CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Item Number 5.

MR. ROME: Good morning, again. Don Rome with Commission staff.

Item Number 5, Docket Number 130089, is a joint petition filed jointly by Florida City Gas and the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department for a natural gas transportation service agreement. The contract is for a ten-year tern, with an effective date as of January 1, 2014. The contract is submitted pursuant to Florida City Gas' load enhancement service rate schedule, which is subject to Commission Rule 25-9.034.

The Petitioner submitted support documentation with the petition, and also provided additional information in response to several data requests from staff. Based on a review of the documentation provided, staff believes that the proposed gas transportation service agreement meets the conditions for service under the load enhancement rate service schedule, and staff is recommending approval.

We're here to answer any questions you may have, and it is my understanding that representatives from both Florida City Gas and from Miami-Dade are here also, if you have any questions.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. Thank you.

Commissioners?

All right. Commissioner Brown.

QUESTIONER BALBIS: Yes. I just have one question for either of the parties here with regard -- I know there are a lot of benefits to expanding this agreement to ten years, and there is a thorough staff analysis, and I read the contract and I appreciate that. But I want to know what the primary driver was for expanding it from the original two years to ten years, if you could?

MR. SELF: Floyd Self of the Gonzalez Saggio and Harlan law firm on behalf of Florida City Gas. As you may recall, when we were last here under very different circumstances, the predecessor contracts had been for ten years. And given the context in which the settlement and current 2011 TSA were negotiated, at the time we felt the best thing to do was to try and package and settle the litigation that was going on and have a contract that would kind of give us a chance to gain some experience and some breathing room.

If you look at a lot of the transportation agreements that you do, normally they are 10, 15 years. So that is more of the industry norm. And the county was obviously very interested in having some stability, as well as Florida City Gas was very interested in

having some stability in the relationship. And we think
we have crafted a contract that addresses both the
county's needs as well as the utility's needs.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you for that. And I think ten years is probably more apt and more appropriate for an agreement of this size. So I appreciate that explanation, and I thought it was really to show the commitment, really, of the parties under the agreement. So that's was really what I was looking at. Thank you.

MR. SELF: This is a very different situation than two years ago.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Commissioner Balbis.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

And I do remember where we were two years ago, and I'm glad to see that the parties are working well together, because I believe at that time it was a little more confrontational. And I just want to confirm that all the parties are happy with this agreement and it's in the benefit of both parties.

MR. HOPE: Commissioner, David Steven Hope,
Assistant County Attorney; with me is Deputy Director
Joe Ruiz from the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department.

The county is absolutely ecstatic about this

agreement. That is why, as Floyd said, we wanted to get back to the historical norm. The historical norm had been ten-year agreements. Yes, in 2008 we had a hiccup that finally brought us in front of you two years ago, and we came up with that short-term solution. But that solution also encompassed, as Floyd has said, enough time to work through another comprehensive agreement which both parties could live with.

And I think both Florida City Gas and
Miami-Dade County will say that there has been enough in
this contract to put aside whatever our differences is
to take into consideration, for example, the CPI
adjustor that kicks in in year five through year ten,
which is something that was more for Florida City Gas in
terms of not being able to anticipate how inflation
would affect the rates.

So there has been a balance between the parties. Both parties are very happy, and we won't be seeing you for another ten years after you approve this.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you.

And I have a question for Mr. Ruiz. I noticed that in this contract there is a take-or-pay provision, and I just want to make sure that for Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department that with the take-or-pay provision, I know you have the lime kilns that require

periodic maintenance, that you feel comfortable that it's not putting an additional risk, if you will, with the water and sewer department.

MR. RUIZ: Good morning, Commissioner.

Well, of course, it does put additional risk, but it's a risk that we feel is absolutely minimal. We are very much incentivized to continue to keep these kilns going 24/7/365. And so we are actually, having rebuilt both of the kilns in recent years, we feel very confident that that should not occur and should not be a burden to the county.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. I'm glad to see that Miami-Dade is ecstatic and that the gas company is -- I assume is ecstatic, as well. But I think this is a good agreement. I think the terms will make sure that there's consistency and long-term stability with this relationship.

So when we're ready, I would be more than happy to make a motion to approve staff's recommendation on all issues in this docket.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. Are there any further comments? Okay. Seeing none, I think we're ready.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

I move staff's recommendation on all issues in
