And, also, again, it appears that parties and staff are in agreement on all

issues as reflected in Sections VIII and X of the prehearing order. Again, with OPC taking no position on those issues.

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COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. So we will go through this quickly, again. And I guess I have to go through all of them to give anybody an opportunity just in case there is some change of mind or opinion as we go through this.

Section I, case background. Section II, conduct of proceedings. Section III, jurisdiction. Section IV, procedure for handling confidential information. Section V, prefiled testimony and exhibits; witnesses. Section VI, order of witnesses.

MS. CRAWFORD: Staff would note that with the stipulation of issues it does appear that the witnesses can be excused from the hearing in the '04 docket. Staff is in the process of confirming that with each office and will convey that information to the parties as quickly as possible. And it is my hope and expectation that might be able to be reflected in the prehearing order.
