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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Good morning, everyone. I want to apologize for being a little late this morning. A lot of things were going on, and I thank you all for bearing with me. If you'd like to join us for the invocation and pledge, would you please stand?

(Invocation and pledge led by Commissioner

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioner Balbis, thank you very much for that.

The first thing on the agenda is organizational matters. I just want to let everybody know that I received the letter of resignation from Tim Devlin, the Executive Director.

Tim has been here for about 35 years. For those of you that know, the Public Service Commission is probably one of the oldest institutions in the state of Florida. It was established in 1877. To put, to put that in perspective, that's the same year that the federal troops were withdrawn from Florida for the Civil War, which is 134 years ago, and over a quarter of that century the PSC has relied on Tim Devlin. For 35 years he has steadily increased, he has steadily increased in importance to this organization.

Tim had a full, successful career at the PSC, rising all the way to the very top. Among the many achievements that he's had, he can look back on, maybe the most impressive as Executive Director is he transitioned six new Commissioners into their job in over a year, including me. That's one huge accomplishment.

We would like to thank Tim for his talent and his dedication, and we wish him the best of luck in his future endeavors.

That being said, I'd like to move -- I'd like to ask for a motion to accept Tim Devlin's letter of resignation. And if there's any details that need to be worked through between now and the effective date, that we'll ask the Chair to handle that. Can I get a motion?

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: I move that we accept the resignation.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Second.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: It's been moved and seconded to accept the resignation of Tim Devlin. Any further discussion?

COMMISSIONER BROWN: I just wanted to add a comment. I've only been at the Commission since January, and I don't know if Mr. Devlin is here in the audience right now, but I did want to express my

gratitude for him transitioning me as Commissioner and helping educate me and getting in contact with the various departments. I'm very grateful for that.

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I'm also grateful for his 35-years-plus service to the Commission, a great amount of work and dedication, and I know that a lot of folks here are going to miss you. So we wish you the best of luck.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioner Balbis.

just want to echo Commissioner Brown's comments. I want to thank Tim for his dedication. His over three decades of service is certainly impressive; giving sacrifices to serve this state and this agency. I want to thank him for that service. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, Commissioner Balbis.

Okay. Any further discussion? Seeing none, all in favor, say aye.

(Affirmative vote.)

Those opposed?

By your action, we have accepted the resignation.

A couple of other comments I'd like to make.

There is -- because of budget constraints, there was several employees that were let go last week. They also

were dedicated to this agency, and they were given also until the end of June. And I wish them well in all their future endeavors.

Also, there were several newspaper articles that came out about this issue. And to set the record straight, one of the newspaper articles talked about me meeting with utility companies, specifically talked about me meeting with Ken Hoffman. That article is probably one of biggest fairy tales I've ever read in my life. The only time I've seen Ken Hoffman between now and being, and being confirmed was about five seconds right there at the rope with about eight other utility companies and Public Counsel that came up to say congratulations. I don't know where that article came from, I don't know how it was made up, but it is not true. Those of you that know me know me well enough to be bold enough to say what I have and have not done, so I just wanted to make sure we made that clear.

Now I've also asked Julie Brown to head up a nominating committee so we can do a search for a new Executive Director. We'll get more into the details of that when we go into IA tomorrow.

I also asked Curt Kiser to step up to be

Interim Executive Director for about a six-month period

of time or until we get to the point where we identify

another Executive Director. We'll also go into that in more details in IA. And I just want to make sure that we had, we are clear moving forward. And if there's nothing else -- Commissioner Balbis.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

And I look forward to those discussions tomorrow in

Internal Affairs in detail, particularly, you know, with
the Interim and the, and the formal search with

Commissioner Brown leading that charge. You know, I

recognize that, you know, this -- what I would like to
do is minimize the disruptions to this agency so we can
continue doing the important work that we do, and I look
forward to again minimizing those disruptions, moving
forward and, and going from there.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, sir.
