2	COMMISSIONER McMURRIAN: Okay. We will adjourn the
3	prehearing in the 02 docket, and proceed to the 07 docket.
4	Ms. Brown, any preliminary matters in the 080007
5	docket?
6	MS. BROWN: Yes, Commissioner, there is one
7	preliminary matter that we can probably address.
8	COMMISSIONER MCMURRIAN: Okay.
9	MS. BROWN: That is the Federal Executive Agencies'
10	petition to intervene that was filed last week. There are no
11	objections to that petition, but it has not been ruled on yet,
12	and we suggest that you could rule on it now, and that would be
13	an efficient way to deal with it. And then we will reflect
14	that ruling in Section XIV of the prehearing order.
15	COMMISSIONER MCMURRIAN: Hearing no objections, show
16	it done.
17	MS. BROWN: And that's the only preliminary matter
18	that I'm aware of.
19	COMMISSIONER McMURRIAN: Any others from the parties?
20	Seeing none. I guess we will proceed through the draft
21	prehearing order.
22	Sections I through IV. Any changes, concerns?
23	Section V, prefiled testimony, exhibits, witnesses, and the
24	next section on order of witnesses.

MS. BROWN: Commissioner, we expect that most if not

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all the witnesses' testimony and exhibits will be stipulated
into the record as we are just about at the cusp of a

completely stipulated case. Parties will be notified as soon

Circuit opinion vacating the Clean Air Interstate Rule on October 1, 2008. There have been no objections to that request, and we recommend that you could grant it here and we will reflect that ruling in the prehearing order.

commissioner McMurrian: Any objections? Hearing none, show it granted. And we already covered the other pending motion, which was FEA's petition to intervene. Moving on to pending confidentiality matters.

MS. BROWN: There are several pending confidentiality matters, and we will address those by separate order.

COMMISSIONER McMURRIAN: Okay, thank you. Section XIV on rulings.

MS. BROWN: In this section we will reflect the rulings that you have made. In addition, we suggest that you rule that if a hearing is held, opening statements should not exceed five minutes. I've got ten minutes here, but let's
