RE: Docket No. 20170238-TX - Application for certificate to provide local telecommunications service by City Communications Inc.

On November 11, 2017, City Communications Inc. filed an application to provide telecommunications service in Florida. Upon review, staff discovered that City Communications Inc. neglected to provide managerial, technical and financial capability information as required by the local telecommunications service application. Staff spoke with the company's owner, Patrick Hardy, several times regarding City Communications Inc.'s incomplete application. Mr. Hardy stated he would submit the required information to complete the application, however it was not received.

On December 19, 2017, a certified letter was sent to the company requesting that the additional information needed to complete the local telecommunications service application be submitted by January 4, 2018. The letter also included that if the Commission did not receive the required information by January 4, 2018, staff would consider City Communications Inc.'s application incomplete and deny application. The certified letter was accepted and signed; however, to date no response was received.

As required in Section 2.07.C.5.f., Administrative Procedures Manual, a certified letter was sent to the company requesting missing application information within 15 days. As of the date of this Memorandum no response has been received from the applicant. Therefore, staff recommends that the local telecommunications service application be denied and the docket be closed upon issuance of an administrative order.
