On March 17, 2006 Gulf Power Company filed a Request For Confidential Classification, pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, requesting the protection from public disclosure of certain documents and auditor work papers associated with the Review of Electric Service Quality of Florida Investor-Owned Utilities - Gulf Power Company. Gulf Power's request included document items 1.6a, 1.21, 1.24, 1.30a, 1.32, 1.33a, 2.3e-f, 3.3b, 3.4, 4.4a-b, and certain hand-written auditor notes and work papers from the review.

On May 19, 2006 the Commission granted Gulf's request in Order No. PSC-06-0427-CFO-EI. As provided in section 366.093(4), Florida Statutes, and by Commission order, the confidential documents were to become public after 18 months unless Gulf or another affected party shows, and the Commission finds, that the confidential documents remain proprietary and confidential business information. On November 19, 2007, Gulf Power filed a request with the Commission to extend its confidential classification of these documents for an additional 18month period. In its Request For Extended Confidential Classification, Gulf Power contends that the documents are entitled to remain under confidential classification for the same reasons they were initially classified confidential by the Commission.
