PETITION FOR EXPEDITED REVIEW OF NXX-X CODE DENIAL

BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Florida (“AT&T Florida”), pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 52.15(g)(iv), Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”) Order FCC 00-104, and Florida Public Service Commission (“Commission”) Order No. PSC-01-1973-PCO-TL, petitions the Commission to review the Pooling Administrator’s (“Somos”) denial of AT&T Florida’s requests for additional numbering resources in the Orlando rate center. In support of this petition, AT&T Florida states:

PARTIES

1. AT&T Florida is a corporation organized and formed under the laws of the State of Georgia and an incumbent local exchange company (“ILEC”) regulated by the Commission and authorized to provide local exchange telecommunications and intraLATA toll telecommunications in the State of Florida.

2. Somos is an independent non-governmental entity, which is responsible for administering and managing the numbering resources in pooling areas. See 47 C.F.R. § 52.20(d).

JURISDICTION

3. The Commission has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to Section 364.16(7), Florida Statutes, Order FCC 00-104, and Industry Numbering Committee’s (INC) Number Pooling Guidelines, Sections 3.7 and 12(c). The INC provisions provide

that a carrier may seek review of Somos's decision to deny numbering resources before the appropriate state regulatory authority.

BACKGROUND AND REQUEST FOR RELIEF

4. The Orlando exchange consists of six (6) central offices and six (6) switching entities that utilize numbering resources: Azalea Park (ORLDFLAPDS0), Colonial (ORLDFLCLDS0), Magnolia (ORLDFLMADS1), Pinecastle (ORLDFLPCDS0), Pinehills (ORLDFLPHDS0), and Sandlake (ORLDFLSADS0).

5. On January 30, 2020, AT&T Florida requested additional numbering resources from Somas for the Magnolia (ORLDFLMADS1) switch. See Attachment 1. Specifically, AT&T Florida requested two 1,000 blocks of numbers to meet the request of a specific customer. Due to the customer's dialing patterns, the customer has requested a block of numbers in the format of 407-NX4-2000-3999.

6. At the time of the code request, the Orlando rate center had a month-to-exhaust ("MTE") of 200.88 months and a utilization of 30.23%. As required by Order No. PSC-01-1973-PCO-TL, the MTE and utilization rate for the Orlando exchange. See Attachment 2. The customers contact information is attached. See Attachment 3.

7. On May 29, 2020, Somas's automated number request system denied AT&T Florida's request for additional numbering resources because AT&T Florida had not met the MTE or utilization-based criteria, notwithstanding the fact that AT&T Florida is unable to provide the numbering resources requested by the specific customer. See Attachment 1.

8. The FCC's Order 00-104 and the INC guidelines provide that state regulatory authorities have the authority to review Somas's decision to deny a request for numbering resources. See INC Number Pooling Guidelines Sections 3.7 and 12(c).

9. Under earlier MTE procedures used by the North American Numbering Plan Administration ("NANPA"), waivers or exceptions were granted when customer hardships could be demonstrated or when the service provider's inventory did not have a block of sequential numbers large enough to meet the customer's specific request. Under existing procedures, Somas (and NANPA) looks only at the MTE and utilization rate for the entire rate center and does not consider the needs of a specific customer. The current process is arbitrary and results in (1) decisions contrary to the public interest and welfare of consumers in the State of Florida; and (2) decisions that do not necessarily promote the efficient use of telephone numbers.

10. AT&T Florida requests that the Commission's reverse Somas's decision to withhold numbering resources from AT&T Florida on the following grounds:

(a) Somas's denial of numbering resources to AT&T Florida interferes with AT&T Florida's ability to serve its customers within the State of Florida.

(b) The MTE at the rate center level requirement is discriminatory against the incumbent LEC because it deploys multiple switches in a rate center in order to meet customer demand for telephone service. The FCC rules for obtaining numbering resources both penalizes and discriminates against the ILECs for deploying multiple switches.

(c) As a result of Somas's denial of AT&T Florida's request for additional numbering resources, AT&T Florida will be unable to provide telecommunications services to its customers as required under Florida law.

WHEREFORE, AT&T Florida requests:

1. The Commission review the decision of Somas to deny AT&T Florida's request for additional numbering resources for the Orlando rate center; and
2. The Commission direct Somas to provide the requested numbering resources for the Orlando exchange as discussed above.
