Request for Confidential Classification for Docket No. 05647-11

On August 11, 2011, Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. (AUF or Utility) filed its request for confidential classification for Document No. 05647-11. The document includes information related to the Utility's market-based, competitive compensation analysis regarding AUF's system operators and field technicians. The Utility claims the information is intended to be and is treated as private and confidential and has not been disclosed externally. AUF claims that the information provided consists of information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the Utility. Staff has reviewed the documents and concurs with the Utility that the nature of the information meets the requirements set forth in Section 367.156, Florida Statutes, whereby disclosure of the information would harm AUF's competitive business interests and would impair the ability of the Utility to contract for employees on favorable terms. Therefore, staff recommends that AUF's request for confidential classification of Docket No. 05647-11 be approved.
