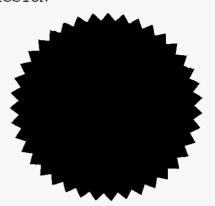

2	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Let's move on to Issue
3	10. Staff? Ms. Lynn?
4	MS. LYNN: Commissioners, I'm Tonya Lynn with
5	the Commission staff. Item 10 is staff's
6	recommendation regarding the application for an
7	increase in water and wastewater rates in Seminole
8	County by Sanlando Utilities Corporation.
9	An oral modification has been provided to
10	this to the Commissioners and all parties.
11	Charlie Beck from the Office of Public Counsel and
12	Christian Marcelli, counsel for Sanlando, are here
13	to address the Commission. Staff is prepared to
14	answer any questions that the Commission may have.
15	CHAIRPERSON ARGENZIANO: Thank you. Mr. Beck?
16	MR. BECK: Thank you, Madam Chairman. Our
17	position on Item 10 is the same as in the previous
18	two. We can accept the staff recommendation as an
19	end result as reasonable even though we would
20	litigate many issues if contested. Thank you.
21	CHAIRMAN ARCENZIANO: Thank you.
22	Mr. Friedman?
23	MR. FRIEDMAN: Marty Friedman, law firm of
24	Rose, Sundstrom & Bentley, Again we would

reiterate our arguments on Issues 3, 14 and 25.

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CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: 3, 14 and 25?

MR. FRIEDMAN: Right. Twenty-five is the rate structure.

CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Right. Thank you. Commissioner Skop?

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you, Madam Chair. Just to staff and Mr. Friedman, again on page 35 of the staff recommendation for Item 10 has 15 hours to prepare for and attend agenda conference, discuss agenda with client and staff. In other instances before the Commission today, the number has been seven-and-a-half hours, and, you know, particularly in the limited proceeding it was even a higher number, the same as this, whereas this is a full-blown rate case. So I think it's important to be consistent or to have a finer appreciation as to why that number is substantially higher for the same legal task.

MR. FRIEDMAN: Yeah. Commissioner Skop, yeah, because we had -- what we did is we split -- Mr. Marcelli and I both attended this because of the number of issues involved and so we split the -the rate case expense on one of those between two of those cases for Mr. Marcelli, and then the other is eight hours for me to be here or 15 hours for me

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to be here. So because both of us had to attend these agenda conferences, the reason why it looks that way for Sanlando. And now that we've got to come back for Cypress Lakes, it looks like allocating it with Cypress Lakes probably doesn't hurt anybody.

CHAIRPERSON ARGENZIANO: Commissioner Skop?

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. To staff on the same issue.

MS. LYNN: Yeah. In looking at prior rate cases, they had, I think, an average of 15 hours, and in their estimate to complete they had one lawyer compared to the other two cases where they had one lawyer for two cases.

staff my point was it appears to be a carbon copy in some instance on some of the perfunctory tasks. But, you know, the consistency when you've got double time on some and not for others, comparing and contrasting those to a limited proceeding versus full-blown rate case, that's where, you know, it starts to beg the question as to, you know, is this number fair, just and reasonable and accurately reflected.

I'll take staff at their word. I don't mean

to nitpick hours, but again I like consistency just 1 as the utilities do. So thank you, Madam Chair. 2 3 I'm ready for a motion. CHAIRPERSON ARGENZIANO: Okay. We have a 4 motion. Any other questions or discussion? All 5 right. Ready for a motion. 6 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you, Madam Chair. 7 With respect to the disposition of Item 10 before 8 9 the Commission, I'd move to approve the staff recommendations for Issues 1 through 32 10 incorporating the corrections contained within the 11 oral modification to Issue 10. 12 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Second. 13 CHAIRMAN ARCENZIANO: All in favor say aye. 14 (Unanimous.) 15 16 Opposed?
