1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Item No. 16.
3	MS. FRIEDRICH: Good afternoon, Marissa
4	Friedrich speaking on behalf of Commission staff.
5	Item No. 16 addresses the request of Beaches
6	Sewer System to implement a standby charge for
7	customers significantly impacted by Hurricane
8	Michael in Gulf County. Staff's recommended
9	standby charge of \$11.79 would be billed monthly
10	instead of the utility's approved flat rate for
11	wastewater service of \$43.03, to customers whose
12	homes sustained substantial storm damage and are
13	not able to receive wastewater service.
14	Staff considered the importance of the
15	utility's ability to maintain a stable revenue
16	stream, as well as the impact Hurricane Michael has
17	had on the customers when composing this
18	recommendation.
19	There has been one customer inquiry regarding
20	the matter with the Division of Consumer Affairs.
21	Representatives from the utility, Gene Adams and
22	utility president, Frank Seifert, are here. And I
23	believe OPC is present to speak on the item as
24	well.
25	Staff is available for any questions you may

1	have.
2	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, staff.
3	Let's hear from the utility.
4	MR. ADAMS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. As staff
5	has indicated, I'm Gene Adams with the Pennington
6	law firm here in Tallahassee, and I'm representing
7	the Beaches Sewer System.
8	I'd I'd like to say thank you to the
9	Commission and to the staff for putting this item
10	forward as quickly as possible. As you know,
11	there's been a lot of devastation there. And
12	there's really no good no good answers here.
13	We're seeking to try and preserve the utility
14	for those customers who have been radically damaged
15	and altered in their lives. We the system has
16	lost 76 customers. Their homes were have been
17	damaged beyond habitable repair. And many of the
18	other remaining customers of the 330 in the system
19	have suffered some damage as well.
20	You know, Mr Mr. Seifert had all good
21	intentions. He's a little bit ahead of the curve
22	when he offered a tariff that had not been approved
23	by the Commission, but his attempt was to try to
24	give the standby system charge as an opportunity
25	that he could retain some revenue, stay in

business, while, you know, again, having that
service available when people were able to rebuild
their homes or repair their homes to a condition
that they could utilize it.

Again, I want to thank the staff. We were able to sit down with the staff last week and work with them to discuss all of the concerns. We -- we believe the staff recommendation now -- we -- we would agree with the staff recommendation.

We will implement the tariff on a temporary basis. And we hope, after re-noticing, we may be able to come back to you sooner than next January with a report on the number of people that have been able to utilize that tariff, who have been able to come back on the system or -- or just whatever the status may be.

In the meantime, we've also been happy to work with staff. And we -- we most likely will have to come back with some type of additional rate increase during the current staff recommendation -- or staff-assisted rate case, I'm sorry -- is still opened, and as you all approved a little bit of a slight delay earlier on today's agenda.

So, we may be able to work with them and -- and look at a staff pro- -- rate proceeding through

1	that as well, that mechanism. So, we appreciate
2	all those opportunities.
3	And Mr. Seifert is here, if you have any
4	questions. And we'd be glad to answer any
5	questions.
6	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you.
7	Ms. Ponder?
8	MS. PONDER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
9	Virginia Ponder with the Office of Public Counsel.
10	And we are here to support the staff recommendation
11	and in agreement with that.
12	Thank you.
13	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you.
14	Commissioner Clark.
15	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
16	I just wanted to make a general comment.
17	Thank you to Beaches for taking this action so
18	quickly. I appreciate you especially your
19	reach-out to consumers. I know this is a difficult
20	time for folks in this specific area.
21	But I I also wanted to thank you for
22	acknowledging some of the other aspects of the
23	customers do have the right that can't even
24	afford to pay the continuation service, do have the
25	continued right to disconnect their service and

1	reconnect at a point in time, as long as they were
2	an existing customer, for nothing other than a
3	normal connect charge; is that correct?
4	MR. SEIFERT: Correct.
5	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Great. I I just
6	wanted to make sure that was on the record. And
7	thank you for doing that. I know specifically some
8	of the customers that were affected in this area,
9	and that was extremely important to the customers.
10	I appreciate that.
11	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioner Brown.
12	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
13	And Mr. Seifert, thank you for bringing this
14	forth. I echo Commissioner Clark's sentiment.
15	How is how is the system? How are you
16	doing? How are your customers doing?
17	MR. SEIFERT: Well, I mean, it's total
18	destruction. You know, you drive down the road and
19	you see houses gone. You know, every day, it gets
20	a little bit better, but you know, I see it every
21	day when I pull out of my driveway and see all my
22	trees down on the ground, see my roof needing to be
23	replaced, and then I see that you know, we've
24	lost a lot at our plant that was destroyed.
25	Besides the customers, you know, our revenue

1	is going to be down 25 percent. So, we're hurting,
2	but as not as bad as people that lost everything.
3	COMMISSIONER BROWN: You
4	MR. SEIFERT: We don't have a gas station open
5	in our county well, I'll back that up, in in
6	the southern part of our county, in our town. So,
7	it it's been tough.
8	COMMISSIONER BROWN: I'm very sorry to hear
9	that. And I think this is a unique way to keep the
10	viability of the utility ongoing. So, commend you
11	for creating this standby service charge. I hope
12	your customers take advantage of it.
13	MR. SEIFERT: Well, I I'll have to say
14	this, the hurricane hit. That night, I was out
15	checking
16	COMMISSIONER BROWN: I'm sorry.
17	MR. SEIFERT: We were up, running the next
18	day. Our customers are never lost service. We
19	didn't have electricity. We had generators. Cost
20	us a lot of money for gasoline, but we did it; a
21	lot of time, but we did it.
22	And a lot of the roads you couldn't travel
23	down because there were houses on them, boats on
24	them. I mean, it's just hard to believe what a
25	this hurricane did.

1	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Well, God bless you.
2	And with that, I would move approval of the
3	staff recommendation, Mr. Chairman.
4	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: It's been moved and second,
5	approval of the staff recommendation. Any further
6	discussion?
7	Seeing none, all in favor, say aye.
8	(Chorus of ayes.)
9	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any opposed?
10	By your action, you have approved the staff
11	rec on Item No. 16.
12	Thank you, guys. Travel safe.
