TAMPA ELECTRIC COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION AND MOTION FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER

Tampa Electric Company ("Tampa Electric" or "the company"), pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, hereby request confidential classification of the yellow highlighted information contained in the following described document(s) ("the Document(s)") stamped "CONFIDENTIAL" and all information that is or may be printed on yellow paper stock stamped "CONFIDENTIAL" within the Document(s), all of said confidential information being hereinafter referred to as "Confidential Information."

Description of the Document(s)

Audit workpapers pursuant to Audit control No. 08-234-2-1 (Bates stamped pages 1-621). In support of this request, the company states:

1. Subsection 366.093(1), Florida Statutes, provides that any records "found by the Commission to be propriety confidential business information shall be kept confidential and shall be exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes [requiring disclosure under the Public Records Act]." Proprietary confidential business information includes, but is not limited to "[i]nformation concerning... contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms." Subsection 366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes. Proprietary confidential business information also

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includes "[i]information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information." Section 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes. The Confidential Information that is the subject of this request and motion falls within the statutory categories and, thus, constitutes propriety confidential business information entitled to protection under Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.

- 2. Attached hereto as Exhibit "A" is a justification for confidential treatment of the Confidential Information contained in the Document(s).
- 3. Attached hereto as Exhibit "B" are two public versions of the Document(s) with the Confidential Information redacted, unless previously filed as indicated.
- 4. The Confidential Information contained in the Document(s) is intended to be and is treated by Tampa Electric as private and has not been publicly disclosed.
- 5. For the same reasons set forth herein in support of its request for confidential classification, Tampa Electric also moves the Commission for entry of a temporary protective order pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), Florida Administrative Code, protecting the Confidential Information from public disclosure.

Requested Duration of Confidential Classification

6. Tampa Electric requests that the Confidential Information be treated by the Commission as confidential proprietary business information for at least the 18 month period prescribed in Rule 25-22.006(9)(a), Florida Administrative Code. If, and to the extent that the company is in need of confidential classification of the Confidential Information beyond the 18 month period set forth in the Commission rule, the justification and grounds for such extended confidential treatment are set forth in Exhibit "C" to this request and motion.

WHEREFORE, Tampa Electric Company respectfully requests that the Confidential Information that is the subject of this request and motion be accorded confidential classification for the reasons set forth herein and for a minimum period of 18 months, subject to any request for a longer period of confidential classification as may be set forth in Exhibit "C" to this request and motion. The company further moves for the entry of a temporary protective order pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), Florida Administrative Code, protecting the Confidential Information from public disclosure.

- (1) The information in question if made public would disclose consolidated tax information thereby harming the competitive interests of Tampa Electric and its affiliates by disclosing the nature and expenses associated with their competitive operations and business strategy. This is information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information and thus it is entitled to confidential protection under Section 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes.
- (2) The information in question consists of Board of Director meeting minutes and summary of meeting minutes. This information is entitled to confidential protection because it contains forward looking information not made public, the disclosure of which could harm the competitive interests of the provider of the information and possibly trigger Securities and Exchange Commission reporting obligations. As such this information is protected under 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes.
- (3) The information in question consists of third party consultant work product, to-wit, PriceWaterhouseCoopers workpapers. Public disclosure of this information would harm the competitive interests of PriceWaterhouseCoopers by disclosing their audit procedures, techniques and methodologies. While the results of their audits are summarized in annual reports, the details of the workpapers are not and PriceWaterhouseCoopers has made clear that public disclosure of this information would harm its competitive interests. At the outset of The Staff audit in this proceeding PriceWaterhouseCoopers informed the Commission that its audit workpapers contained trade secrets and confidential commercial and financial information of both PriceWaterhouseCoopers and the audited companies that is privileged and confidential and expressly reserved all rights with respect to disclosure to third parties.
- (4) Hedging cancellation confirmations(no longer requesting conf. treatment)
- (5) The financial information in question consists of projected information about the capital structure of the affiliated and consolidated companies. If publicly disclosed, this information would harm the competitive interests of the provider of the information and would trigger Securities and Exchange Commission reporting obligations. As such, the information is protected under Section 366.093 (3)(e), Florida Statutes.
- (6) This information is proprietary third party, privately negotiated and proprietary contractual information regarding TECO Plaza lease payments. Public disclosure of this

information would harm the competitive interests of the owners of TECO Plaza and impair their competitive business. It would also have an adverse effect on Tampa Electric's ability to renegotiate these payments in the future. As such the information in question is entitled to confidential treatment under Section 366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes.

(7) The documents in question are Tampa Electric's service agreement contracts governing the operation of its generating units. The information in question concerns contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair Tampa Electric's future efforts to contract for goods and services on favorable terms. The information is also considered confidential by the other party to the contract, as it could be potentially affect its future ability to negotiate and contract with other companies on favorable terms. As such, the information in question is entitled to confidential treatment pursuant to Section 366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes.
