Dear Ms. Lechner:

The Governor's office forwarded your comments regarding Gulf Power Company to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has authority in the telephone industry which is limited to the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service.

Your comments will be added to Gulf Power Company's rate case docket file (No. 160186-EI) to give Commissioners and staff an opportunity to review your concerns.

Gulf's technical hearing before the FPSC will be in March in Tallahassee. Witnesses from the utility, the Commission staff, the Office of Public Counsel (representing Gulf customers), and other intervenors in the case will present testimony, introduce exhibits, and be cross-examined before the Commissioners. Commissioners will review Gulf's need for a rate increase, its existing and proposed rate structure, and its ability to provide safe and reliable service.

Commissioners are charged with making sure that Florida's utility companies fulfill their service obligation. In its petition, Gulf based its request on several factors, including transmission projects and replacing and repairing infrastructure. The FPSC will ensure that final customer rates reflect only those costs that are prudent and necessary for Gulf to deliver quality electric service.
