mains. This acts to reduce the formation of disinfection byproducts while maintaining an adequate amount of chlorine in the water as required by FDEP regulations.

In summary, Utilities, Inc. of Florida will continue its flushing program, monitor the distribution system on a daily basis, and make adjustments to the disinfection system to reduce TTHM and HAA5 while maintaining compliance with the Total Coliform Rule. Our water source is the groundwater from wells drilled approximately 313 to 338 feet deep into the Floridan Aquifer and is chlorinated for disinfection purposes.

### Source Water Assessment Plan

A statewide source water assessment project is under way by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP). This assessment will result in a "SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT REPORT". These assessments will identify and assess any potential sources of contamination in the vicinity of your water supply. The Department of Environmental Protection has performed a Source Water Assessment on our system and search of the data sources indicated no potential sources of contamination near our wells. Utilities, Inc. of Florida routinely monitors for constituents in your drinking water according to Federal and State laws, rules, and regulations. Except where indicated otherwise, this report is based on the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1st to December 31st, 2004. As authorized and approved by EPA, the State has reduced monitoring requirements for certain contaminants to less often than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants are not expected to vary significantly from year to year. Some of our data [e.g., for organic contaminants], though representative, is more than one year old. Data obtained before January 1, 2004, and presented in this report are from the most recent testing done in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations.

In the table below you will find terms and abbreviations you might not be familiar with. To help you better understand these terms we've provided the following definitions:

Maximum Contaminant Level or MCL: The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal or MCLG: The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

Maximum residual disinfectant level or MRDL: The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

Lead. Infants and young children who drink water containing lead in excess of the action level could experience delays in their physical or mental development. Children could show slight deficits in attention span and learning abilities. Adults who drink this water over many years could develop kidney problems or high blood pressure.

It is possible that lead levels at your home may be higher than at other homes in the community as a result of materials used in your home's plumbing. If you are concerned about elevated lead levels in your home's water, you may wish to have your water tested and flush your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using tap water. \*\*\* Test results in May of 2003 from Well #17 revealed a level of iron in our water supply which measured above the maximum contaminant level. Iron is a metal that is commonly found in groundwater as a natural constituent of rocks and soils. The concentration of iron can be dependent on such chemical processes as oxidation reduction reactions; precipitation and solution of hydroxides, carbonates, and sulfides and the formation of complex organic compounds. Levels of naturally occurring iron can be elevated by the corrosion of iron well casing material and from galvanized pipe and iron fittings in the distribution system. Iron is also difficult to treat effectively and reliably due to its reactive nature.

While iron is an objectionable component of the water, it poses no known health risk at the level detected. Iron can, however, affect the taste of water and may stain clothes and plumbing fixtures. Our staff works to minimize the effects of iron by periodically and systematically flushing the water mains. Flushing removes the sediment in the lines which contains the residues produced by corrosion. - (E) Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants.
