In its battle to bar outgoing Florida Public Service Commissioner Nathan Skop from dealing with any of its issues, Florida Power & Light Co. pulled out all the stops Monday, seeking to prevent Skop from participating in a PSC hearing today.

The Juno Beach-based company filed additional motions with the Tallahassee-based 1st District Court of Appeal and the PSC on Monday in its latest attempt to keep him out of its business.

Late Monday the PSC deferred FPL's portion of today's hearing until Sept. 28.

The PSC, including Skop, is still expected to discuss other utility companies' energy-saving programs.

"Our goal is to stop him from participating in FPL matters," Barry Richard, a Tallahassee attorney representing FPL, said Monday.

FPL officials said in court filings that in the past year Skop has become increasingly hostile toward the company, and that his antagonistic behavior has been reserved for FPL. The company contends Skop is no longer fair and impartial.

Skop, 43, whose term ends Jan. 1, did not respond to a request for comment Monday.

In January, Skop and four other commissioners unanimously voted to reject FPL's proposed \$1.2 billion rate increase. The company was granted a \$75.5 million increase. Skop has stated that FPL "owns state government," and accused it of "spin" and "selective disclosure," and accused FPL's counsel of "misrepresentations," according to court filings.

Richard filed an emergency motion for a stay Monday, asking the 1st District Court of Appeal to stop Skop from hearing any FPL matters. On Sept. 2, FPL filed a motion with the PSC asking Skop to disqualify himself from involvement in any FPL issues.

At a nuclear cost hearing a week ago, Skop said the motion was moot because it was not issued far enough in advance of the hearing and did not cite the appropriate statute.

Skop's refusal to disqualify himself set off a series of court filings by FPL attorneys, including one that asks the court to force Skop to rule on the disqualification motion.

Friday, the appellate court gave Skop until Thursday to respond as to why FPL's petitions should not be granted.

The company's recent settlement of its rate case, and 10 other FPL issues are pending before the PSC this year.

Dear Ms. Cole:

In researching the requested 30% rate hike by FPL, I would appreciate having the following points and questions put before FPL. I have confirmed with a Customer Advocate at FPL that the increase would be in the "non-fuel" charge of our monthly bill. In May our FPL bill was only 962 kwh, for some unknown reason. My average bill is 1468 kwh per month.

After 3 days of complex calculations, I took my 2009 May bill (962 kwh) and my 2009 September bill (1728 kwh), broke them down and came up with what my bills would be with the 30% increase. It looks like my May bill would go from \$118.47 to \$134.82. My September bill is \$227.97, and that would go to \$246.43.

The <u>average</u> fuel charge of all 9 bills this year is 53% of EACH BILL. So, a \$9 reduction in the fuel charges is no help at all.

There are many variables in each electric bill, so I only adjusted the 'Non-Fuel" charge and left all other charges (Customer Charge, Taxes, etc.) alone.

Customer Charge is stated to be a "...fixed monthly amount to cover the administrative cost of maintaining the account, even if there was no electricity used." This amount varies each month. In May is was \$5.33 and in September is \$5.52. Is that fixed?

Gross receipts tax : Why is the consumer paying this tax? The only entity receiving gross receipts is FPL. Why is this being passed on to the consumer? Shouldn't this be taken care of by FPL itself?

In conclusion I stand firm in requesting that NO INCREASE be granted to FPL, especially during these extremely depressing times of high unemployment, foreclosures and bankruptcies.

Slack demand for electricity across the U.S. is leading to some of the sharpest reductions in power prices in recent years, offering a break for consumers and businesses who just a year ago were getting crunched by massive electricity bills.

On Friday, the nation's largest wholesale power market serving parts of 13 states east of the Rockies is expected to report that electricity demand fell 4.4% in the first half of the year. That helped to push down spot market prices by 40% during the first half of this year.



Wholesale electricity – power furnished to utilities and other big energy users – cost an average of \$40 a megawatt hour in the region, down from \$66.40 a year earlier. The price declines in this market, which extends from Delaware to Michigan, come on top of a 2.7% drop in energy use in 2008 over 2007.

The falloff in demand represents a reversal of what has been one of the steadiest trends in business. For decades, the utility sector could rely on a gradual increase in electricity demand. In 45 of the past 58 years, year-over-year growth exceeded 2%. In fact, there only have been five years since 1950 in which electricity demand has dropped in absolute terms.

But this year is shaping up to have the sharpest falloff in more than half a century, and coming on top of declines in 2008, could be the first period of consecutive annual declines since at least 1950.

Dramatic price reductions don't immediately mean lower power bills for all consumers. That's because many customers pay prices based on long-term contracts. But lower prices will have a softening effect over time.

In California and Texas, a combination of cheap natural gas and lower industrial demand is putting pressure on prices.

In the Houston pricing zone, which has many power-gobbling refineries and chemical plants, the spot market price was \$61.82 in June, versus \$129.48 a megawatt hour a year earlier. Power demand in Texas is down 3.2% so far this year due to business contraction and reductions in employment which are causing many households to economize.

Just a year ago, many businesses and residential customers were reeling from electricity prices on the spot market that had spiked to historic highs, driven by high fuel prices and hot summer weather. Some businesses curtailed their operations because electricity and natural gas were too pricey.

But the flagging economy has resulted in a slump in demand that has jolted some energy markets. <u>American Electric Power</u> Co. and <u>Southern</u> Co., for example, both reported double-digit drops in industrial electricity use for the past quarter.

Meanwhile, natural gas, which strongly influences electricity prices, has fallen below \$4 per million BTUs, or British thermal units. That's down from \$12 at last year's peak.

For many businesses, the cost of electricity represents one of the few bright spots in a dismal economy. Andy Morgan, president of Pickard China Inc. in Antioch, III., which makes fine china, figures his electricity cost is down 30% to 40%.

Last year, when everything was spiking, he looked at different options -- including negotiating a fixed-price contract for energy with a supplier. He says he held off and now he's happy he did.

"We've definitely reaped savings," says Mr. Morgan, adding that "especially in a down economy, you'll take whatever you can get. That's one of the few blessings during this storm."

Slowdowns at major industrial companies such as Alcoa Inc. help account for the decline in electricity usage this year. The recession and drop in consumer demand for products that contain aluminum has caused the company to idle 20% of its smelling capacity worldwide this year.

In the U.S. the company has cut production at smelters, which are traditionally big energy users, in New York, Tennessee and Texas. Kevin Lowery, a company spokesman, said he did not believe that Alcoa has saved much money thus far because the company primarily purchases electricity through 25- to 35-year contracts.

Steel Dynamics Inc. is benefiting from lower pricing. The company operates five steel mills, with four purchasing electricity at spot market prices in Indiana, Virginia and West Virginia. The benefit, though, is smaller than it might be because the steelmaker is producing less steel this year.

"We're producing fewer tons, but every ton we produce we seek to minimize the costs and electricity is one of those," said Fred Warner, a company spokesman. Its mills are running at 50% capacity this year, down from 85% capacity last year.

Some wonder whether the deregulated markets of the Eastern U.S., Midwest, Texas and California will be especially hard hit if demand comes roaring back. That's because utilities in these markets no longer are required to build new resources. It's left up to the power generators to determine when the market conditions are ripe.

"There's more supply than demand and prices are really low so it doesn't make sense to build anything," says John Shelk, president of the Electric Power Supply Association in Washington, D.C., a group that represents power generators.

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Many electricity markets throughout the country have implemented demand reduction programs that give consumers a further incentive to reduce power use. The 13-state PJM Interconnection market has been one of the most aggressive – and has seen one of the steepest price drops.

A new report from the region's official market monitor found a strong correlation between falling prices and an increase in demandreduction programs. In the PJM market, energy users can collect money through an auction process for pledging to cut energy use in future periods.

In May, PJM conducted an auction to ensure it will have the resources it believes it will need in 2012-13. About 6% of the winning bids came from those who pledged to cut energy use by a total of 8,000 megawatts in that future period.

Please do not allow FPL to raise their rates by 30% or any other amount. I speak as a customer and a resident of Florida. In these current desperate economic times it is **not necessary** to increase the cost of a basic necessity in order to "improve <u>future</u> needs". Please consider the following:

- I volunteer at a local food pantry and help resource for the displaced, homeless, jobless, very poor. Our St. Joseph Catholic Community/St. Vincent de Paul Society assists an average of 60-70 families a month with FPL shut-off notices. This amounts to approximately \$1,500/month. These families are usually overwhelmed with medical expenses, job layoffs, reduced work hours, etc. There is also assistance from many other resources, so these numbers are just a drop in the bucket. If clients can't meet the current prices, how can they absorb an increase?
- My husband and I are retired. We will NOT be receiving any increases in our Social Security in 2010. Last month we had \$79.70 left at the end of the month. Where are we supposed to find an additional 30% to pay our electric bill?
- This past month our "fuel charge" was \$90.92 (Actual cost of the fuel to produce and deliver our electricity). Our "non-fuel" charge was \$77.76 (cost of fuel used to produce and deliver our electricity except fuel). Each month in 2009 our electric usage has been between 100 and 250 kwh LESS than the year before, but our bills have been higher.

In conclusion I feel that Florida Power and Light is currently covering their expenses, possibly with a small profit. Any increase at this time is inappropriate and greedy. FPL may be ready to move ahead but not on the backs of those who are falling behind.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Please do not allow FPL to raise their rates by 30% or any other amount. I speak as a customer and a resident of Florida. In these current desperate economic times it is not necessary to increase the cost of a basic necessity in order to "improve <u>future</u> needs". Please consider the following:

- I volunteer at a local food pantry and help resource for the displaced, homeless, jobless, very poor. Our St. Joseph Catholic Community/St. Vincent de Paul Society assists an average of 60-70 families a month with FPL shut-off notices. This amounts to approximately \$1,500/month. These families are usually overwhelmed with medical expenses, job layoffs, reduced work hours, etc. There is also assistance from many other resources, so these numbers are just a drop in the bucket. If clients can't meet the current prices, how can they absorb an increase?
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 This past month our "fuel charge" was \$90.92 (Actual cost of the fuel to produce and deliver our electricity). Our "non-fuel" charge was \$77.76 (cost of fuel used to produce and deliver our electricity except fuel). Each month in 2009 our electric usage has been between 100 and 250 kwh LESS than the year before, but our bills have been higher.

In conclusion I feel that Florida Power and Light is currently covering their expenses, possibly with a small profit. Any increase at this time is inappropriate and greedy. FPL may be ready to move ahead but not on the backs of those who are falling behind.
