BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, personally appeared Bruce Beisler who, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

- 1. My name is Bruce Beisler. I am currently employed by Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") as Project Manager Nuclear. I have personal knowledge of the matters stated in this affidavit.
- I have reviewed Exhibit C and the documents that are included in FPL's Request for 2. Confidential Classification concerning information contained in the Project Management Internal Controls audit report, for which I am identified on Exhibit C as the affiant. The documents and materials that I have reviewed contain proprietary confidential business information, including contractual data and competitively sensitive data. Disclosure of this information would violate FPL's contracts with its vendors, work to the detriment of FPL's competitive interests, impair the competitive interests of its vendors and/or impair FPL's efforts to enter into contracts on commercially favorable terms. The documents also include Staff's opinion on certain personnel changes within the Extended Power Uprate organization, which reflects employee personnel information that is unrelated to compensation, duties, qualifications, or responsibilities. Disclosure of this private information could have an adverse impact on employee satisfaction with the company and could cause employees to seek employment elsewhere, resulting in the loss of highly skilled and trained employees and/or hindering FPL's ability to attract new talent. Additionally, information related to an internal investigation of an employee complaint is included. Disclosure of this information would adversely impact the Company's willingness to conduct such investigations and share the results with Staff and the Commission. Additionally, because the investigation included interviews with employees, public disclosure could have a chilling effect on employees' willingness to report concerns or otherwise fully cooperate with such investigations. To the best of my knowledge, FPL has maintained the confidentiality of these materials.
