**<u>ISSUE 1</u>**: What are the final conservation cost recovery true-up amounts for the period January 2013 through December 2013?

FPL: \$1,964,488 over-recovery. (Keith)

**<u>ISSUE 2</u>**: What are the total conservation cost recovery amounts to be collected during the period January 2015 through December 2015?

**FPL:** \$191,357,240 including prior true-up amounts and revenue taxes. (Sharma)

**<u>ISSUE 3</u>**: What are the conservation cost recovery factors for the period January 2015 through December 2015?

## **<u>ISSUE 4</u>**: What should be the effective date of the new conservation cost recovery factors for billing purposes?

**FPL:** The factors should be effective beginning with the specified conservation cost recovery cycle and thereafter for the period January 2015 through December 2015. Billing cycles may start before January 1, 2015 and the last cycle may be read after December 31, 2015, so that each customer is billed for twelve months regardless of when the adjustment factor became effective. These charges should continue in effect until modified by subsequent order of this Commission. (Keith)

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Although no specific issue or issues were ever agreed to on this topic, FIPUG and Walmart/Sam's each filed testimony on September 5, 2014 proposing "opt-out" provisions that would allow large non-residential customers to avoid helping fund conservation programs that benefit all customers, including large non-residential customers. FPL will address the deficiencies of these proposals in its rebuttal testimony
