Hello Ms. Denby,

It was a pleasure to speak with you this morning regarding the current application for the Transfer of Majority Organizational Control for Orange Blossom Utilities. A review of the utility's current tariffs reviled that Orange Blossom is missing a non-sufficient funds (NSF) charge. Pursuant to Sections 832.08(5) and 68.065(2), Florida Statutes (F.S.), utilities may assess charges for the collection of worthless checks, drafts, or orders of payment. As currently set forth in Sections 832.08(5) and 68.065(2), F.S., the following NSF charges may be assessed:

- 1. \$25, if the face value does not exceed \$50,
- 2. \$30, if the face value exceeds \$50 but does not exceed \$300,
- 3. \$40, if the face value exceeds \$300,
- 4. or five percent of the face amount of the check, whichever is greater.

If you believe this charge would be appropriate for you utility, please respond to the e-mail requesting the charge be added to your tariff. If you have any questions feel free to e-mail or call me at the contact information below.
