2		CHAIRMAN BRISÉ	£: Moving	on to	Item	Number
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MS. ROBERTS: Commissioners, I'm Lydia Roberts with Commission staff.

Item Number 11 is an application for staff assistance for alternative rate setting for Four Points Utility Corp.

Four Points is a Class C water and wastewater utility located in Polk County serving approximately 215 customers.

Four Points, the HOA, and OPC filed a joint motion requesting Commission approval of the settlement agreement and closure of this docket.

The parties indicated that the settlement agreement would facilitate a substitution of FGUA as the receiver of the utility. Staff recommends the Commission approve the settlement agreement.

Steve Reilly with OPC is here to answer any questions you may have. As well, staff is prepared to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right.

Commissioners? Commissioner Brown.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you. I just have a question for staff. To be clear with this

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recommendation, it mentions a show cause proceeding
that remains open. And with approval of this
amended settlement agreement and motion, and OPC's
motion, what will happen with that show cause

proceeding action?

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MR. LAWSON: The show cause proceeding was brought several years ago when the original owner of the utility was facing some legal difficulties that have since resulted in his being arrested several times for multiple felonies, and I believe the IRS is also involved. At that time it was designed to try and bring, put pressure on that developer to bring the utility into compliance.

Since we have made motions to intervene in the civil cases involved and we have been working with the State Attorney's Office, we've sort of used that docket to keep an eye on things. We've left it open because until the status of the developer is resolved -- there are several civil cases out there that tangentially impact Four Points -- we've left it open so that we can be ready to move should the need arise. However, we're not moving forward at the moment for the simple reason that since the developer has been removed from the utility, a receiver has been appointed. And as Mr. Reilly can

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explain, there is discussions about the county taking over or the ultimate disposition.

If we were to move forward on the show cause now, we would actually be hurting the, affecting the individuals who are trying to fix the problem. However, we're leaving it open because until that developer is -- his criminal and civil suits are resolved or until the situation with Four Points is resolved there may be a need to move forward.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you, Mr. Lawson.

> CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Commissioner Balbis. COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you.

And following up on Commissioner Brown's questions, I went through the show cause documents and it's very extensive in the list of complaints and associated, fines associated with that, you know, having to do with dealing with customer complaints, charging the appropriate rates, et cetera.

My concern with closing the show cause proceeding is that just because you have a different owner and operator doesn't mean that they don't have to act properly. So it's probably not appropriate

at this time, but when we get to the point of closing the show cause, will that come before us?

MR. LAWSON: I believe so. We'll ultimately make that disposition once we know how the Four Points utilities are going to be, how the situation will be resolved. Part of this is the staff assisted rate case and part of the management audit is to sort of examine the status of things such as how the company is operating, what are the level of customer complaints, what issues have been resolved and not resolved. So it is an ongoing process. And, yes, you're absolutely right, we may very well not just administratively close this. Staff will take a look at this and in all probability will make a recommendation as to the ultimate disposition of the show cause.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Thank you. That's all I had.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. Thank you,

Commissioners. Any further questions or comments?

Commissioner Edgar.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. I remember the discussion that we had on this, about this utility when it was here before us previously, and I believe that we all expressed that our major

concern was that the customers would, although there 1 2 were many issues with the utility, that the 3 customers would be well served by good service, good product, and fair, just, and reasonable rates. And 4 I do believe that this settlement agreement that OPC 5 6 has participated in is in pursuit of that and is in 7 the best interest of the customers and, therefore, I move approval. 8 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. It's been moved 9 and seconded. Any further comments? 10 11 (No response.) 12 Okay. Seeing none, all in favor, say aye. (Vote taken.) 13 14 All right. Thank you very much.
