Dear Sirs:

I am not a whiner. As a young woman I served as a Peace Core Volunteer in Togo, West Africa, where I lived without electricity or running water. For the next 23 years I taught English in third world countries. I am now 74, living on \$770 in Social Security. As a permanent resident in Florida, my winter electric bill has always been between \$35-50. I live in a tiny apartment where I keep the AC on 79 degrees, and I turn on the water heater only when necessary. I try to cook as seldom as possible.

Last month my electric bill was \$111.00, which made it necessary for me to take money from my paltry savings account. If you succeed in receiving the monthly increase you are demanding, it will be a disastrous economic blow to me. It has been an exceptionally hot summer, and at my age, the heat has negative consequences. If you research my account, you will find that I always pay my bill. When I moved here three years ago, I had a new AC unit installed.

I am asking you to please reconsider your rate increase. I am certain that I am not the only elderly person in Palm Beach County who will suffer serious consequences if you increase your rates.
