The following is Central Sumter Utility Company, LLC's response to Staff's Data Request dated August 24, 2012, filed in the above-referenced docket:

1. Certificate Name:

The correct name is Central Sumter Utility Company, LLC, and always had been.

2. Financial Ability:

The loan is for a maximum amount of \$40,000,000 with interest at prime plus 1.5%, with a floor of .5%. The loan is due one year after demand is made. The Villages of Lake-Sumter, Inc., is a wholly owned subsidiary of Holding Company of the Villages, Inc.

3. Utility Plant in Service:

The CSU Water Treatment Plant is operational. It was cleared for service by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) on June 15, 2012. The CSU Wastewater Treatment Plant is also operational. The Notification of Completion of Construction was forwarded to FDEP on July 25, 2012. For wastewater treatment plants, FDEP does not issue a clearance. Once the Notification of Completion of Construction is submitted, the plant is able to be placed into operation.

4. Capacity:

As indicated in the CSU application and supporting documents of the gallows per DATE day presumed for each CSU residential unit for water use and wastewater generation is 86 gpd on an annual average basis. The attached table shows the billing data for potable water

for CSU from February 2012 to July 2012. As is shown in the table, the average quantity used per residential unit is 79 gpd. This is less than what was presumed in the application, therefore, the capacity presumptions are conservative, and the water and wastewater plants will have adequate capacity to meet the demands of the current service territory and the proposed extension.

In order to further confirm that the use of 86 gpd per CSU residential unit is reasonable, comparison data from North Sumter Utilities (NSU) is also provided on the enclosed table. NSU is an existing utility in The Villages located to the north of the CSU service area. Data for NSU is provided for 12 months to address the seasonality of water use. Based on the most recent 12 months, NSU residential customer water use has averaged 81 gpd. This provides additional confirmation that the residential use of 86 gpd on an annual average basis is reasonable to determine the adequacy of the capacity of the CSU water and wastewater plants.

5. Tariffs:

Wastewater Tariff First Revised Sheet No. 11.0 and 13.1 are enclosed.

6. Legal Description:
