Dear Commissioners,

Please reject FPL's request in Docket No. 20170009. It is not fair for the company to continue to heap the financial risk onto customers like me to pursue new reactors at Turkey Point, a project for which there is no builder. I understand the builder, Westinghouse, filed for bankruptcy and is out of the nuclear construction business. And apparently FPL will not commit to actually build the reactors, nor will it commit to a price tag. Further, the company can't even show that the reactors are in the best economic interest of their customers.

If the reactor project is so speculative that FPL cannot provide you with evidence that the project remains a good deal for customers, how can FPL then ask your permission to incur even more costs pursuing the licenses for the project, which ultimately allows it to recover its costs plus interest from customers?

My electric bills are at an all time high- reaching upwards of \$200 a month this summer, a big jump from the \$70 I was paying in February. I have done my due diligence in buying an up-to-date central ac system which I service twice a year and leave at 80°, caulked around windows and cracks, use heat reducing tint on my windows, and planted shade trees. Now it's time for FPL to do their due diligence and stop raising prices for energy, which isn't a luxury, it's a necessity and a right to American citizens.

I have already paid too much for too long toward this phantom project, as have all the other FPL customers. Enough is enough. Thank you in advance for considering customers' economic interest in this proceeding. Please reject FPL's heavy-handed and unprecedented request.
