12	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Was that

14	advisor for you in all of the dockets.
15	MR. BECK: And Charlie Beck, General Counsel.
16	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Is that all the appearances?
17	Okay. So the order of the dockets today are
18	going to be the 03 docket, then the 04 docket, then the
19	02 docket, then the 07 docket, and then the 01 docket.

21	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Proceed to Docket No. 7.
22	All right. Staff, preliminary matters.
23	MR. MURPHY: Yes, sir. Staff is hopeful that
24	most issues can be stipulated in this docket and
25	witnesses excused. Staff will continue to work towards

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this end. If an agreement can be reached in the next few days, the Prehearing Order will need to be modified to reflect an agreement. And if an agreement is reached, staff proposes to circulate an amended draft before the order is issued.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Does anybody have any other preliminary matters? Okay. Once again, like before, we'll proceed through the Draft Prehearing Order, once again, section by section. Feel free to stop me if there's anything you want to change or add or whatever.

MR. MURPHY: Yes. Staff has prepared a

of all witnesses for whom areas of expertise were not listed in the prefiled testimony. The companies filed this information on October 14th. Having had an opportunity to review the information, does FIPUG have an objection to the expertise of any witnesses and, if so, whom?

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: FIPUG, do you have any

objections to any witnesses in the 07 docket? 1 MS. PUTNAL: Thank you. Unfortunately this 2 docket is not quite as clear as the 02 docket as of this 3 point, but we will work with staff and parties to refine 4 5 FIPUG's position by close of business tomorrow on that issue. 6 7 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: So you'll have specific witnesses and specific issues? 8 MS. PUTNAL: Yes, if any, as to their 9 10 expertise. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Staff, is that okay 11 12 with you? 13 MR. MURPHY: Yes. Thank you. 14 MS. PUTNAL: Thank you. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Anybody else on Issue V? 15 Let's move to Issue VI, order of witnesses. 16 17 MR. MURPHY: Yes. If agreement can be reached 18 to excuse any witnesses, staff will confirm with each 19 Commissioner that the witness can be excused. If no Commissioner has a question for these witnesses, the 20 21 witnesses may be excused from the hearing and his or her 22 testimony and exhibits entered into the record at the 23 hearing as though read. 24 MR. REHWINKEL: Mr. Chairman? 25 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Yes, sir.

MR. REHWINKEL: Public Counsel's office 1 2 submitted revised positions to the parties and staff 3 earlier today and indicated in our transmittal email that we at this time have no questions for any witness 4 except Gulf Power's Mr. Vick. So to that extent we 5 would be willing to stipulate to the excusal of all 6 7 witnesses but Mr. Vick. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Anybody else in 8 9 Section VI? MR. BUTLER: Mr. Chairman? 10 11 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Yes, sir. 12 MR. BUTLER: Just if I may inquire of FIPUG's 13 counsel whether she is aware of any positions or any 14 dispute with FPL's witnesses for this docket. It's not clear to me whether what she said earlier applies to all 15 of the utilities or specifically with respect to Gulf. 16 17 MS. PUTNAL: Thank you. It would apply to all of the utilities' witnesses. 18 19 MR. BUTLER: Okay. Thank you. 2.0 MS. PUTNAL: Thank you. 21 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Anybody else on Section VI? 22 Section VII. Section VIII. 23 MR. MURPHY: Yes, sir. The Order Establishing 2.4 Procedure requires that a party take a position at this 25 Prehearing Conference unless good cause is shown why the

party can't take a position at this time. If a party fails to take a position, the Prehearing Order will reflect no position for that party on those issues. If a party wishes to change a position, please submit your position in writing no later than close of business tomorrow.

MR. REHWINKEL: Mr. Chairman, the Public Counsel in their revised positions has submitted language that would facilitate a Type 2 stipulation on all issues except a subset of the issue related to Gulf's CCR recovery, and it's so indicated in the email in the revised position. So just for the record, our positions on all utilities except Gulf would facilitate a Type 2 position, and for Gulf -- Type 2 stipulation, and for Gulf a Type 2 stipulation except on the state permit related to the Scholz plant.

MR. MURPHY: And, Mr. Rehwinkel, just to clarify, for all the other issues, there are fallouts through others, but you agree to whatever is there with the exception of the fallout.

MR. REHWINKEL: That's correct. The fallout impact of the Scholz issue would still maintain a contested status but only as to that fallout impact.

MR. MURPHY: Thank you.

MR. FRAZIER: Anybody else? Anything else in

14	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Section XII.
15	MR. MURPHY: I believe there's one pending
16	confidentiality request, and staff is working on it.
17	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any idea when we're going to
18	have that done?
19	MR. BUTLER: Mr. Chairman, if that one is for
20	FPL, we actually had noted that it has been ruled upon.
21	Charlie, is that the for the Audit 15-014-4-1?
22	MR. MURPHY: The only one I'm aware of being
23	outstanding, I believe, is Gulf.
24	MR. BUTLER: Oh, okay. My bad.
25	MR. MURPHY: We'll do it.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. All right. Anything else in Section XII? Section XIII. MR. MURPHY: If the issues are stipulated, a bench decision may be possible. If no agreement is reached, briefs will be due on November 13th. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Once again, opening statements will be five minute. Briefs are limited to 30 pages. Everybody understands that? Are there any other matters to come before us for this docket? MR. MURPHY: Staff is not aware of any. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. We will adjourn the prehearing for Docket 07. (Prehearing Conference adjourned.)
