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CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. We will call this meeting officially to order. We are going to take certain items out of order. Item 4, 6A, and 1A will be taken out of order.

At this point we're going to go ahead and move to Item Number 2, and if we can proceed with that.

MS. COWDERY: Good morning, Commissioners. I'm Kathryn Cowdery with the Office of General Counsel.

Item 2 concerns the proposed amendment of Rule 25-6.0423, *Florida Administrative Code*, Nuclear or Integrated Gasification Combined Cycle Power Plant Cost Recovery.

In 2013, the Legislature amended the implementing statute, Section 366.93, *Florida Statutes*, which addresses cost recovery for the siting, design, licensing, and construction of nuclear and integrated gasification combined cycle power plants.

Staff is recommending amendments to Rule 25-6.0423 in order to implement these legislative changes. Staff is available to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Commissioners, any questions or comments on Item 2?

Commissioner Balbis.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

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I have a question for staff.

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In Senate Bill 1472 that led to this statute, it was very specific on what utilities can and cannot recover for. And my question is is the proposed rule revision, is it specific enough as it pertains to this statute so that it complies with, with the statute itself?

MR. HINTON: Yes, Commissioner. The, the rule amendments either incorporate language directly from the statute or reference the statute directly in every, in every amendment. And the specificity to implement is either incorporated into our rule or it's on an annual basis, or if it's, if it's a situation where it's not something that takes place every year, we reference to the statute where the specificity is included there, so.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. And not to use the word "specific" again, but my, my question really pertains to the new paragraph 3 of the rule where it does reference the statute, and that section of the statute is clear in that what utilities can and cannot recover for.

I just want to make sure that the rule is specific enough so that it complies. Because I know --I assume the Legislature worked very hard to get that specific language in and I want to make sure we're

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complying with that.

MR. HINTON: Yes. Staff believes that by referencing the statute, the conditions under which they can, they can achieve each, each of those -- the approvals that they have to seek pursuant to subsection 3 of the, of the new statute, the conditions for obtaining that approval are within the statute itself. So by referencing it, we feel that everything is, is needed. COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. That's all I had. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. Thank you very much. I forgot -- I failed to mention that items 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 will be voted upon as a block, and item 1B included in that as well. Okay? If there are no further questions, thank you very much. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. At this time we're ready to entertain a motion on items 1B, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9. Commissioner Edgar, you're recognized.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I could say so moved, but just because I like to read them, I'm going to move that we approve the staff recommendation on items 1B, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9.
