On October 27, 2015, Florida City Gas (FCG) filed a request for confidential classification for Document No. 06878-15. This document is a petition for approval of variance from Area Extension Program (AEP) tariff to delay true-up and extend amortization period by FCG. The information in the document for which FCG seeks confidential treatment relates to customer specific gas usage and revenue information, from which the quantities could be arithmetically determined and could be used by others to gain unfair competitive advantage in the market. Staff has reviewed the document and concurs with FCG that the nature of the information meets the requirements set forth in Sections 366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes, whereby disclosure of the information would harm the competitive business operations of FCG.

Therefore, staff recommends that the request by FCG for confidential classification of Document No. 06878-15 be approved.
