FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S THIRD REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION <u>OF AUDIT CONTROL NO. 14-007-4-2 WORK PAPERS</u>

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") requests continued confidential classification of Audit Control No. 14-007-4-2 Work Papers (the "Audit Work Papers"). In support of its request, FPL states as follows:

1. On January 8, 2016, in Docket No. 160009-EI, FPL filed its First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification of the Audit Work Papers (Confidential Document No. 02951-14 (cross reference no. 02544-14)). FPL's request was granted by Order No. PSC-16-0224-CFO-EI, issued June 6, 2016.

2. On December 6, 2017 FPL filed it Second Request for Confidential Classification which included Second Revised Exhibits C and D ("December 6, 2017 Request"). By Order No. PSC-2018-0307-CFO-EI dated June 8, 2018 ("Order 0307") the Commission granted FPL's December 6, 2017 Request. FPL adopts and incorporates by reference the December 6, 2017 Request and Order 0307.

3. The period of confidential treatment by Order 0307 will soon expire. The Confidential Information that was subject of FPL's December 6, 2017 Request and Order 0307 warrants continued treatment as proprietary and confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3).

4. Accordingly, FPL hereby submits its Third Request for Extension of Confidential Classification. Exhibits A and B from FPL's June 12, 2014 filing are incorporated herein by

reference. Revised Exhibit C filed on January 8, 2016 is incorporated herein by reference. Included herewith is Third Revised Exhibits and Third Revised Exhibit D.

5. FPL's Third Revised Exhibit C is a table containing the specific line, column and page references to the confidential information, and references to the specific statutory basis or bases for the claim of confidentiality and to the declaration in support of the continued confidential classification. FPL indicates with bold font in Third Revised Exhibit C revisions made to reduce the amount of information classified as confidential. Third Revised Exhibit D includes the declaration of Lisa Fuca and Antonio Maceo in support of FPL's request.

6. The information that was granted confidential treatment by Order No. 0307 continues to be confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes. This information is intended to be and is treated by FPL as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to customers or FPL's business operations, and its confidentiality has been maintained. Pursuant to Section 366.093, such information is entitled to confidential treatment and it is exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

7. As the declaration included in Third Revised Exhibit D indicates, the information included in Exhibit A continues to be proprietary, confidential business information. Certain information contained in the Audit Work Papers is information related to reports of FPL's internal auditors. This information is protected from public disclosure by Section 366.093(3)(b), Florida Statutes. The Audit Work Papers also contain information related to bids or contractual data, such as pricing or other terms, the public disclosure of which would violate nondisclosure provisions of

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FPL's contracts with certain vendors and impair FPL's ability to contract for goods or services on favorable terms in the future. Such information is protected from public disclosure by Section 366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes. The Audit Work Papers also contain competitively sensitive information which, if disclosed, could impair the competitive interests of the provider of the information. Such information is protected from public disclosure by Section 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes. A few documents include competitively sensitive information related to certain employees' compensation. Public disclosure of compensation information would enable competing employers to meet or beat the compensation currently offered, resulting in the loss of talented employees, or conversely, the need to increase the level of compensation already paid in order to retain these employees and attract new talent. The quality of service and the cost of service implications would be detrimental to FPL and its customers. Such information is also protected by Section 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes.

8. Nothing has changed since the issuance of Order No. 0307 to render the confidential information stale or public, such that continued confidential treatment would not be appropriate. Moreover, this information will remain confidential for a period longer than the 18 months typically provided for confidential treatment, and it is anticipated that Staff will retain these documents for more than 18 months.

9. Upon a finding by the Commission that the information referenced in FPL's Third Revised Exhibit C continues to be proprietary confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for a period of at least an additional eighteen (18) months and should be returned to FPL as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. *See* § 366.093(4), Fla. Stat.

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WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as supported by the materials and declarations included herewith, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its Third Request for Extension of Confidential Classification be granted.
