PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. So now we move on to our last item of the day, which is Item 1A, okay, which is the election of chairman or chairperson for a term beginning January 2, 2014.

Commissioner Edgar.

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COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. And thank you for recognizing me. I'm going to be hitting that button really fast, I told you.

It is hard for me to believe that these past two years with you sitting there to my left and in our center chair are about to end. They have gone by so, so quickly in many ways. At least they have for me, I don't know about you. (Laughter.)

And, Mr. Chairman, I want to thank you for all that you have done. However, we are going to talk about you and the many things that you have done in service as our presiding officer at the next meeting, so we're going to hold that and maybe even have a little roasting. I don't know, we'll see --

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Uh-oh.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: -- but that will be later this month. But recognizing that the holidays are upon us, and that by the calendar and per the statute we are required to come together as a body and elect from

amongst ourselves the one of us to take on the added duties, responsibilities, and the burdens, and the blame that goes with it to serve in the administrative role of chairman and as chief presiding officer for a term that begins next month.

I have said this many times, and I'm going say it again, that each commissioner and each chairman bring to our work and to our deliberations their own unique background, strengths, expertise and personality. And while the five of us have had the privilege to serve together, we have had stability, collegiality, professional give and take, a welcoming of different views, and that has all brought a stronger result to our decisions on behalf of the State of Florida and in the public interest, and I know that this will continue and I am very, very proud to be a part of it and to work with each of you.

A couple of weeks ago, I was having a conversation with a commissioner from another state who recently has left that role and has gone into private practice, and he mentioned to me, he said, "You know, Lisa, institutions and organizations have a way of choosing the leaders that are right for organization, that are right for the organization, and for the mission at that necessary point in time." Choosing the right

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leader at the right time, sometimes knowingly, sometimes by luck, but it is one of those kind of things that in the way of the world tends to work out.

In this instance, as a collegial body independently appointed to staggered terms and devoted to the public interest and to public service, we have an abundance of riches; varied experience, varied backgrounds, strong enthusiasm, and we cannot go wrong. All five of us have strong leadership abilities and the desire to serve. Chairman Brisé, as we will discuss again later, as I mentioned, you have served us well. But, unfortunately, by statute your time is up --(laughter) -- and that leads us to make a decision.

A few years ago when the five of us kind of joined together within about the same period of time, over just a couple of months, we selected Commissioner Graham to serve as our chair at a time of transition for this agency, and at a time where many, many issues were coming at us fast and furious. He said he would hit the ground running, and he did hit the ground running. But as the circumstances and the calendar dictated, his service as our presiding officer was for an abbreviated period of time.

However, during that time, he took on a number of initiatives, he addressed the water policy issue,

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kind of kicked that initiative off, which was then picked up with the work we had done and the work of our staff. And the legislature, I think, following up on that created the study commission that Commissioner Brown chaired for us. And as we have heard by legislators here in this room and elsewhere, the legislature will be taking that work and continuing to look at those important issues over the next while. And he has continued his leadership on the water issue specifically with work with NARUC and other national opportunities.

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He also helped us to realign our agency somewhat for function and for the future, and has worked closely with our executive director and our general counsel as we tried to wisely use our limited resources and prepare for the issues ahead. And oversaw a time of budget cuts and reduced revenues, and we all know that that is a continuing issue for us to address.

And, of course, there is my personal favorite, the button system up here at the bench that Commissioner Graham put in place, and some of you may know I hated, and told him at every opportunity I hate that darn button. But even I came to be a believer and have adapted to the button system that we use up here for each of us to indicate when we would like to speak and

to be called upon. And it is an addition to our process that has worked well, even though it was over my initial objection.

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Commissioner Graham has demonstrated by both word and deed his emphasis on our decisions and their results, that they be based on law and fact and not on sensationalism, headline, or the latest political winds. And so, Commissioners, I would ask for your support as I nominate Commissioner Art Graham to serve as our next Chairman beginning immediately at the end of Commissioner Brisé's statutory term.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. There's a motion. COMMISSIONER BROWN: Is that a motion? COMMISSIONER EDGAR: That was a motion. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. Commissioner Brown.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: I will second the motion, but I'd like to have some discussion here.

This is a very difficult decision. Not only are each of you colleagues, but we have developed an actual friendship among us. We came at a time -- four of us came at a time of transition, of change, and we have worked together. We have disagreed professionally, but we have a group that is very unique here. And each of us, I think, in my opinion, are considered friends,

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but colleagues, and I respect each of you.

I also think that each one of us could serve zealously and effectively as Chairman, any one of us here. So I have given it a great deal of thought, and the thought comes down to what is right for the agency right now at this juncture. We have got -- you know, we have a lot of things coming on our plate. We have got an election year. We have got an active legislative session that is going to come before us. Commissioner Graham brings a lot of attributes that all of us could benefit from.

With the acknowledgment that he has already served as chair, we do understand his leadership style and his honey badger nature, which I truly respect and admire, and sometimes gets the job done when it needs to be done, and for that -- I appreciate that.

But something that I respect -- and, again, I have grappled with the idea of chairman here because, you know, each one of us can serve very effectively. So I think Commissioner Graham, though, is in a prime spot right now. He is a very -- he is a consummate leader. He embodies what leadership is, in my opinion.

I wrote some notes, but I'm not reading them. But something that I like, and I relate a lot to Commissioner Graham, he takes a task and runs with it.

He is an innovator. As Commissioner Edgar said, you know, she talked about the water study committee. Yep, that was your brainchild, but also the NRRI telecommunications audit, which was, you know, I think at the time very essential.

You take an idea; you run with it. I respect that. I think the Commission needs that. Again, the initiatives that you take are right. We've got a new executive director that I'm excited about, and so I appreciate that, that initiative, as well.

So as I said, I respect each of you. It doesn't mean by supporting Commissioner Graham that any one of you should take it personally, but I think Commissioner Graham is in a posture, and we're in a posture to support him at this juncture, and I'm happy to do it.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. There has been a motion and a second. Further comments?

Commissioner Balbis.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I, for one, like the button system. It is almost enough to support him for that point.

(Laughter.)

One of the things that I have realized in the past three years is that the investment community, the

companies, and eventually the customers benefit from a stable regulatory environment, and that is what is the most important thing. So with that, I fully support the motion.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. Good deal. So I think we are ready for a vote. All in favor say aye.

(Vote taken.)

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. With that, I'm going to pass it on to you in a second, Chairman-elect Graham. And I certainly hope that your leadership will continue to move this agency forward. We have seen great stability over the last three years, and that is, in essence, the hallmark of this Commission with these Commissioners. And we certainly hope that as time progresses and we continue to work with each other and work in the public interest of our state, that that will continue to be the hallmark of this set of Commissioners as we move forward.

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Commissioner Graham.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. So many people to thank. First of all, I want to thank God; all things are possible through him. I realize this is a huge privilege that you have put upon me. I do appreciate it. I do appreciate the support of the entire board. I do appreciate the nomination,

Commissioner Edgar. You have been a great mentor to me for quite awhile, and continue to be so, and I look forward to the things that you're going to do and you continue to accomplish, not just here on the state level, but also it has started to be on the national level. And it is good to actually have somebody from the State of Florida to actually ascend to that position. And speaking for myself, I'm quite proud of you. I'm sure we're all very quite proud of you doing that.

Commissioner Brown, I've enjoyed sitting next to you for the last two years. It's amazing how much you get to know about somebody sitting this closely to them and observing day in and day out. Your work ethic is second to none. Your tenacity is second to none. When there is something that you are fixed and locked in on, I think you go over and above board to make sure that your point is heard. And I think we all hear that point, and I believe every single time you have been successful with that. So, you know, my hat is off to you, and I thank you for that second.

Commissioner Balbis, I thank you for the third. It's good to have a fellow engineer up here, you know, so we don't have to slow down and explain to everybody. I'm kidding. (Laughter.)

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No, I think this board has got a phenomenal balance. As that motion that I had earlier today that quickly got dismissed, you know, there are some things that are more legal matters that we tend to lean to our legal minds up here on the board, our two attorneys; and there are some things that may swing more towards the engineering side of the world; there are some things that lean more towards the financial side of the world, which is our Chairman. And so I think we do have a great balance up here. And I appreciate that you are going to let me lead again. And I understand that it is a huge privilege, and I thank you for it.

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Staff, I can't say enough. The Chairman already spoke about it earlier. I don't know if you heard, but Major Thomas said earlier that you guys are above professional, and I think that says a lot. And we say it from time to time up here, but it's always good to hear somebody from back here on this bench say it. And I think he hit it right on the head that you guys are above professional. You know, you make our jobs that much easier. And even when we don't agree with you, and it's a rarity, but when we don't agree with you, you take that with the same amount of professionalism and you understand that we all have a task to do and a job to do and you do it very well.

OPC, we have gone around and around in circles, and I appreciate everything that you bring to the table. And I look forward to, in the next two years, working closely with you and the other intervenors. I don't know if they are here, but it's always good to see -- and I'll go ahead and use my phrase again -- see you guys all come together and sing kumbaya. I think it does come out with a better deal for the ratepayers for the State of Florida and for the State of Florida as a whole.

I think, as the Governor says all the time, he wants to make for this to be a place where people want to come and grow, economic development, and I think having this kind of a relationship that we all share here helps that move forward. And with all of that being said, Mr. Chairman, your time is going to be in two weeks. I have another page or two to say about you --

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(Audience laughter.)

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: But I do thank you all. And thank you, Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: All right. With that, I want to thank you all for your participation.

Thank you, colleagues, for your hard work today. Staff, thank you, once again, for your hard
