As follow up to our telephone conversation on March 13, 2019, I would like to clarify, in writing a few of the points of our discussion as it pertained to the Consent Agreement; past Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) compliance inspections and the wastewater facility's operating permit, FLA011188-003.

The Consent Agreement had some very specific items required for repair or replacement listed in Section 4 a), items i, ii, and iii. Item 4 a) i noted "holes in integral components of the wastewater treatment facility" as a line item to be addressed immediately and ongoing until a more permanent solution to the continued corrosion at the plant could be completed. The holes noted during past inspections and encompassed in the specifics of the Consent Agreement were to be repaired as a short term and ongoing "fix" at the metal plants with the presumption that more extensive work would be completed to address the overall issue of corrosion of the two metal plants. This presumption is made based on conversations with the staff of FDEP and a goal of being proactive toward addressing the core issue of the age of the plants and the corrosive nature of the operating environment near the ocean. Additionally, during the permit renewal process, a Request for Additional Information was issued with the following item:

The proposal in Chapter 7 of the OMPR for corrective actions is noted. The leaking of the Return Activated Studge line is a deficiency, which has been existent for several years. Past repairs have not been effective. The corrosion issue is in a similar situation. Proposed on going repairs are inadequate. Specific actions with deadlines are required. A metal wastewater treatment plant has a definite lifespan and ultimately requires replacement. Provide an action plan with a completion schedule to resolve the corrosion and maintenance issues and an assessment of replacement dates for each metal plant are requested. Proposed completion dates of those items with a stated period are requested.

The intent of the request item was to provide a plan to address the corrosion at the plant

and extend the lives of the two metal wastewater treatment plants or replace the plants. The response included a reference to the upcoming Consent Agreement language and the specifics and general requirements of that document.

Despite the language of the Request for Additional Information, the agency, FDEP, does not mandate the engineering approach to be taken by the Permittee due to the concern of liabilities should the FDEP proposed actions not be effective or in fact cause further violations or plant failure. Language such as Items 5 a) i and ii is incorporated into the legal and binding document, OGC Case #18-0258, to allow professional operational and engineering reviews of the wastewater facility and the overall components to determine an economical and effective approach to correct the compliance problems at the plant. With the Request for Additional Information, FDEP inherently expressed a concern that the metal plants might not be capable of operating over the five-year duration of the permit unless there was significant metal work on the current plants or potentially future replacement of those plants. Since the majority of the corrosion was above the water line, a phenomenon common to wastewater treatment plants operating in corrosive environments, a proposal to pull down the levels of the plants and replace metal versus scrapping the plants and replacing with different facilities of similar capacities. Not only would the cost be significantly less, but the plants could be brought back up to operational levels much more quickly, resulting in less downtime.

In summary, note that the Consent Agreement contains very specific line items for completion to maintain compliance with the permit and the agreement. In addition, the document, in combination with the Specific and General Conditions of the permit, requires further less specific actions to extend the life of the plants; remain in operational compliance as well as requirements of maintenance for the permit duration; evaluate the status of the current plants and proactively develop and implement a plan to meet limits of the permit and sufficiently comply with the Consent Agreement. The responsibility to ultimately develop and execute plans to meet the requirements of both the permit and the Agreement falls on the holder of the permit and the signature authority for the Consent Agreement.

At the request of Mr. Robert Hillman, President of North Peninsula Utilities Corporation (NPUC), I have reviewed the cost proposal presented to the Commission concerning a potential rate increase for the subject facility. The cover letter from Willdan Financial Services and the associated cost proposals from various vendors are attached for convenience.

Mr. Hillman requested a review and comment on the submitted proposal in lieu of obtaining several additional cost estimates due to the difficulties in smaller communities of locating expertise for such projects. The vendors approached have first-hand knowledge of the property and the wastewater treatment plant. My personal experience is with environmental projects, particularly small domestic wastewater and potable water facilities. Additionally, I have worked on other projects involving Wetherell's Treatment Systems and American In-Line Inspection, Inc.

Over half of the proposed cost relates to improvements directly related to the wastewater treatment plant and prolonging the life of the facility. Wetherell's Treatment Systems constructed the wastewater plant in approximately 1980 and has been involved with the operation and maintenance over the years. Two of the combined three plants treating the wastewater are metal plants and due to the proximity to the ocean and the corrosive nature of the environment, have experienced deterioration in many of the components of the facility. During my previous involvement with smaller scope projects in which Wetherell's Treatment Systems bid for work concerning wastewater plants, the bid(s) were competitive in nature. The company is locally owned and operated. Upon review of the line items of the proposal, there is agreement between the proposed work and the requested improvements or component replacement based on the Consent Agreement with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection or past plant inspections by the agency. In order to continue safe and effective, prolonged use of the facility, these items must be completed in a timely manner.

The second largest line item involves work to be performed by American In-Line Inspections, Inc. The company is located in Edgewater, Florida which is less than an hour from the wastewater treatment plant and subsequent collection system piping and infrastructure. Since mobilization is one expense to be considered, selecting a company that is local to the project is important. In addition, the company has already visited the site and provided some guidance concerning the collection system and manhole work. Utilizing a company familiar with the property would allow NPUC to more quickly address any issues versus starting the process with a "new" company. It should also be noted that the cost proposal is for cleaning and videography of the mainline of the collection system piping. The videography may indicate that additional work is needed but serves as a proper step in addressing any storm water intrusion or groundwater infiltration into the wastewater plant.

The remaining companies are also local and have worked with Mr. Hillman at the plant over the almost 30 years of operation of the existing wastewater treatment facility. Although electrical, building and fencing work are not in my area of expertise, using contractors familiar with the plant layout and specific equipment such as the automated callout systems, blowers and submersible pumps at this location would be beneficial.

The financial services group denoted a Miscellaneous Cost of ten (10) percent to the cost estimates. Normally, at least a 10% Contingency cost to engineering or maintenance work for wastewater treatment facilities is common. Since it is often not possible to definitively know all work that might be needed below the operating level of the wastewater, a contingency cost of at least 10% is not uncommon. The level of the wastewater in the treatment basins such as the Aeration Tanks or Secondary Clarifiers provide for gravity flow from basin to basin, so the water levels are near the top of the tank(s). The water is chocolate brown in color in these treatment basins and any issues below surface levels may be encountered once the individual treatment tanks are removed from service for renovation. Having funds available to address additional repairs that are not immediately apparent is critical to completing all necessary work at the plant.






