MR. BUTLER: Thank you, Commissioner Graham. For the 01 docket I have R. Wade Litchfield, John Butler, and Maria Moncada. We also would be making appearances in Docket 160007, the ECRC. And then for the 02 docket, R. Wade Litchfield, John Butler, and Kenneth Rubin. Thank you.

MR. BADDERS: Good afternoon. Russell Badders on behalf of Gulf Power. I'll be appearing in 01 and 02 and 07 dockets along with Steven R. Griffin and 23 Jeffrey A. Stone.

I'm here today for FPUC in the 01, 02, 03, and 04 dockets; FPU-Fort 8 9 Meade in the 03 docket; and Fort Meade, the Indiantown Division, and Chesapeake in the 04 docket. 10 11 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. MR. MUNSON: Good afternoon, Commissioner. 12 Mv name is Greg Munson also with the Gunster law firm on 13 14 behalf of Florida City Gas in dockets 03 and 04. MR. BREW: Good afternoon, Commissioner. 15 16 James Brew with the firm of Stone, Mattheis, Xenopoulos 17 & Brew appearing in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets for White 18 Springs Agricultural Chemicals/PCS Phosphate. MR. WRIGHT: Good afternoon, Commissioner. 19 Robert Scheffel Wright and John T. LEATHERS: Yes, Commissioner. Staff will note for the record that St. Joe Natural Gas Company has 15 been excused from the prehearing in the 03 docket. Also 16 17 if stipulations can be reached in the next few days, the 18 prehearing order will need to be modified to reflect 19 such agreements. And if such agreements are reached, 20 staff proposes to circulate an amended draft before an 21 order is issued. 22 **COMMISSIONER GRAHAM:** And no other preliminary 23 matters. 24 MS. LEATHERS: No, Commissioner. 25 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Does anybody have any FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

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questions on what staff just said or have any other 2 preliminary matters? Okay. Let's proceed once again through the 3 draft prehearing order. Once again, I'll go through pretty quickly, so get my attention if you find a section that you need to speak about or ask questions about. Section I, Section II, Section III, Section 8 9 IV, Section V, Section VI. Staff. 10 MS. LEATHERS: Yes, Commissioner. Staff is hopeful that all issues with the parties can be 11 stipulated and witnesses excused in this docket, and 12 13 staff will continue to work towards that end. 14 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. Section VII, Section VIII. Staff. 15 MS. LEATHERS: Commissioner, staff notes that 16 17 the Order Establishing Procedure requires that a party 18 take a position at the prehearing conference unless good 19 cause is shown as to why that party cannot take a 20 position at this time. Accordingly, if a party's 21 position in the draft prehearing order is currently "No 22 position at this time," that party must change its 23 position or show good cause why it cannot take a 24 position. And staff will also suggest that the parties 25 who have heretofore not taken a position or wish to

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change their position be allowed to submit their position in writing. We had suggested no later than noon tomorrow; however, in the 02 docket you have ordered close of business by tomorrow, October 12th. If a party fails to take a position by that time, the prehearing order will reflect no position for that party for such issues.

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COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: I think we'll do it consistent with the 02 and go with the end of business tomorrow.

Any questions on Section VIII, concerns with what staff just added? Section XIV, staff.

MS. LEATHERS: Yes, Commissioner. Staff would note that it has prepared a draft Comprehensive Exhibit List, which includes all prefiled exhibits. Staff will circulate this and check with the parties prior to the hearing to determine if there are any objections to the Comprehensive Exhibit List.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. Let's go on to X, staff.

MS. LEATHERS: There are no proposed stipulations at this time, but staff is hopeful that stipulations can be reached on all issues, and staff will continue working towards this end.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. Let's go on

to XI.

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MS. LEATHERS: There are no pending motions. COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: XII.

MS. LEATHERS: There are no pending confidentiality requests.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: And XIII.

MS. LEATHERS: If issues are stipulated and parties agree to waive briefs, the Commission may make a bench decision for this portion of the docket. If there are any issues to be briefed, staff recommends post-hearing briefs be no longer than 20 pages. And if there are briefs, they will be due on November 14th, 2016.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Are all parties in agreement with this? Okay. Sounds good. I'm getting a lot of head nods, so I assume nobody has got any concerns with that.

Let's go on to XIV. Opening statements, once again, as I mentioned before, will be three minutes, and the briefs are going to be limited to 20 pages. Staff.

MS. LEATHERS: And, Commissioner, staff will just note again that St. Joe Natural Gas Company's excusal from the prehearing in this docket will be included in the draft prehearing order.
