I don't understand how the PSC approve a bill to allow Progress Energy to charge their customers for future costs of the Nuclear Power Plant when Duke Utilities hasn't even decided whether or not to continue the updates to the plant. I tried calling the PSC and I was transferred away from the Dept. for public information to a line that had a machine on it saving to call back another time. Also, I don't understand why we can't attend any meetings that are with Progress Energy/Duke Utilities. It reminds me of when Florida Water was in business years ago and all the excuses they used to raise every ones water and sewer charges. The community was so upset the employees of Florida Water Services (SSU Utilities) were constantly harassed. I experienced it myself although it was in a different county at the time. I don't blame them either for being so angry. With Progress Energy's bill I am now charged a customer fee monthly, a fuel charge monthly and then a charge for the actually electric I used. Then I go to the grocery store and pay a fuel charge there as well although it doesn't say that on the receipt. I have yet to see the costs come down when the fuel costs come down. I can decide which store I buy my groceries tho and can't for my electric. Presently they aren't paying the total amount they were taxed. If I didn't pay my electric bill they would shut my power off. In the future I can see Duke selling out like Florida Water did and go on down the road. Meanwhile, Citrus County seems to be one of the poorest county's in the state.

I have known Stewart Brand as a friend for many years. I have admired his original and iconoclastic work, which has had significant impact. In his new book, Whole Earth Discipline: an Ecopragmatist Manifesto (Viking), he argues that environmentalists should change their thinking about four issues—population, nuclear power, genetically modified organisms (GMOs), and urbanization.

Many people have asked me to assess his 41-page chapter on nuclear power, so I'll do that here, because I believe its conclusions are greatly mistaken. Stewart recently predicted I wouldn't accept his nuclear reassessment. He is quite right. His nuclear chapter's facts and logic do not hold up to scrutiny. Over the past few years I've sent him five technical papers focused mainly on nuclear power's comparative economics and performance; he says he's read them, and on p. 98 he even summarizes part of their economic thesis.

Yet on p. 104 he says, "We Greens are not economists" and disclaims knowledge of economics, saying environmentalists use it only as a weapon to stop projects. Today most dispassionate analysts think new nuclear power plants' deepest flaw is their economics. They cost too much to build and incur too much financial risk. My writings show why nuclear expansion therefore can't deliver on its claims: it would *reduce and retard* climate protection, because it saves between two and 20 times less carbon per dollar, 20 to 40 times slower, than investing in efficiency and micropower.

That conclusion rests on empirical data about how much new nuclear electricity actually costs relative to decentralized and efficiency competitors, how these alternatives compare in capacity and output added per year, and which can most effectively save carbon. Stewart's chapter says nothing about any of these questions, but I believe they're at the heart of the matter.

If nuclear power is unneeded, uncompetitive, or ineffective in climate protection, let alone all three, then we need hardly debate whether its safety and waste issues are resolved, as he claims.

In its first half-century, nuclear power fell short of its forecast capacity by about 12-fold in the U.S. and 30-fold worldwide, mainly because building it cost severalfold more than expected, straining or bankrupting its owners. The many causes weren't dominated by U.S. citizen interventions and lawsuits, since nuclear expectations collapsed similarly in countries without such events; even France suffered a 3.5-fold rise in real capital costs during 1970–2000.

Nor did the Three Mile Island accident halt U.S. orders: they'd stopped the previous year. Rather, nuclear's key challenge was soaring capital cost, and for some units, poor performance. Operational improvements in the '90s made the better old reactors relatively cheap to run, but Stewart's case is for building new ones. Have their economics improved enough to prevent a rerun? On the contrary, a 2003 MIT study found new U.S. nuclear plants couldn't compete with new coal- or gas-fired plants. Over the next five years, nuclear construction costs about tripled.

Was this due to pricey commodities like steel and concrete? No; those totaled less than one percent of total capital cost.

Were citizen activists again to blame? No; they'd been neutralized by streamlined licensing, adverse courts, and Federal "delay insurance."

The key causes seem to be bottlenecked supply chains, atrophied skills, and a weak U.S. dollar-all widening the cost gap between new nuclear power and its potent new competitors.

Today's main alternatives aren't limited to giant power plants burning coal or natural gas. Decentralized sources provide from one-sixth to more than half of all electricity in a dozen industrial countries and, together with more efficient use, deliver the majority of the world's new electrical services.

Booming orders did lately raise wind-turbine and photovoltaic prices too, but they're headed back down as capacity catches up; PVs got one-fourth cheaper just in the past year, and reactor-scale PV farms compete successfully in California power auctions. New U.S. windfarms - "firmed" to provide reliable power even if becalmed - sell electricity at less than typical wholesale prices, or at a third to a half the cost utilities project for new nuclear plants.

Rather than viewing nuclear power within this real-world competitive landscape, Stewart simply waves away its competitors. He praises efficient use of electricity, but rejects it because he says it can't by itself replace all coal and power all global development.

He also dismisses wind and solar power, and omits small hydro, geothermal, waste/biomass combustion, all other renewables, and cogeneration.

Yet worldwide these sources make more electricity than nuclear power does, and for the past three years, have won about 10-25 times its market share and added about 20-40 times more capacity each year.

The world in 2008 invested more in renewable power than in fossil-fueled power. Why? Because renewables are cheaper, faster, vaster, equally or more carbon-free, and more attractive to investors.

Worldwide, distributed renewables in 2008 added 40 billion watts and got \$100 billion of private investment; nuclear added and got zero, despite its far larger subsidies and generally stronger government support.

From August 2005 to August 2008, with new subsidies equivalent to 100+% of construction cost and with the most robust nuclear politics and capital markets in history, the 33 proposed U.S. nuclear projects got not a cent of private equity investment.

Nonetheless, Stewart rejects all non-nuclear options, for four fallacious reasons:

Baseload: Wind and photovoltaics can't keep the lights on because they can't run 24/7.

Footprint: Photovoltaics need about 150-175 times, and windfarms from 600+ to nearly 900 times, more land than nuclear power to produce the same electricity.

Portfolio: We need every tool for combating climate change, including nuclear power.

Government role: The climate imperative trumps economics, so governments everywhere must and will do what France did—ensure that nuclear power gets built, regardless of economics or dissent.

I believe each claim is unsupportable:

□ Baseload. The electricity system doesn't rely on any plant's ability to run continuously; rather, all plants together supply the grid, and the grid serves all loads. That's necessary because no kind of power plant can run all the time, as Stewart says they must do to meet steady loads. I repeat: there is not and has never been a need for any particular plant or kind of plant to run all the time, and none can. All power plants fail, varying only in their failures' size, duration, frequency, predictability, and cause. Solar cells' and windpower's variation with night and weather is no different from the intermittence of coal and nuclear plants, except that it affects less capacity at once, more briefly, far more predictably, and is no harder and probably easier and cheaper to manage. In short, the ability to serve steady loads is a statistical attribute of all plants on the grid, not an operational requirement for one plant. Variability (predictable failure) and intermittence (unpredictable failure) must be managed by diversifying type and location, forecasting, and integrating with other resources. Utilities do this every day, balancing diverse resources to meet fluctuating demand and offset outages. Even with a largely (or probably a wholly) renewable grid, this is not a significant problem or cost, either in theory or in practice—as illustrated by areas that are already 30–40% windpowered. □Footprint. Stewart understates nuclear power's land-use by about 43-fold by omitting all land used by exclusion zones and the nuclear fuel chain. Conversely, he includes the space between wind or solar equipment—usused land commonly used for farming, grazing, wildlife, and recreation. That's like claiming that the area of the lampposts in a parking lot is the area of the parking lot, even though 99% of it is used for parking, driving, and walking. Properly measured, per kilowatt-hour produced, the land made

unavailable for other uses is about the same for ground-mounted photovoltaics as for nuclear power, sometimes less—or zero for building-mounted PVs sufficient to power the world many times over. Land actually used per kWh is up to thousands of times smaller for windpower than for nuclear power. If land-use were an important criterion for picking energy systems, which it's generally not, it would thus reverse Stewart's footprint conclusion.

Portfolio. The one paper he cites as proof that we need all energy options actually says the opposite. There is no analytic basis for his conclusion, and there's strong science to the contrary. We can't afford to stuff our energy portfolio indiscriminately with some of everything, and we shouldn't: some options are less worthy and effective than others. The more you fear climate change, the more judiciously you should invest to get the most solution per dollar and per year. Nuclear fluxs both these tests.

Government. If nuclear power isn't needed, worsens climate change (vs. more effective solutions) and energy security, and can't compete in the marketplace despite uniquely big subsidies—all evidence-based findings unexamined in Stewart's chapter—then his nuclear imperative evaporates. Of course, a few countries with centrally planned energy systems, mostly with socialized costs, are building reactors: over two-thirds of all nuclear plants under construction are in China, Russia, India, or South Korea. But that's more because their nuclear bureaucracies dominate national energy policy and face little or no competition in technologies, business models, and ideas. Nuclear power requires such a system. The competitors beating nuclear power thrive in democracies and free markets.

Stewart's reputation and his valuable prior contributions to clear thinking for a better world may win his nuclear views some attention. Yet judged on its merits, not his history, this nuclear chapter's assertions can only worsen climate and security risks.

The amount would add \$1.65 to the 1,000 kilowatt residential bill, according to FPL. The monthly increase has declined from \$1.20 in the utilty's original projection, Gibbs said.

Ninety percent of the customer charges relate to its ongoing labor and construction to upgrade existing power plants at Turkey Point near Homestead and in Port St. Lucie. The remainder is to pay for licensing and other preparation costs for potentially two new reactors at Turkey Point.

The plant upgrades will "benefit FPL's customers for decades to come," said Richard Gibbs, spokesman for FPL.

But charges for future nuclear plans have been challenged by the Southern Alliance for Clean Energy in legal action pending in Florida Supreme Court. State lawmakers in 2006 allowed utilities to bill customers for some upfront costs of nuclear projects, even if they were not going to slates to begin operating for several years or at all.

Gibbs said the licensing process for new nuclear plants is a lengthy and costly one.

Nuclear recovery charges are just one element of a residential monthly electric bill, which also includes a base rate, adjustments for fuel costs, as well as environmental and energy consumption charges.

Monday's hearing follows FPL's rate case in August when the utility proposed raising base

rates by about \$7 on a typical household bill.

FPL also has a proposed settlement with industrial power users that it say would reduce what customers would be asked to pay. But the Office of Public Counsel the proposal could actually increase rates for consumers.

Florida's Public Service Commission is scheduled to meet on Sept. 27 and 28 to consider the proposed settlement.

Dear Commissioner DuBose:

We have received a copy of the resolution recently adopted by the Broward League of Cities urging the Florida Public Service Commission "to deny any further approval of early cost recovery charges related to proposed Florida Power and Light nuclear reactors." The resolution also references Section 366.93, Florida Statutes, and urges the Florida Legislature to repeal it.

In 2006, the Florida Legislature, in an effort to promote fuel diversity and electric supply reliability, passed legislation designed to encourage the development of new nuclear capacity. Section 366.93, Florida Statutes, was enacted in an effort to mitigate the economic risks associated with the long lead time and high capital costs associated with nuclear power plants. The Florida Legislature directed the Commission to establish new rules to provide for early cost recovery mechanisms for costs related to the siting, design, licensing, and construction of nuclear power plants in Florida. Rule 25-6.0423, Florida Administrative Code, enacted April 8, 2007, fulfills the legislative mandate for nuclear power plant cost recovery.

The statute requires a utility to receive a determination of need from the Commission prior to seeking cost recovery. Such a determination must consider whether the facility will contribute to reliable service and is the most cost effective alternative. In carrying out its duty under the law, the Commission must review the costs submitted for recovery by Florida Power and Light and make a determination as to whether such costs were reasonably projected and prudently incurred. Only after such a determination has been made can the costs be approved and passed on to customers.

Though there has been some discussion in the Florida Legislature about repealing the law, it remains in effect. Consequently, this Commission's rules implementing the law are applicable to Florida Power and Light's pending docket seeking recovery of costs associated with the company's proposal to construct two new nuclear units at its existing Turkey Point site in Dade County. By copy of this letter, we are requesting that the Commission Clerk, place the League's resolution and this response in the correspondence side of Docket No. 120009-EI, Nuclear Cost Recovery Clause.

The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your E-mail regarding Progress Energy Florida, Incorporated (Progress Energy) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has limited authority in the telephone industry to include the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. You expressed a concern about Progress Energy's petitions to recover prudently incurred preconstruction costs associated with nuclear power plants.





Dear Chairman and Commissioners:

As part of your responsibility as members of the Florida Public Service Commission you will once again be asked by both Progress Energy Florida (PEF) and Florida Power and Light (FPL) to approve costs associated with the nuclear cost recovery clause in Docket No. 120009.

In 2006, the Florida Legislature passed a bill — Senate Bill 888 — that included a provision allowing investor-owned utilities such as Progress Energy to charge ratepayers for construction costs for new nuclear plants before the plant is built and delivering power.

I voted for the legislation based on the information and analysis of costs provided at that time. Just to start, cost estimates we were provided in 2006 have escalated three to four times. As I have seen the law's consequences to Florida families and businesses unfold, I've changed my mind about the wisdom of such a policy that is bad both for consumers and our state. The current law socializes the risk of reactor investments while privatizing the gain.

When I originally supported the advanced cost recovery, I never thought the Commission would turn a blind eye to the high risks associated with such capital-intensive and complicated projects. I know that my fellow lawmakers did not intend to give investor owned utilities a blank check, but that is in essence what has happened. The 2011 NCRC Order granted FPL \$196 million in nuclear cost recovery funds and PEF granted almost \$86 million. Those very large sums represent significant monthly increases in utility bills to millions of Floridians. Before the most recent PEF settlement agreement, bill increases due to the proposed Levy reactors were projected to exceed \$50 per month for the average residential customer within nine years.

These risky investments represent large sums of money for cost recovery for projects that have no timeline for completion, no benchmarks to meet, no limits on the ever-increasing expenses, and no guarantee or requirement that they even be completed. Utility companies, like FPL and PEF, pursuing new nuclear power plants may do so virtually risk free, unlike any other sector in any other industry.

I have offered legislation in the past that would repeal the advanced cost recovery law. While it did not pass and this law remains in place, the Commission does have the discretion to deny further NCRC recovery through its obligation to ensure just and reasonable rates to customers. The mission of the Commission has been to traditionally balance the interests of the big power companies and its customers. The projected costs of the reactor projects are staggering and the law places the risk of the projects squarely on the shoulders of customers. The scale is now heavily weighted on the side of the big power companies.

It is time for the Commission to exercise its authority to ensure just and reasonable rates and deny any further NCRC recovery for both FPL and PEF. The staggering and spiraling cost of the projects coupled with the bill impact to ratepayers demands it.

Thank you for your recent e-mail to the Florida Public Service Commission (Commission) in which you expressed concerns regarding the cost of electricity provided by Progress Energy Florida (PEF or Company). In this response, I will address the questions you raised.

Your first concern dealt with the cost of electricity provided by PEF relative to the cost of electricity provided by a selected group of electric utilities. Each utility's rates are based on their specific costs of providing service. Rates for service do vary between utilities for a variety of reasons. The primary reasons for the difference in rates are the costs incurred to provide service and the number of customers available to spread these costs over. Depending on the type of power plants operated by the utility, the age of the energy delivery systems, the cost incurred to finance utility operations, and the size of the territory served, some utility systems are going to be more expensive to operate than other systems. The Commission does not set rates for any utility based on a comparison of rates across utilities.

Your next question related to the cost of service study used to determine rates in PEF's 2009 rate case. Every investor-owned utility (IOU) must file a comprehensive cost of service study in each rate case. To access the cost of service study filed in PEF's 2009 rate case, please go to the Commission's website, <u>www.floridapsc.com</u>; look for the tab Dockets and Filings; and type in the PEF case number 090079. The cost of service study is document number 02442-09.

You also asked about the rate of return of the residential, commercial, and industrial rate classes. This information is not tracked between rate cases so I cannot provide the current rates of return for these classes. However, this information as of the time of the rate case is included in the cost of service study referenced above.

Your next question dealt with PEF's Home Energy Improvement Program. This is a program offered by PEF to detect A/C duct leakage. This program is voluntary on the part of customers and thus is strictly between the customers that choose to participate and PEF. It is our understanding that if the customer is not satisfied with the results, that it's customary for the Company to refund the charge.

Your final question asked about the status of PEF's new nuclear plants and the recovery of the costs associated with the plants through rates. To encourage the development of nuclear power, the Florida Legislature enacted a law in 2006 to permit IOUs to recover prudently incurred siting and preconstruction costs during the construction process. The Commission then adopted a rule on how to evaluate those costs annually. This year's nuclear cost recovery (NCRC) hearing is scheduled for August 6 - 10, 2012, when Commissioners will hear testimony from the IOUs, consumer groups, and the public on recovery of actual and estimated project costs.

Consistent with Section 366.93, Florida Statutes, each year the Commission approves 5/15/2012

cost recovery amounts for construction of planned nuclear power plants and additions to existing nuclear power plants for PEF and Florida Power & Light Company. PEF's approved recovery includes costs associated with the construction of its planned Levy Units 1 and 2 and adding capacity to existing Crystal River Unit 3. When completed, these projects will add approximately 2,380 MW of new nuclear base load generation to PEF's system, enough energy to power 1.3 million homes. Based on its latest projections, PEF expects the new nuclear units to be completed in 2024. To give the Commissioners and staff an opportunity to review and understand your concerns, I have placed your e-mail on the correspondence side of the file in Docket No. 120009-EI.

The bottome line is: In light of the tabulation showing the discrepency between Progress Florida and the other listed rates, a closer examination of their rate structure and costs is in order. Members of the Florida Public Service Commission:

I am Stanley Korzep in Orlando Florida, retired, and like my neighbors, somewhat short of cash .

I have served on the board of directors of the homeowners association in our community. During the past years, the residents have been struggling to make all of their payments to the various service suppliers. The homeowners association is the first to notice this. We have been looking for ways to reduce the maintenance costs paid by the residents, and have cut the individual costs per homeowner by almost \$100.

Even this has been insufficient to satisfy the bank in several cases: I have been very active in establishing a neighborhood watch program over the past two months: I have visited over 190 homes in March and April. Visiting many homes without furniture or residents tends to give a sick feeling of reality to the status of Florida residents. Although most of the homes show no signs of pain, almost 10 percent are in conditions ranging from disrepair to complete vacancy. The owners and previous owners have given up on their dream and left for places unknown.

It seems somewhat unfair that Progress Energy is able to even apply for a rate increase to prefund a nuclear plant that may never be built. The few dollars added to each bill go into a giant fund somewhere near the social security lock box. They receive no interest although, obviously, someone is benefiting from their presence. Those individual rate increase payments do nothing to benefit Progress Energy today, but those same dollars that have gone to Progress in previous months as a couple dollars to pre-fund, now to become a much larger chunk in 2013, could still buy a small meal for a family today.

Make no mistake. I am very much in favor of nuclear energy. I am not in favor of unproven billion kilowatt solar energy behemoths, at least until they have a track record. But socking away a trillion dollars over the next several years for a nuclear plant while our once affluent society struggles for food is wrong. This is not the time to build up the war chest! The same people that lack dollars now, don't represent a customer base that demands a new larger source of electric.

I must state here that I have no problem with Progress Energy. There is no valid complaint about their service. They seem to serve me well. My question is about the timing of a rate increase.

The projected need for electric in 2025 should be reexamined: Could the need be delayed by a decade or two by construction of a more economically fueled plant? Natural gas seems to be becoming a glut on the market.

The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your March 25, 2012, correspondence regarding Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has authority in the telephone industry which is limited to the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. We appreciate the opportunity to assist you.

You expressed concerns about FPL's storm surcharge. The PSC conducted four customer service hearings from March 1, 2006, to March 3, 2006, in connection with Docket Number 060038-EI regarding FPL's petition for issuance of a storm recovery financing order related to the 2004 and 2005 storm seasons. The customer service hearings were held in Fort Myers, Fort Lauderdale, West Palm Beach, and Miami. During the course of the docket proceedings, the PSC also received customer comments by telephone, fax, mail, and email.

On May 16, 2006, the PSC approved a 12-year bond issue, the first approved under a law passed in 2005, to reimburse Florida Power & Light for hurricane losses incurred in 2004 and 2005. The PSC set FPL's recovery at \$708 million, which was a reduction on the requested amount of \$1.050 billion.

On May 22, 2007, the PSC announced the successful sale of \$652 million FPL storm recovery bonds. The bonds were purchased by Wachovia Capital Markets, LLC with an interest rate of 5.23 percent. The bonds are rated Aaa by Moody's, AAA by Standard & Poor's and AAA by Fitch Ratings.

The PSC authorized the securitization financing technique on May 15, 2006, and consistent with its statutory responsibility issued a comprehensive financing order detailing the terms of the bond issuance including a "lowest cost objective." The PSC included this provision to achieve the lowest storm recovery charges consistent with the law and the prevailing market conditions at the time of the offering and pricing of the bonds.

As required by the PSC's financing order, a Bond Team was established, comprised of representatives of FPL, the PSC, and both their designated advisors and legal counsel. The Bond Team took the following actions to protect FPL's customers and achieve a successful result:

- Received an assurance from FPL that the storm recovery bonds would price at least as well as the most recent and most favorable transactions in this asset class. Specifically, FPL's storm recovery bonds priced more favorably than both the 2006 American Electric Power securitization transaction in Texas and the 2007 Monongahela Power securitization transaction in West Virginia.
- Developed rating agency presentations and worked actively with the rating agencies to achieve Aaa and AAA ratings from the major rating agencies.
- Solicited a wide range of potential bidders to pursue competitive pricing for the bonds.
- Held group conference calls for potential bidders to describe the legislative, political and regulatory framework and the bond structure.

The bonds' scheduled maturity is August 1, 2019. The legal maturity is August 1, 2021. However, the bonds may be paid more swiftly. The PSC receives and reviews monthly progress reports from FPL on its bond repayment schedule.

You expressed a concern about FPL's petition to recover prudently incurred preconstruction costs associated with nuclear power plants. To encourage the development of nuclear power, the Florida Legislature enacted a law in 2006 to permit utilities to recover some nuclear plant project costs during the construction process. The PSC then adopted a rule on how to evaluate those costs annually. Annual PSC nuclear cost recovery hearings, held on August 10-19, 2011, allow Commissioners to hear testimony from the utilities, consumer groups, and the public on recovery of actual and estimated project costs.

On October, 24, 2011, to help secure a diversified and stable energy for Florida, the PSC approved cost recovery amounts for construction of planned nuclear generating plants and additions to existing nuclear plants for FPL. FPL's approved recovery includes costs associated with construction of its planned Turkey Point Units 6 and 7 and adding capacity to existing Turkey Point Units 3 and 4 and St. Lucie Units 1 and 2. Over the life of the generating units, the additional capacity projects are expected to save customers an estimated

\$155 million to \$1.5 billion. When completed, these projects will add approximately 2,614 MW of new nuclear base load generation to FPL's system, enough energy to power 1.4 million homes. I will add your comments to the correspondence side of Docket Nos. 110009-EI and 120009-EI and regarding FPL's petition for nuclear cost recovery

You also expressed a concern about FPL's petition for a rate increase. I will add your comments to the correspondence side of Docket No. 120015-EI regarding FPL's petition for an increase in its base rate.

Finally, you expressed a concern about smart meters, which are replacing traditional analog meters. Smart meters are similarly designed to record a customer's electricity consumption in order to accurately bill the customer. Smart meters, however, allow utilities to collect a customer's electricity consumption data remotely through radio frequency. FPSC rules ensure these meters are accurate and the Federal Communications Commission establishes standards for radio frequency.

Complaints serve as a valuable source of information; therefore, your complaint will remain on file with the PSC. We monitor complaints very closely and track any trends which indicate there may be a problem and further action is needed.



The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your E-mail regarding Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) and Progress Energy Florida, Incorporated (Progress Energy) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has authority in the telephone industry which is limited to the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. You expressed a concern about FPL and Progress Energy's petitions to recover prudently incurred preconstruction costs associated with nuclear power plants.

To encourage the development of nuclear power, the Florida Legislature enacted a law in 2006 to permit utilities to recover some nuclear plant project costs incurred during the construction process. The PSC then adopted a rule on how to evaluate those costs annually. Annual PSC nuclear cost recovery hearings, held on August 10 - 19, 2011, allowed Commissioners to hear testimony from the utilities, consumer groups, and the public on recovery of actual and estimated project costs.

On October, 24, 2011, to help secure a diversified and stable energy for Florida, the PSC approved cost recovery amounts for construction of planned nuclear generating plants and additions to existing nuclear plants for FPL and Progress Energy. FPL's approved recovery includes costs associated with construction of its planned Turkey Point Units 6 and 7 and adding capacity to existing Turkey Point Units 3 and 4 and St. Lucie Units 1 and 2. Over the life of the generating units, the additional capacity projects are expected to save customers an estimated \$155 million to \$1.5 billion. When completed, these projects will add approximately 2,614 MW of new nuclear base load generation to FPL's system, enough energy to power 1.4 million homes.

Progress Energy's approved recovery includes costs associated with construction of its proposed nuclear power plants, Levy Units 1 and 2, and adding capacity to its existing nuclear generating plant at Crystal River. When completed, these projects will add approximately 2,380 megawatts (MW) of new nuclear base load generation to Progress Energy's system, enough energy to power 1.3 million homes.
