3	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: The next item is Item Number		
4	8.		
5	MS. HELTON: Mr. Chairman, just so the record		
6	is clear, because this is a post-hearing recommendation,		
7	this would be one of those items that Commissioner		
8	Balbis would not be able to vote on.		
9	MR. SAYLER: Good morning, Mr. Chairman,		
10	Commissioners. My name is Erik Sayler on behalf of		
11	Staff.		
12	Item Number 8 is Staff's post-hearing		
13	recommendation on Progress Energy, Incorporated's		
14	request to recover replacement power costs		
15	associated with the extended outage at the CR3		
16	nuclear power unit.		
17	At the conclusion of the 2010 fuel clause		
18	hearing, the Commission asked the parties to brief		
19	several orders, as well as the various options		
20	available to the Commission as it relates to		
21	Progress's request.		
22	Specifically, the Commission requested		
23	that the following options be discussed. One,		
24	recovery of the CR3 replacement power costs prior to		
25	a prudence review, with the understanding that those		
20	a practice review, with the understanding that these

costs are held subject to, or are subject to refund. Two, to recover recovery of the CR3 replacement power costs after a prudence review has been conducted. And, three, partial recovery of the CR3 replacement power costs at this time and a partial recovery later following a prudence review.

7 Staff's recommendation has evaluated the 8 orders as well as the various options available to 9 the Commission. The decision whether to approve the 10 outage costs involves issues of both law and 11 regulatory policy. Staff believes that Progress has 12 satisfied the legal threshold requirements of the 13 three CR3 outage orders that the Commission asked 14 Staff and the parties to evaluate, and that all 15 three options mentioned before are legally available 16 to the Commission.

17 Staff recommends that Progress should be 18 permitted to collect, subject to refund, the 19 replacement power costs due to the extended outage 20 at CR3. Staff also notes that a separate docket, 21 Docket Number 100437-EI, has been opened for the 22 determination of prudence of the cause of the 23 underlying outage and the costs associated with 24 that. Staff is -- and also Staff notes that the 25 actual amount to be recovered in the 2011 fuel

factors will be decided by Item Number 9, which is 1 Progress's midcourse correction. 2 Staff is available to answer questions. 3 Thank you. Commissioner CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: 4 Balbis, you heard the recommendation from the General 5 Counsel that this is going to be a four-panel 6 discussion. Are you, are you okay with that? 7 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Yes, sir, I am. 8 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. I just wanted to make 9 sure that you're aware. 10 All right. That being said, we're to the 11 Commission board. Any discussion? 12 13 Commissioner Skop. Thank you. Just to Staff, COMMISSIONER SKOP: 14 on page 3 of the Staff recommendation I guess Staff 15 proceeds to outline the positions of the various parties 16 in relation to the request before the Commission 17 18 followed by a lengthy dissertation of three options, so I just want to make sure that I understand. 19 I know previously where we left off there 20 was apparently concern from the bench that 21 additional options be provided, and I believe that's 22 23 reflected in Option 3. But I just want to make sure I'm understanding that Staff is recommending 24 approval of what appears to be Option 1. 25

MR. SAYLER: Yes, sir.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And also just as a 2 point of information, on footnote 11 on page 13 of the 3 Staff recommendation it makes the assertion -- or it's 4 5 unknown whether Commissioner Argenziano concurred with 6 the dissent. I think a review of the transcript clearly 7 shows that not to be the case. But, again, I'll leave 8 that to, you know, a reading of the transcript. But I 9 think that's the only questions I have. I just wanted 10to better understand the Staff recommendation. 11 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: All right. I'll chime in. 12 The Options 1, 2, 3 were ones that I know that I asked 13 for and more -- most, most of all I was looking at that 14 to make sure we didn't overburden the, the end user here 15 with these increases going through. 16 But with the, the large decreases we see 17 going through right now, the net effect is it's 18 still going to be a decrease. So that makes me more 19 comfortable with Option Number 1 that the Staff has. 20 But I just wanted to make sure that we had the 21 ability, if we wanted to, to kind of make it a step 22 increase or a half step increase. And I was quite 23 sufficient with what the Staff brought us, and I 24 want to thank you guys for your work for doing what 25 it was that we asked.

Commissioner Skop.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. And just to add to that, again, I think that this has been a little bit of a lengthy recommendation. But as to the half step effect, again, that's been a sound departure from, you know, past Commission practice. I think it's very important to look out for consumers, as I've often done on the bench trying to do the right thing, making decisions on the merits in a fair and impartial manner.

But I think the pause I had with the 10 direction that the panel seemed to be going with 11 that is that I think an important part of regulatory 12 oversight is not only having uniform decisions, but 13 treating utilities equally. And, you know, in 14 recent events there was an instance where, you know, 15 I had attempted to ask some questions without 16 getting into details and, you know, Commissioner 17 Graham, you prevented that from happening. But 18 moreover, the Commission on a three-to-two vote 19 20 voted to approve effectively \$81 million of expense without so much as having a question. 21

So I think that for the Commission to come back and treat Progress differently from what it's done in the past, granted they're both nuclear related, but one is fuel cost, which is based on the

carrying costs which are at the commercial paper 1 rate for interest, and others are at the allowance 2 for funds used during construction, which is a much 3 higher carrying cost than the commercial paper rate, 4 just seemed to be inconsistent treatment. 5 I think it's very important that we treat 6 our utilities fairly and equally, and in that regard 7 it seems that recent Commission precedent would be 8 to go forward and support Option 1, which was the 9 allow recovery, subject to refund, as the Commission 10 voted in the majority to previously do recently. 11 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioner Skop, I don't 12 know what it was that you said that I, I stopped from 13 happening. I don't know if I can unilaterally stop you 14 15 from doing anything. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Well, I had hoped to ask 16 17 some questions, but they became moot at a prior 18 proceeding, so. 19 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Oh, so your questions were 20 moot. 21 COMMISSIONER SKOP: No, my questions were not 22 They were made moot by a motion to reconsider. moot. 23 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. We are on Item Number 24 8. Can I get a motion? 25 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Move to approve Staff FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION
