Dear Honorable Commission:

As a concerned citizen and physician in the South Florida area is truly incumbent upon the true thought leaders of our community to make the right choices when it comes to how we live in balance with nature. We are all mindful now that there is a convergence in our modern way of life with the nexus of technology, environment and human population exceeding certain limitations causing problems within the substructure of our macro and micro environment.

Leading scientists now are aware that our DNA is being degraded by rampant human activity. For example, cancer rates have risen over 10,000% in the last forty years regarding 80,000 new chemicals being introduced into our environment and the release of highly toxic isotopes including tritium and other related byproducts of the nuclear energy industry.

As we witness the degradation of our environment and our health in front of our eyes, there is no question that measures need to be taken to prevent any further destruction, as our children's health and wellness rely on it. Now more than ever, it is important that all citizens are proactive at this time and we need to find alternative ways to gather energy. Ms. Regaldo had been involved with our plight from the very beginning during the September – October Zika Crisis and was helpful to us as to step in as our attorney during this meeting. Ms. Regalado along with Hon. Commissioner Kristen Rosen Gonzalez were very active with the Zika crisis and the community protests regarding the use of Naled in Miami-Dade County.

Unfortunately, the judge endorsed meeting never got off the ground. The deputy mayor refused to greet us and willfully did not attend the meeting. We were left to sit in the mayor's conference room for over 30 minutes without any sort of official interaction. We had no choice but to leave and on our way out we saw that the lawyers along with the deputy mayor were huddled in their office cubicle and did not even address us in person.

Today we can tell you Ms. Raquel Regalado is still helpful in shepherding our cause along with our official attorney of record, Ms. Ivette Gonzalez Petkovich, Esq. Ms. Petkovich has reached out multiple times to the mayor's office of Miami-Dade County County to find common ground, so that we may discuss our real health concerns in respectful and civil manner and relay our information back to our respective communities. So far, we have had no luck in reestablishing a meeting.

In summary is very important that all aspects of our life be taken seriously and if the citizens of the community have serious grievances with the way things are being done at a corporate level there has to be mandates in place to provide for the basic health and wellness of the community be preserved. I would greatly appreciate any influence that this letter may make on providing an opportunity for us to discuss the serious health concerns.
