Good Afternoon, Mr. Armstrong,

I am in receipt of your public records request, filed in Docket No. 160060-EC and assigned DN 09148-16 (copy attached). This records request will be responded to within 10 working days (12/20/16), if not sooner. Should a subsequent public records request be received today, it will be added as an additional item(s) to the initial PRR being acknowledged. I will contact you as soon as I have information regarding this request. You are seeking:

- Could the Commission please provide the City of Cape Coral with records or information as to the next ten largest cities in Florida which are served by a rural electric cooperative?
- Could the Commission please provide records of any Commission investigation into the reasonableness of a rural electric cooperative, designed to serve unincorporated rural areas and cities with less than 2,500 population, actually serving a city with a population in the hundreds of thousands (as Cape Coral soon will be)?
- If a rural electric cooperative is to be permitted to serve a city with a population that far exceeds Florida's statutory limit for rural cooperatives, has the Commission ever established rules or criteria so that a rural electric cooperative cannot use such a city and its residents to unreasonably subsidize the cooperative's customers residing in less densely populated areas served by the rural electric cooperative and, if so, could the Commission please provide related documents?

Please note that requestors are invoiced for duplication services. Payment must be received before copies can be released. If the nature or volume of public records requested to be inspected or copied is such as to require extensive use of information technology resources or extensive clerical or supervisory assistance by personnel, or both, in addition to the actual cost of duplication, a "special service charge," will be added to the charge for copies based on the cost incurred for such extensive use of information technology resources or the labor cost of the personnel providing the service, that is actually incurred for the clerical and supervisory assistance, or both. Also note that an agency may refuse to produce additional records if the fees for a previous request for records have not been paid by the requestor.
