On March 15, 2016, Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) filed its MFRs in the above referenced docket. Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), FPL requested confidential classification of certain information provided in the MFR Schedules listed in the following table.

FPL claims that the confidential information is intended to be and has been treated by FPL as private, its confidentiality has been maintained, and its disclosure would cause harm to FPL and its customers. FPL claims the confidential information consists of competitive interests of third parties [NextEra Energy], the disclosure of which would cause them harm. Specifically, the confidential information describes the projected capital structures of affiliated and consolidated companies. If publicly disclosed, this information would harm the competitive interests of the provider of the information and would trigger Securities and Exchange Commission reporting obligations. As such, this information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S.

Staff reviewed FPL's request and in staff's opinion, the information subject to the request meets the criteria for confidential classification pursuant to Section 366.093, F.S., and Rule 25-22.006, F.A.C. Therefore, staff recommends that FPL's request for confidential classification be approved.
