tw telecom still believes that the FPSC needs to be prepared to arbitrate IP-IP Interconnection matters in the very near future pursuant to the authority in state law as well as Section 251/252 of the federal law. Likewise, as the market continues its transition to IP, the FPSC will likely be called upon to exercise its intercarrier dispute resolution authority more frequently. In this context, tw telecom strongly believes that the competitive market will be best protected if the FPSC's ability to resolve disputes on a truly expedited basis is explicitly defined in FPSC rules. Thus, tw telecom urges the FPSC to adopt appropriate revisions to Rule 25-22.0356, F.A.C., to definitively provide for a more expedited process than is currently set forth in the Rule.
