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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Commissioners, now we'll
3	jump back to Item No. 4.
4	MR. BARRETT: Good morning, Commissioners.
5	I'm Michael Barrett of staff. Item No. 4 addresses
6	Florida Power & Light's petition for mid-course
7	correction. This correction will address the
8	projected overrecovery of fuel costs caused by the
9	declining market price for natural gas.
10	As proposed, this mid-course correction will
11	reduce bills for Florida Power & Light's customers
12	for the remainder of 2015 beginning in the May
13	billing cycle.
14	John Butler and other parties are here to
15	speak on this item.
16	Staff recommends approval of the petition.
17	And we're available for your questions.
18	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
19	Mr. Butler, Mr. Moyle, good morning.
20	MR. BUTLER: Good morning, Mr. Chairman and
21	Commissioners.
22	FPL has petitioned the Commission for a
23	mid-course correction which will reduce its fuel-
24	adjustment factors for the remainder of 2015. FPL
25	concurs with staff's recommendation. And we very

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1	much appreciate staff's hard work to complete its
2	review and bring this proposal to you for approval
3	today so the reduced fuel-adjustment factors can go
4	into effect on May 1 if you approve them.
5	The proposed mid-course correction will result
6	in FPL refunding approximately \$219 million to
7	customers by the end of 2015. And on a typical
8	1,000-kilowatt hour residential bill, that will
9	represent a reduction of about \$3.01.
10	The primary reason for the mid-course
11	correction, as staff indicated, is a substantial
12	decline in recent forecasts of natural gas prices
13	compared to the July 2014 forecast that we used to
14	develop our 2015 fuel-adjustment factors that you
15	approved last year.
16	As you're aware, FPL has been modernizing its
17	generating fleet over the past couple of decades to
18	include several natural gas-fired combined cycle
19	units, which generate electricity very cleanly and
20	very efficiently.
21	FPL estimates that its three most recent
22	modernization projects at Cape Canaveral, Riviera
23	Beach, and Port Everglades will save customers more
24	than \$1 billion in fuel and other operating costs
25	over their lives.
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1 FPL's commitment to clean, efficient, gas-2 fired generation allows us to take advantage of 3 drops in natural gas prices with all of the savings passed on to our customers through the Fuel Clause. 4 5 While the \$219 million projected overrecovery 6 does not reach the 10-percent threshold for mandatory reporting under Rule 25-6.0424, the rule 7 8 makes it clear that utilities may seek a mid-course 9 correction for smaller over-recoveries. That's 10 what we've done today. I'll note that our original mid-course 11 12 correction filing included the projected impacts 13 for the Woodford natural gas reserves project in 14 2015 gas costs. FPL felt that including these 15 impacts was appropriate at the time because the 16 Commission approved the project in January of this 17 year; whereas, FPL had -- whereas, the Commission 18 had not approved the project when we made the 2015 19 projection filing last August. 20 However, there is disagreement as to whether 21 the project impacts should be included. And so, 22 FPL agreed with staff to remove those impacts from 23 mid-course correction filing in order to expedite 24 your review and approval of the mid-course 25 correction. The refund you're asked today to

1 approve does not include the Woodford Project cost 2 impacts. 3 FPL believes that a mid-course correction is appropriate. It will allow customers to begin 4 5 benefiting from the fuel savings now rather than 6 waiting for the overrecovery to be rolled into 2016 7 fuel factors under the normal Fuel Clause timetable 8 that wouldn't have them go into effect until next 9 Accordingly, we ask that you grant FPL's year. 10 petition and approve the reduced fuel factors as 11 staff has recommended to be effective May 1. 12 Thank you for your time. And I'm available to 13 answer any questions you may have. 14 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Moyle. 15 MR. MOYLE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. And 16 FIPUG, likewise, supports the staff recommendation. 17 And we wanted to comment and be on record to 18 commend and applaud FPL for changing their mind 19 with respect to their original filing. 20 In the original filing, they included Woodford expenses, benefits. And questions were raised. 21 22 And I think everyone was more comfortable with 23 Woodford not being in this -- in this filing. This 24 filing represents market conditions. It's good for 25 ratepayers. Natural gas prices have come down.

1 And FIPUG has opposed Woodford and has opposed 2 the guidelines. I don't want to get into that 3 today. It wouldn't be appropriate. But the Woodford case is on appeal at the Supreme Court. 4 5 And I think it's worth noting that without 6 Woodford being in here, ratepayers get back more 7 money rather than less money. So, it's a good 8 thing for ratepayers that Woodford is not in here, 9 which I think there was some -- a lot of different 10 testimony in the case that may have suggested otherwise. 11 12 But anyway, it's a good day for ratepayers. 13 They are going to save money. They are going to 14 save more money because Woodford costs have been 15 backed out. 16 And I guess the other point that we would make 17 for the purposes of trying to keep it clean and 18 segregated, FPL voluntarily said, hey, we'll keep 19 Woodford out of this. We'll keep it separate. 20 We would hope that they would continue to do 21 that while the Woodford decision is considered by 22 the Florida Supreme Court. Briefs are -- are going 23 to be filed in that case. The Supreme Court will consider it. 24 But we think it's a better practice and would 25

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1	ask, like they did here, that Woodford stay
2	separate and apart until the Florida Supreme Court
3	ultimately decides whether Woodford can proceed or
4	not.
5	So, those were the comments that FIPUG wanted
6	to make. Thank you.
7	THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Moyle, you know, I I'm
8	glad you didn't use any automobile references this
9	time. And I thought it was interesting that you
10	only said Woodford 16 times.
11	MR. MOYLE: We said it about 16,000 a few
12	months ago.
13	(Laughter.)
14	THE CHAIRMAN: Commissioners, any questions of
15	the parties or staff?
16	Commissioner Brown.
17	COMMISSIONER BROWN: No, you know, I just want
18	to also kind of reiterate FIPUG's original comment
19	about appreciating the company coming in here
20	today, making that adjustment. The customers get
21	to receive the savings sooner and realize the
22	savings as soon as possible.
23	I know they came in, you know, what, three
24	months into the month of of the year. So, they
25	want their customers to benefit. It's good

1	corporate stewardship. And I support the proposal.
2	THE CHAIRMAN: Was that a motion?
3	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Yes, so moved.
4	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Second.
5	THE CHAIRMAN: It's been moved and seconded,
6	staff recommendations on all issues on Item No. 4.
7	Any further discussion?
8	Seeing none, all in favor say aye.
9	(Chorus of ayes.)
10	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any opposed?
11	(No response.)
12	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: By your action, you have
13	approved the staff recommendations.
14	Gentlemen, thank you very much for coming out.
15	MR. BUTLER: Thank you.
16	(Agenda item concluded.)
